A bill to amend 1964 PA 287, entitled

"An act to provide for the organization and functions of the state boards of education under the constitutions of 1908 and 1963; to provide for the appointment and functions of the superintendent of public instruction under the constitution of 1963; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts,"

by amending section 8b (MCL 388.1008b).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 8b. The state board of education SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC

 INSTRUCTION may take by gift, grant from federal or other sources,

 devise, bequest, or in any other lawful manner, property, money,

 pledges, or promises to pay money for the exclusive use of the

 school for the blind at Lansing or to be expended at any other

 place within the state for any purpose for the benefit of the
- 7 school for the STUDENTS WHO ARE blind. Notwithstanding the
- 8 provisions of section 8, the state treasurer shall transmit to the
- 9 board all such moneys being SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION
