A bill to amend 1846 RS 171, entitled

"Of county jails and the regulation thereof,"

by amending sections 4 and 4a (MCL 801.4 and 801.4a), as amended by $2006\ PA\ 20$.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 4. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) and sections
- 2 5 and 5a, all charges and expenses of safekeeping and maintaining
- 3 prisoners and persons charged with an offense, REGARDLESS OF
- 4 WHETHER THOSE INDIVIDUALS HAVE BEEN ARRAIGNED FOR THOSE OFFENSES,
- 5 shall be paid from the county treasury, the accounts therefor being
- first settled and allowed by the county board of commissioners.
- 7 (2) If medical care or treatment is provided to an individual
 - described in subsection (1), the health care provider shall make a

- 3 class has jurisdiction of the offense.
