Rep. Phelps, having reserved the right to explain his protest against the passage of the bill, made the following statement: "Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

I voted against HB 4855 today because it unfairly singles out the men and women in Michigan who are on, or have been on assistance from the Michigan Department of Human Services. There are many people in Michigan and many that live outside the state, that currently owe money to state departments. To include only those individuals who may owe money to the Department of Human Services is a callous and calculated attempt to further demonize those families who find themselves or have found themselves in poverty at some point in their lives. I would however support legislation that would collect money owed by any individual that has lotto winnings and owes any money to the state or our state's court systems."
