HOUSE BILL No. 4342

February 18, 2009, Introduced by Rep. Green and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled

"Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending sections 675 and 803d (MCL 257.675 and 257.803d), section 675 as amended by 2004 PA 151 and section 803d as amended by 1998 PA 68.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 675. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section and
- 2 this chapter, a vehicle stopped or parked upon a highway or street
- 3 shall be stopped or parked with the wheels of the vehicle parallel
- 4 to the roadway and within 12 inches of any curb existing at the
- 5 right of the vehicle.
- 6 (2) A local authority may by ordinance permit parking of a
 - vehicle on a 1-way roadway with the vehicle's left wheels adjacent

- ${f 1}$ to and within 12 inches of any curb existing at the left of the
- 2 vehicle.
- 3 (3) A local authority may by ordinance permit angle parking on
- 4 a roadway, except that angle parking shall not be permitted on a
- 5 state trunk line highway.
- 6 (4) The state transportation commission with respect to state
- 7 trunk line highways and the board of county road commissioners with
- 8 respect to county roads, acting jointly with the director of the
- 9 department of state police, may place signs prohibiting or
- 10 restricting the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles on a
- 11 highway where in the opinion of the officials as determined by an
- 12 engineering survey, the stopping, standing, or parking is dangerous
- 13 to those using the highway or where the stopping, standing, or
- 14 parking of vehicles would unduly interfere with the free movement
- 15 of traffic on the highway or street. The signs shall be official
- 16 signs and a person shall not stop, stand, or park a vehicle in
- 17 violation of the restrictions stated on the signs. The signs shall
- 18 be installed only after a proper traffic order is filed with the
- 19 county clerk. Upon the application to the state transportation
- 20 commission by a home rule city affected by an order, opportunity
- 21 shall be given to the city for a hearing before the state
- 22 transportation commission, pursuant ACCORDING to the administrative
- 23 procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328, except
- 24 when an ordinance of the home rule city prohibits or restricts the
- 25 parking of vehicles on a state trunk line highway; when the home
- 26 rule city, by lawfully authorized official action, requests the
- 27 state transportation department to prohibit or restrict parking on

- 1 a state trunk line highway; or when the home rule city enters into
- 2 a construction agreement with the state transportation department
- 3 providing for the prohibition or restriction of parking on a state
- 4 trunk line highway during or after the period of construction.
- 5 Traffic control orders, so long as they affect parking upon a state
- 6 trunk line highway within the corporate limits of a home rule city,
- 7 are considered "rules" within the meaning of the administrative
- 8 procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328, and upon
- 9 application for a hearing by a home rule city, the proceedings
- 10 before the state transportation commission shall be considered a
- 11 "contested case" within the meaning of that act.
- 12 (5) A disabled person may apply, on a form prescribed by the
- 13 secretary of state, for a serially numbered nontransferable
- 14 temporary or permanent windshield placard for the personal use of
- 15 the disabled person. An individual who has a religious objection to
- 16 having a medical examination may personally apply at a branch
- 17 office of the secretary of state for a serially numbered
- 18 nontransferable temporary or permanent windshield placard for the
- 19 personal use of the disabled individual. If it appears obvious that
- 20 the individual has a qualifying disability, the individual shall
- 21 not be required to present a medical statement attesting to the
- 22 disability. The application for and the issuance of the serially
- 23 numbered nontransferable temporary or permanent windshield placard
- 24 is subject to all of the following:
- 25 (a) The secretary of state may issue to a disabled person with
- 26 a temporary disability a temporary windshield placard that is valid
- 27 for a period of not more than 6 months.

- 1 (b) The secretary of state may issue to a disabled person with
- 2 a permanent disability an original or renewal permanent windshield
- 3 placard that is valid for at least 4 years. BEFORE ISSUING A
- 4 WINDSHIELD PLACARD UNDER THIS SUBDIVISION, THE SECRETARY OF STATE
- 5 SHALL ADVISE THE DISABLED PERSON OF THE COST OF A WINDSHIELD
- 6 PLACARD ISSUED UNDER THIS SECTION AND THE COST OF A SPECIAL
- 7 REGISTRATION PLATE ISSUED UNDER SECTION 803D.
- 8 (c) An original certificate of identification or permanent
- 9 windshield placard shall expire on the disabled person's fifth
- 10 birthday after the date of issuance.
- 11 (d) A renewal permanent windshield placard shall expire on the
- 12 disabled person's fourth birthday after the date of renewal.
- 13 (e) A person holding a certificate of identification or
- 14 permanent windshield placard at any time within 45 days before the
- 15 expiration of his or her certificate or placard may make
- 16 application for a new or renewal placard as provided for in this
- 17 section. However, if the person will be out of state during the 45
- 18 days immediately preceding expiration of the certificate or placard
- 19 or for other good cause shown cannot apply for a placard within the
- 20 45-day period, application for a new or renewal placard may be made
- 21 not more than 6 months before expiration of the certificate or
- 22 placard. A placard issued or renewed under this subdivision shall
- 23 expire as provided for in this subsection.
- 24 (f) Upon application in the manner prescribed by the secretary
- 25 of state for replacement of a lost, stolen, or destroyed
- 26 certificate or placard described in this section, a disabled person
- 27 or organization that provides specialized services to disabled

- 1 persons may be issued a placard that in substance duplicates the
- 2 original certificate or placard for a fee of \$10.00.
- 3 (g) A certificate or placard described in this section may be
- 4 used by a person other than the disabled person for the sole
- 5 purpose of transporting the disabled person. An organization that
- 6 provides specialized services to disabled persons may apply for and
- 7 receive a permanent windshield placard to be used in any motor
- 8 vehicle actually transporting a disabled person. If the
- 9 organization ceases to transport disabled persons, the placard
- 10 shall be returned to the secretary of state for cancellation and
- 11 destruction.
- 12 (6) A disabled person with a certificate of identification,
- 13 windshield placard, special registration plates issued under
- 14 section 803d, a special registration plate issued under section
- 15 803f that has a tab for persons with disabilities attached, a
- 16 certificate of identification or windshield placard from another
- 17 state, or special registration plates from another state issued for
- 18 persons with disabilities is entitled to courtesy in the parking of
- 19 a vehicle. The courtesy shall relieve the disabled person or the
- 20 person transporting the disabled person from liability for a
- 21 violation with respect to parking, other than in violation of this
- 22 act. A local authority may by ordinance prohibit parking on a
- 23 street or highway to create a fire lane or to provide for the
- 24 accommodation of heavy traffic during morning and afternoon rush
- 25 hours, and the privileges extending to veterans and physically
- 26 disabled persons under this subsection do not supersede that
- 27 ordinance.

- 1 (7) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (24), an
- 2 application for an initial free parking sticker shall contain a
- 3 certification by a physician, physician assistant, or certified
- 4 nurse practitioner licensed to practice in this state attesting to
- 5 the nature and estimated duration of the applicant's disabling
- 6 condition and verifying that the applicant qualifies for a free
- 7 parking sticker. An individual who has a religious objection to
- 8 having a medical examination may personally apply at a branch
- 9 office of the secretary of state for an initial free parking
- 10 sticker. If it appears obvious that the individual is unable to do
- 11 1 or more of the acts listed in subdivisions (a) to (d), the
- 12 individual shall not be required to present a certification by a
- 13 physician, a physician assistant, or a certified nurse practitioner
- 14 attesting to the nature and estimated duration of the applicant's
- 15 disabling condition or verifying that the applicant qualifies for a
- 16 free parking sticker. The applicant qualifies for a free parking
- 17 sticker if the applicant is a licensed driver and the physician,
- 18 physician assistant, or certified nurse practitioner certifies or,
- 19 if an individual is not required to have a certification by a
- 20 physician, a physician assistant, or a certified nurse
- 21 practitioner, it is obvious that the applicant is unable to do 1 or
- 22 more of the following:
- 23 (a) Manage, manipulate, or insert coins, or obtain tickets or
- 24 tokens in parking meters or ticket machines in parking lots or
- 25 parking structures, due to the lack of fine motor control of both
- 26 hands.
- (b) Reach above his or her head to a height of 42 inches from

- 1 the ground, due to a lack of finger, hand, or upper extremity
- 2 strength or mobility.
- 3 (c) Approach a parking meter due to his or her use of a
- 4 wheelchair or other device.
- 5 (d) Walk more than 20 feet due to an orthopedic, neurological,
- 6 cardiovascular, or lung condition in which the degree of
- 7 debilitation is so severe that it almost completely impedes the
- 8 ability to walk.
- 9 (8) To be entitled to free parking in a metered space or in a
- 10 publicly owned parking structure or area, a vehicle must properly
- 11 display 1 of the following:
- 12 (a) A windshield placard bearing a free parking sticker issued
- 13 pursuant to this act.
- 14 (b) A valid certificate of identification issued before
- 15 October 1, 1994.
- 16 (c) A valid windshield placard issued by another state.
- 17 (d) A certificate of identification issued by another state.
- 18 (e) A license plate for persons with disabilities issued by
- 19 another state.
- 20 (f) A special registration plate with a tab for persons with
- 21 disabilities attached issued by another state.
- 22 (9) A vehicle that does not properly display 1 of the items
- 23 listed in subsection (8) is not entitled to free parking in a
- 24 metered parking space or in a publicly owned parking area or
- 25 structure, and the disabled person or vehicle operator shall pay
- 26 all parking fees and may be responsible for a civil infraction.
- 27 (10) Blindness that is not accompanied by an incapacity

- 1 described in subsection (7) does not entitle a person to a free
- 2 parking sticker.
- 3 (11) The secretary of state shall attach a free parking
- 4 sticker, in contrasting colors, to the windshield placard of a
- 5 person certified as having an incapacity described in subsection
- **6** (7).
- 7 (12) A windshield placard issued under this section shall be
- 8 displayed on the interior rearview mirror of the vehicle or, if
- 9 there is no interior rearview mirror, on the lower left corner of
- 10 the dashboard while the vehicle is parked or being parked by or
- 11 under the direction of a disabled person pursuant to this section.
- 12 (13) A certificate of identification issued before February
- 13 11, 1992 shall be displayed on the lower left corner of the
- 14 dashboard of the parked vehicle.
- 15 (14) Upon conviction of an offense involving a violation of
- 16 the special privileges conferred upon a holder of a certificate of
- 17 identification, windshield placard, or free parking sticker, a
- 18 magistrate or judge trying the case, as a part of any penalty
- 19 imposed, may confiscate the serially numbered certificate of
- 20 identification, windshield placard, or free parking sticker and
- 21 return the confiscated item or items to the secretary of state
- 22 together with a certified copy of the sentence imposed. Upon
- 23 receipt of a certificate of identification, windshield placard, or
- 24 free parking sticker from a judge or magistrate, the secretary of
- 25 state shall cancel and destroy the certificate, placard, or
- 26 sticker, and the disabled person to whom it was issued shall not
- 27 receive another certificate, placard, or sticker until he or she

- 1 submits a completed application and presents a current medical
- 2 statement attesting to his or her condition. A law enforcement
- 3 officer who observes a misuse of a certificate of identification,
- 4 windshield placard, or free parking sticker may immediately
- 5 confiscate the certificate, placard, or sticker and forward it with
- 6 a copy of his or her report to the secretary of state.
- 7 (15) A person who intentionally makes a false statement of
- 8 material fact or commits or attempts to commit a deception or fraud
- 9 on a medical statement attesting to a disability, submitted in
- 10 support of an application for a certificate of identification,
- 11 windshield placard, free parking sticker, special registration
- 12 plate, or tab for persons with disabilities under this section,
- 13 section 803d, or section 803f, is guilty of a misdemeanor,
- 14 punishable by a fine of not more than \$500.00 or imprisonment for
- 15 not more than 30 days, or both.
- 16 (16) A person who commits or attempts to commit a deception or
- 17 fraud by 1 or more of the following methods is guilty of a
- 18 misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than \$500.00 or
- 19 imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or both:
- 20 (a) Using a certificate of identification, windshield placard,
- 21 or free parking sticker issued under this section or by another
- 22 state to provide transportation to a disabled person, when the
- 23 person is not providing transportation to a disabled person.
- 24 (b) Altering, modifying, or selling a certificate of
- 25 identification, windshield placard, or free parking sticker issued
- 26 under this section or by another state.
- (c) Copying or forging a certificate of identification,

- 1 windshield placard, or free parking sticker described in this
- 2 section or selling a copied or forged certificate, placard, or
- 3 sticker described in this section. In the case of a violation of
- 4 this subdivision, the fine described in this subsection shall be
- 5 not less than \$250.00.
- 6 (d) Using a copied or forged certificate of identification,
- 7 windshield placard, or free parking sticker described in this
- 8 section.
- 9 (e) Making a false statement of material fact to obtain or
- 10 assist an individual in obtaining a certificate, placard, or
- 11 sticker described in this section, a special registration plate
- 12 under section 803d, or a tab for persons with disabilities under
- **13** section 803f.
- 14 (f) Knowingly using or displaying a certificate, placard, or
- 15 sticker described in this section that has been canceled by the
- 16 secretary of state.
- 17 (17) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person
- 18 who violates this section is responsible for a civil infraction.
- 19 (18) A certificate of identification issued before October 1,
- 20 1994 and containing an expiration date is valid for free parking in
- 21 a space controlled or regulated by a meter on a public highway or
- 22 in a publicly owned parking area or structure when the time for
- 23 parking indicated on the meter has expired, or in a parking space
- 24 clearly identified by an official sign as being reserved for use by
- 25 disabled persons that is on public property or private property
- 26 available for public use, until the expiration date printed on the
- 27 certificate. The certificate expires and shall be canceled on its

- 1 expiration date.
- 2 (19) A certificate of identification issued before October 1,
- 3 1994 that does not contain an expiration date expires and shall be
- 4 canceled on October 1, 1994.
- 5 (20) A certificate of identification shall not be issued or
- 6 renewed by the secretary of state after October 1, 1994.
- 7 (21) The secretary of state may cancel, revoke, or suspend a
- 8 windshield placard, free parking sticker, or certificate of
- 9 identification under any of the following circumstances:
- 10 (a) The secretary of state determines that a windshield
- 11 placard, free parking sticker, or certificate of identification was
- 12 fraudulently or erroneously issued.
- 13 (b) The secretary of state determines that a person has made
- 14 or is making an unlawful use of his or her windshield placard, free
- 15 parking sticker, or certificate of identification.
- 16 (c) The secretary of state determines that a check or draft
- 17 used to pay the required fee is not paid on its first presentation
- 18 and is not paid upon reasonable notice or demand or that the
- 19 required fee is paid by an invalid credit card.
- 20 (d) The secretary of state determines that the person is no
- 21 longer eligible to receive or use a windshield placard, free
- 22 parking sticker, or certificate of identification.
- 23 (e) The secretary of state determines that the owner has
- 24 committed an offense under this act involving a windshield placard,
- 25 free parking sticker, or certificate of identification.
- 26 (f) A person has violated this act and the secretary of state
- 27 is authorized under this act to cancel, revoke, or suspend a

- 1 windshield placard, free parking sticker, or certificate of
- 2 identification for that violation.
- 3 (g) The secretary of state receives notice from another state
- 4 or foreign country that a windshield placard, free parking sticker,
- 5 or certificate of identification issued by the secretary of state
- 6 has been surrendered by the owner or seized in conformity with the
- 7 laws of that other state or foreign country, or has been improperly
- 8 used or displayed in violation of the laws of that other state or
- 9 foreign country.
- 10 (22) Before a cancellation, revocation, or suspension under
- 11 subsection (21), the person affected thereby shall be given notice
- 12 and an opportunity to be heard.
- 13 (23) A windshield placard issued to a disabled person shall
- 14 bear the first letter and the last 3 digits of the disabled
- 15 person's driver's or chauffeur's license number or the first letter
- 16 and the last 4 digits of the number on his or her official state
- 17 personal identification card issued under 1972 PA 222, MCL 28.291
- **18** to 28.300.
- 19 (24) For purposes of this section only, the secretary of state
- 20 may accept an application for a windshield placard, special
- 21 registration plate, or free parking sticker from a disabled person
- 22 that is signed by a physician, physician assistant, or certified
- 23 nurse practitioner licensed or certified to practice in another
- 24 state if the application is accompanied by a copy of that
- 25 physician's, physician assistant's, or certified nurse
- 26 practitioner's current medical license or certification issued by
- 27 that state.

(25) This section does not require new or additional third
party reimbursement or worker's compensation benefits for services
rendered.

4 Sec. 803d. (1) A disabled person may make application APPLY to 5 the secretary of state and the secretary of state may issue special registration plates inscribed with the official international 6 7 wheelchair symbol or a reasonable facsimile of that symbol and special identification numbers. Vehicles registered pursuant to 8 9 **UNDER** section 801(1)(a) may be issued special registration plates pursuant to UNDER this section. A vehicle which THAT is used to 10 11 transport disabled persons may qualify for these distinguishing plates when the registered owner of the vehicle resides at the same 12 address as the disabled person, submits as part of his or her 13 14 application for the plates a statement to the effect that the vehicle is used for that purpose, and provides the secretary of 15 state with a medical statement attesting to the fact that the 16 17 person being transported is a disabled person. The fees for the 18 special registration plates shall correspond with the registration 19 fees provided in section 801(1)(a). Application for the special 20 plates shall be on a form prescribed by the secretary of state. As 21 part of a penalty imposed for violation of the special privileges 22 conferred by this section, a magistrate or judge may order the 23 special plates confiscated and returned to the secretary of state 24 together with a certified copy of the sentence imposed. The use of special plates on a vehicle other than the vehicle for which the 25 26 plates are issued or by a person who does not qualify under this 27 section is a misdemeanor.

- 1 (2) BEFORE ISSUING A SPECIAL REGISTRATION PLATE UNDER THIS
- 2 SECTION, THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL ADVISE THE DISABLED PERSON OF
- 3 THE COST OF A SPECIAL REGISTRATION PLATE ISSUED UNDER THIS SECTION
- 4 AND THE COST OF A WINDSHIELD PLACARD ISSUED UNDER SECTION 675.
