A SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILL 4151 AS INTRODUCED 1-26-11

The bill would require that one member of the Michigan Gaming Control Board be a representative of the equine (horse-related) industry.

The board would continue to have five members appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the Senate. Not more than three board members can be members of the same political party.

The bill would also make a number of technical, non-substantive amendments to the act.

(The Gaming Control Board is responsible for the licensing and regulation of the Detroit casinos and of the state's horse racing tracks, among other things).
