As of January 19, 2010, FY 2009-10 supplemental appropriation requests from the State Budget Office (SBO) totaling \$4.9 million, funded from funds received under the federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA), are pending before the Legislature. Appropriations for those items are included in the Senate-passed version of House Bill 5404.

Consistent with previous supplemental bills containing ARRA funds, boilerplate language is included that (1) states that ARRA funds are temporary in nature, (2) appropriates any additional funds awarded to Michigan through recalculation of formulas, (3) provides for the carry-forward of unexpended funds into subsequent fiscal years, and (4) requires subrecipients of funds to comply with all applicable federal requirements.
