

**SUBSTITUTE FOR  
HOUSE BILL NO. 4330**

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled  
"Public health code,"  
by amending section 2843 (MCL 333.2843), as amended by 2002 PA 691.

**THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:**

1           Sec. 2843. (1) A funeral director who first assumes custody of  
2 a dead body, either personally or through his or her authorized  
3 agent, shall report the death. For purposes of this subsection,  
4 "dead body" includes, but is not limited to, the body of an infant  
5 who survived an attempted abortion as described in the born alive  
6 infant protection act and who later died. The funeral director or  
7 the authorized agent shall obtain the necessary personal data from  
8 the next of kin or the best qualified individual or source  
9 available and shall obtain medical certification as follows:  
10           (a) If the death occurred outside an institution, the medical

1 certification portion of the death record shall be completed and  
2 certified not later than 48 hours after death by the attending  
3 physician; or in the absence of the attending physician, by a  
4 physician acting as the attending physician's authorized  
5 representative; or in the absence of an authorized representative,  
6 by the county medical examiner; or in the absence of the county  
7 medical examiner, by the county health officer or the deputy county  
8 medical examiner. If the death occurred in an institution, the  
9 medical certification shall be completed and signed not later than  
10 48 hours after death by the attending physician; or in the absence  
11 of the attending physician, by a physician acting as the attending  
12 physician's authorized representative; or in the absence of an  
13 authorized representative, by the chief medical officer of the  
14 institution in which death occurred, after reviewing pertinent  
15 records and making other investigation as considered necessary, or  
16 by a pathologist.

17 (b) A physician ~~, as~~ described in subdivision (a), who for  
18 himself or herself or as an agent or employee of another individual  
19 neglects or refuses to certify a death record properly presented to  
20 him or her for certification by a funeral director or who refuses  
21 or neglects to furnish information in his or her possession, is  
22 guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more  
23 than 60 days, or a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than  
24 \$100.00, or both.

2 (3) A death record shall be certified by a funeral director  
3 **WHO IS** licensed under article 18 of the occupational code, 1980 PA  
4 299, MCL 339.1801 to 339.1812, **OR BY AN INDIVIDUAL WHO HOLDS A**  
5 **COURTESY LICENSE UNDER SECTION 1806A OF THAT ACT, MCL 339.1806A,**  
6 and shall be filed with the local registrar of the district where  
7 the death occurred ~~not later than~~ **WITHIN** 72 hours after the death.

8 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the death  
9 of an infant who was born alive following an attempted abortion and  
10 was surrendered to an emergency service provider under the safe  
11 delivery of newborns law, sections 1 to 20 of chapter XII of the  
12 probate code of 1939, 1939 PA 288, MCL 712.1 to 712.20, and then  
13 died shall be reported in the same manner as for any death.

14 However, the deceased infant shall be listed as "Baby Doe" and no  
15 information that would directly identify the deceased infant or the  
16 deceased infant's parents shall be reported, including, but not  
17 limited to, the following information:

18 (a) The name of the mother or father.

19 (b) The address of the mother or father.

20 (c) The name of the informant.

21 (d) The address of the informant.

[Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect upon the  
expiration of 90 days after the date it is enacted into law.]

22 Enacting section [2]. This amendatory act does not take effect  
23 unless Senate Bill No. 231 or House Bill No. 4303 of the 97th  
24 Legislature is enacted into law.
