

HOUSE BILL No. 4926

September 8, 2011, Introduced by Reps. Pscholka, Tyler and Nesbitt and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1998 PA 58, entitled
"Michigan liquor control code of 1998,"
by amending section 513 (MCL 436.1513), as amended by 2009 PA 48.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 513. (1) The commission may issue to the governing board
2 of a college or university, without regard to the quota provisions
3 of section 531, a license to sell alcoholic liquor for consumption
4 on the premises of a conference center operated by the governing
5 board. Licenses granted under this subsection may be used only for
6 the sale of alcoholic liquor at regularly scheduled conference
7 center activities. The sale of alcoholic liquor to unscheduled
8 patrons or at unscheduled events is prohibited under this

1 subsection.

2 (2) Subject to the provisions of section 531, the commission
3 may issue a license to a private entity for the sale of alcoholic
4 liquor for consumption on the premises of a hotel located on land
5 owned by central Michigan university if both of the following
6 circumstances exist:

7 (a) The land is leased or subleased at fair market value to a
8 private entity that owns, leases, or subleases the hotel building
9 and its fixtures.

10 (b) The hotel and land are located within an industrial,
11 research, or commercial development park established by the
12 governing board of central Michigan university.

13 (3) Subject to the provisions of section 531, the commission
14 may issue a license to a private entity for the sale of alcoholic
15 liquor for consumption on the licensed premises of a restaurant
16 located on land owned by Wayne state university if both of the
17 following circumstances exist:

18 (a) The land is leased or subleased at fair market value to a
19 private entity that owns, leases, or subleases the licensed
20 premises for the operation of a restaurant.

21 (b) The restaurant is located within an area designated for
22 industrial, research, or commercial development by the governing
23 board of Wayne state university.

24 (4) **THE COMMISSION SHALL ISSUE A LICENSE TO A PRIVATE ENTITY**
25 **FOR THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR FOR CONSUMPTION ON THE PREMISES OF**
26 **AN OUTDOOR STADIUM LOCATED ON LAND OWNED BY LAKE MICHIGAN COLLEGE**
27 **AND LEASED TO A PRIVATE ENTITY. THE PROHIBITION IN SECTION 531(7)**

1 ON LICENSES AT OUTDOOR STADIUMS DOES NOT APPLY TO A LICENSE ISSUED
2 UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.

3 (5) ~~(4)~~ Licenses issued pursuant to ~~UNDER~~ this section are
4 nontransferable, and the licensee shall pay the fee required under
5 section 525.

6 (6) ~~(5)~~ As used in this section:

7 (a) "College" or "university" means a 2-year or 4-year state
8 supported institution of higher education.

9 (b) "Conference center" means a building or portion of a
10 building, other than a student residence hall or student center,
11 which has meeting rooms, banquet areas, social halls, overnight
12 accommodations, and related facilities for special activities
13 scheduled by the college or university, which in the judgment of
14 the commission, has been regularly used for conferences and lodging
15 of guests. The convocation center and the corporate education
16 center at eastern Michigan university, the Kirkhof and Eberhard
17 centers at Grand Valley state university, the Bernhard center at
18 western Michigan university, the Wadsworth center at Michigan
19 technological university, the West complex at Saginaw Valley state
20 university, the conference center at Big Rapids, the applied
21 technology center at Grand Rapids and the FSU-GR conference center
22 of Ferris state university, Grand Rapids junior college, the
23 Waterman campus center at Schoolcraft college, the Mendel center
24 **AND ALL OTHER BUILDINGS, INCLUDING UP TO 100 YARDS ON THE LAND**
25 **IMMEDIATELY OUTSIDE EACH BUILDING,** at Lake Michigan community
26 college, the McGregor memorial conference center at Wayne state
27 university, the Michigan state university management educational

1 center, the Superior dome at northern Michigan university, the
2 Walker Cisler center at Lake Superior state university, the Marie
3 Prah1 college center at Mott community college, the John T. Parsons
4 and Frank L. Stulen Michigan technical education center, the Gerald
5 and Frances Oleson center, the Dennon museum center, and the Great
6 Lakes campus at northwestern Michigan college, the farmhouse at
7 Delta college, the Oakland community college culinary studies
8 institute, and the performing arts and cultural center complex at
9 Macomb community college are considered conference centers for the
10 purposes of this act.
