A bill to amend 1927 PA 372, entitled

"An act to regulate and license the selling, purchasing, possessing, and carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices; to prohibit the buying, selling, or carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices without a license or other authorization; to provide for the forfeiture of firearms and electro-muscular disruption devices under certain circumstances; to provide for penalties and remedies; to provide immunity from civil liability under certain circumstances; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state and local agencies; to prohibit certain conduct against individuals who apply for or receive a license to carry a concealed pistol; to make appropriations; to prescribe certain conditions for the appropriations; and to repeal all acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act,"

by amending section 1 (MCL 28.421), as amended by 2014 PA 203.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 1. (1) As used in this act:

(a) "Felony" means that term as defined in section 1 of chapter I of the code of criminal procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL761.1, or a violation of a law of the United States or another

- 3 (b) "Firearm" means a ANY weapon from which a dangerous WILL,

- (d) "Misdemeanor" means a violation of a penal law of this

- 1 inches or less in length, or a loaded or unloaded firearm that by

- 3 (g) "Purchaser" means a person who receives a pistol from
- 4 another person by purchase or gift.
- 5 (h) "Reserve peace officer", "auxiliary officer", or "reserve
- 6 officer" means, except as otherwise provided in this act, an
- 7 individual authorized on a voluntary or irregular basis by a duly
- 8 authorized police agency of this state or a political subdivision
- 9 of this state to act as a law enforcement officer, who is
- 10 responsible for the preservation of the peace, the prevention and
- 11 detection of crime, and the enforcement of the general criminal
- 12 laws of this state, and who is otherwise eligible to possess a
- 13 firearm under this act.
- 14 (i) "Retired police officer" or "retired law enforcement
- 15 officer" means an individual who was a police officer or law
- 16 enforcement officer who was certified as described under section 9a
- 17 of the commission on law enforcement standards act, 1965 PA 203,
- 18 MCL 28.609a, and retired in good standing from his or her
- 19 employment as a police officer or law enforcement officer.
- 20 (j) "Seller" means a person who sells or gives a pistol to
- 21 another person.
- (k) "State court judge" means a judge of the district court,
- 23 circuit court, probate court, or court of appeals or justice of the
- 24 supreme court of this state who is serving either by election or
- 25 appointment.
- 26 (l) "State court retired judge" means a judge or justice
- 27 described in subdivision (k) who is retired, or a retired judge of

- 1 the recorders court.
- 2 (2) A person may lawfully own, possess, carry, or transport as
- 3 a pistol a firearm greater than 26 inches in length if all of the
- 4 following conditions apply:
- 5 (a) The person registered the firearm as a pistol under
- 6 section 2 or 2a before January 1, 2013.
- 7 (b) The person who registered the firearm as described in
- 8 subdivision (a) has maintained registration of the firearm since
- 9 January 1, 2013 without lapse.
- 10 (c) The person possesses a copy of the license or record
- 11 issued to him or her under section 2 or 2a.
- 12 (3) A person who satisfies all of the conditions listed under
- 13 subsection (2) nevertheless may elect to have the firearm not be
- 14 considered to be a pistol. A person who makes the election under
- 15 this subsection shall notify the department of state police of the
- 16 election in a manner prescribed by that department.
- 17 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect [July 1,
