REPEAL MICHIGAN HEALTH INITIATIVE INFORMATION CLEARINGHOUSE AND MEDIA CAMPAIGN

House Bill 5591 as Reported from Committee without amendment

BRIEF SUMMARY OF THE BILL:

The bill amends Part 59 of the Public Health Code under which the Michigan Health Initiative (MHI) Program and Fund was established in 1988. House Bill 5591 amends the act to eliminate certain uses of the Fund, and repeal related sections. Revenue to the Fund is from the sales tax on computer software.

House Bill 5591 eliminates the requirements that the MHI Fund be used to:

- maintain a clearinghouse of information accessible to the public on preventable diseases, especially AIDS and the Hepatitis C virus (HCV), including information on major risk factors, treatment programs, and risk reduction service providers available. (Sec. 5913)
- conduct a media campaign and produce public service announcements regarding disease prevention and risk reduction, including Hepatitis C and AIDS. (Sec. 5915).

Language that remains in the law requires that the Fund be used for education modules, information packages, free HIV testing, free HCV testing if funds are available, employee wellness programs (not funded since FY 2001-02), educational programs and information for health care workers and others, and local AIDS care networks.

FISCAL IMPACT:

FY 2009-10 The bill removes the statutory obligation to appropriate MHI funds that were eliminated in the FY 2009-10 DCH budget of \$1,351,000 for the AIDS and Risk Reduction Clearinghouse and Media Campaign. The MHI funds were moved to the sexually transmitted disease control program, replacing GF/GP.

Last May, Executive Order 2009-22 reduced the AIDS and Risk Reduction Clearinghouse and Media Campaign appropriation for FY 2008-09 by 40% and eliminated the programs effective July 1, 2009.

The clearinghouse and media campaign programs have been funded since 1988 under the Michigan Health Initiative.

<u>Fund</u> \$9-12 million is annually deposited to the MHI Fund per Sec. 25 of the General Sales Tax Act. The FY 2009-10 DCH budget includes \$9.1 million of MHI appropriations.
