HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION H

March 20, 2007, Introduced by Reps. Hoogendyk, Meltzer, Sheen and Caswell and referred to the Committee on Oversight and Investigations.

A joint resolution proposing an amendment to the state constitution of 1963, by amending sections 12 and 13 of article IV and by adding section 55 to article IV and section 43 to article IX, to limit the legislative session, to reduce salaries and expense allowances of members of the legislature, to reduce compensation of state legislators who have absences from legislative session, to prohibit state-paid retirement and health care for legislators, and to limit spending on the legislative budget.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the state of Michigan, That the following amendment to the state constitution of 1963, to limit the legislative session, to reduce salaries and expense allowances of members of the legislature, to

reduce compensation of state legislators who have absences from legislative session, to prohibit state-paid retirement and health care for legislators, and to limit spending on the legislative budget, is proposed, agreed to, and submitted to the people of the state:

1 ARTICLE IV

2 Sec. 12. The state officers compensation commission is created which subject to this section shall determine the salaries and 3 expense allowances of the members of the legislature, the governor, 4 5 the lieutenant governor, the attorney general, the secretary of state, and the justices of the supreme court. The commission shall 6 7 consist of 7 members appointed by the governor whose qualifications may be determined by law. Subject to the legislature's ability to 8 9 amend the commission's determinations as provided in this section, 10 the commission shall determine the salaries and expense allowances 11 of the members of the legislature, the governor, the lieutenant 12 governor, the attorney general, the secretary of state, and the 13 justices of the supreme court which determinations shall be the 14 salaries and expense allowances only if the legislature by 15 concurrent resolution adopted by a majority of the members elected to and serving in each house of the legislature approve them. The 16 senate and house of representatives shall alternate on which house 17 18 of the legislature shall originate the concurrent resolution, with 19 the senate originating the first concurrent resolution. 20 The concurrent resolution may amend the salary and expense 21 determinations of the state officers compensation commission to 22 reduce the salary and expense determinations by the same proportion

- 1 for members of the legislature, the governor, the lieutenant
- 2 governor, the attorney general, the secretary of state, and the
- 3 justices of the supreme court. The legislature shall not amend the
- 4 salary and expense determinations to reduce them to below the
- 5 salary and expense level that members of the legislature, the
- 6 governor, the lieutenant governor, the attorney general, the
- 7 secretary of state, and the justices of the supreme court receive
- 8 on the date the salary and expense determinations are made. If the
- 9 salary and expense determinations are approved or amended as
- 10 provided in this section, the salary and expense determinations
- 11 shall become effective for the legislative session immediately
- 12 following the next general election. The commission shall meet each
- 13 2 years for no more than 15 session days. EXPENSE ALLOWANCES FOR
- 14 MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATURE SHALL ONLY BE PAID FOR REASONABLE AND
- 15 ACTUAL EXPENSES FOR TRANSPORTATION, LODGING, AND MEALS DURING THE
- 16 PERIODS THAT THE LEGISLATURE IS IN SESSION. AN INDIVIDUAL WHO FIRST
- 17 BECAME A MEMBER OF THE LEGISLATURE AFTER 2008 SHALL NOT RECEIVE ANY
- 18 STATE-PAID RETIREMENT OR INSURANCE BENEFITS BASED ON HIS OR HER
- 19 LEGISLATIVE SERVICE. The legislature shall implement this section
- 20 by law.
- 21 Sec. 13. EXCEPT WHEN THE LEGISLATURE IS CALLED TO CONVENE ON
- 22 EXTRAORDINARY OCCASIONS, THE LEGISLATURE SHALL ONLY MEET AS
- 23 PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION. The legislature shall meet at the seat of
- 24 government on the second Wednesday in January of each year at
- 25 twelve o'clock noon. Each regular session shall adjourn without
- 26 day, on a day determined by concurrent resolution, at twelve
- 27 o'clock noon. Any business, bill or joint resolution pending at the

- 1 final adjournment of a regular session held in an odd numbered year
- 2 shall carry over with the same status to the next regular session.
- 3 IN 2009 AND EVERY YEAR AFTER 2009, THE LEGISLATURE SHALL MEET FOR
- 4 NOT MORE THAN 90 CONSECUTIVE DAYS.
- 5 SEC. 55. THE SALARY OF A LEGISLATOR WHO DOES NOT ATTEND
- 6 SESSION ON ANY DAY THE LEGISLATIVE BODY IS IN SESSION SHALL BE
- 7 REDUCED ON A PRO RATA BASIS. THE SALARY OF A LEGISLATOR SHALL NOT
- 8 EXCEED 25% OF THE PER CAPITA SALARY OF A PRIVATE SECTOR FULL-TIME
- 9 MICHIGAN WORKER AS CALCULATED BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT. IF A
- 10 SPECIAL SESSION OF THE LEGISLATURE IS CALLED, LEGISLATORS MAY BE
- 11 PAID AN ADDITIONAL PER DIEM BASED ON THEIR BASE SALARY.
- 12 ARTICLE IX
- 13 SEC. 43. BEGINNING WITH THE 2009-2010 STATE FISCAL YEAR, THE
- 14 LEGISLATURE SHALL NOT APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE LEGISLATIVE BUDGET
- 15 IN ANY YEAR THAT WOULD RESULT IN THAT BUDGET EXCEEDING 1% OF THE
- 16 GENERAL FUND/GENERAL PURPOSE BUDGET.
- 17 Resolved further, That the foregoing amendment shall be
- 18 submitted to the people of the state at the next general election
- 19 in the manner provided by law.
