#### **Statements**

Senator Scott asked and was granted unanimous consent to make a statement and moved that the statement be printed in the Journal.

Senator Scott's statement is as follows:

As I always say to you, I won't make these statements if you will take up my bills and get them passed so that people in urban areas, and especially Detroit, would not be paying the kind of rates they are. They're subsidizing the whole state.

As I indicated to you yesterday, in this country, the average rate is about \$870 a year, where in the city of Detroit it's over \$5,100. Just think, that's the average. There are people who are paying more. So it's time for us to take up these bills so that we can make a difference in the lives of everyone.

You would not want this to happen in your city because if it did, we would have done something about it a long time ago. But you have rather chosen to have Detroit subsidize the rest of the state, and everyone is not able to pay those kinds of rates. So that's why people are going without insurance. The law says we must have insurance, so make it affordable.
