SENATE BILL NO. 711

A bill to amend 2014 PA 181, entitled  
"Michigan financial review commission act,"  
by amending sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 12 (MCL 141.1632,  
141.1633, 141.1634, 141.1635, 141.1636, 141.1637, 141.1638, and  
141.1642).

**THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:**

1       Sec. 2. The legislature finds and declares the following:

2       (a) It is the public policy of this state to exercise its  
3       sovereign powers with regard to debt issuance and matters of  
4       statewide concern in a manner calculated to foster the fiscal  
5       integrity of all municipal governments **AND SCHOOL DISTRICTS** to  
6       assure that those municipalities **AND SCHOOL DISTRICTS** provide for  
7       the health, safety, and welfare of their ~~citizens~~; **RESIDENTS**; pay  
8       principal and interest owed on debt obligations when due; meet

1 financial obligations to their existing and former employees,  
2 vendors, and suppliers; and provide for proper financial planning  
3 procedures and budgeting practices. The inability of a municipal  
4 government to provide essential services to its citizens **OR A**  
5 **SCHOOL DISTRICT TO PROVIDE PUBLIC EDUCATION SERVICES TO ITS**  
6 **RESIDENTS** as a result of fiscal emergencies is determined to affect  
7 adversely the health, safety, and welfare of not only that  
8 municipality's citizens **AND A SCHOOL DISTRICT'S RESIDENTS**, but also  
9 other citizens of this state.

10 (b) The police and fire retirement system of certain qualified  
11 cities and the general retirement system of certain qualified  
12 cities are currently underfunded, causing communities across the  
13 state to face higher costs to borrow and invest funds, and have  
14 caused bondholders, bond insurers, and financial institutions  
15 anxiety over the financial health of not only certain qualified  
16 cities, but communities across this state.

17 (c) Absent prospective state oversight over qualified cities  
18 **AND SCHOOL DISTRICTS**, there exists a threat of increased costs in  
19 borrowing, reductions in credit or bond ratings, reduced faith from  
20 existing creditors of municipalities **OR SCHOOL DISTRICTS** and of  
21 this state, and dire financial circumstances from which this state  
22 and its political subdivisions may never fully recover.

23 (d) Qualified cities **AND SCHOOL DISTRICTS** have complex  
24 budgetary and fiscal needs, significant and complicated debt  
25 management issues, and financial assets and liabilities that  
26 impact, both positively and negatively, every unit of local  
27 government **AND SCHOOL DISTRICT** in this state and this state itself

1 such that reasonable and balanced state oversight over qualified  
2 cities **AND SCHOOL DISTRICTS** is required as a reasonable exercise of  
3 this state's power for the benefit of residents throughout this  
4 state.

5 (e) There are numerous residents of this state who have  
6 accrued pension benefits from a qualified city's pension systems,  
7 and those pensioners may reside throughout this state. The  
8 settlement of bankruptcy cases involving qualified cities is likely  
9 to have a substantial positive impact statewide.

10 (f) Establishing a commission and execution by the commission  
11 of its powers granted under this act fulfill in all respects a  
12 public and governmental purpose for the benefit of the people of  
13 this state.

14 (g) Ongoing fiscal oversight over qualified cities **AND SCHOOL**  
15 **DISTRICTS** is a reasonable and sufficiently narrow regulation and  
16 serves a significant and legitimate public purpose because it  
17 inures to the benefit of all of this state's residents and aids in  
18 the remedy of a broad and general social problem.

19 (h) Fiscal oversight over qualified cities **AND OVER SCHOOL**  
20 **DISTRICTS** will ensure that those **QUALIFIED** cities **AND SCHOOL**  
21 **DISTRICTS** do not engage in the financial practices that led to  
22 financial emergencies and insolvency, and ultimately, entry into  
23 receivership and bankruptcy, which will ensure that those cities  
24 can provide basic and essential municipal services to their  
25 residents **AND THAT THOSE SCHOOL DISTRICTS CAN PROVIDE PUBLIC**  
26 **EDUCATION SERVICES TO THEIR RESIDENTS.**

27 Sec. 3. As used in this act:

1 (a) "Applicable contract" means a contract for goods or  
2 services proposed or entered into by a qualified city **OR SCHOOL**  
3 **DISTRICT** that either exceeds \$750,000.00, or a higher amount as  
4 determined by the commission, or is for a term exceeding 2 years.  
5 Applicable contract also includes multiple contracts for less than  
6 \$750,000.00, or the higher amount determined by the commission,  
7 with 1 entity that, in the aggregate, exceed \$750,000.00, or a  
8 higher amount as determined by the commission, within a 12-month  
9 period.

10 (b) "Federal bankruptcy code" means the federal bankruptcy  
11 code, 11 USC 101 to 1532.

12 (c) "Financial review commission" or "commission" means a  
13 financial review commission created in section 4.

14 (d) "Operating expenses" means the reasonable operating  
15 expenses of the commission, including without limitation the cost  
16 of preparing accounting and other reports, costs of commission  
17 meetings or other required activities of the commission, counsel  
18 fees, including fees of the attorney general, and fees and expenses  
19 incurred for consultants and fiduciaries required to carry out the  
20 purposes of this act.

21 (e) "Person" means an individual, corporation, limited or  
22 general partnership, association, joint venture, limited liability  
23 company, a governmental entity, including this state.

24 (f) "Plan for adjustment" means the plan for the adjustment of  
25 debts of a qualified city approved and entered by a United States  
26 bankruptcy court under chapter 9 of title 11 of the United States  
27 Code, 11 USC 901 to 946.

1 (g) "Professional services" means services that require a high  
2 degree of intellectual skill, an advanced degree, or professional  
3 licensing or certification. Those providing the professional  
4 services are distinguished based on their specialized knowledge,  
5 experience, and expertise. Professional services include, but are  
6 not limited to, accounting, actuarial, appraisal, auditing,  
7 investment advisor, and legal services.

8 (h) "Qualified city" means a city with a population of more  
9 than 600,000 that is subject to a plan for adjustment.

10 (I) **"QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT" MEANS A COMMUNITY DISTRICT**  
11 **ORGANIZED UNDER PART 5B OF THE REVISED SCHOOL CODE, 1976 PA 451,**  
12 **MCL 380.381 TO 380.396, TO WHICH THE FUNCTIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES**  
13 **OF A QUALIFYING SCHOOL DISTRICT UNDER SECTION 12B OF THE REVISED**  
14 **SCHOOL CODE, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.12B, HAVE BEEN TRANSFERRED UNDER**  
15 **THAT SECTION.**

16 (J) ~~(i)~~—"State treasurer" means the treasurer of this state or  
17 his or her designee who shall be designated by a written instrument  
18 signed by the state treasurer and maintained in a permanent file  
19 and whose signature shall have the same force and effect as the  
20 signature of the state treasurer for all purposes under this act.

21 Sec. 4. (1) ~~A~~**EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (2), A**  
22 financial review commission is created within the department of  
23 treasury for each qualified city **AND EACH QUALIFIED SCHOOL**  
24 **DISTRICT.** Except as otherwise provided in this act, a commission  
25 shall exercise its powers, duties, functions, and responsibilities  
26 under this act independently of the state treasurer. The budgeting,  
27 procurement, personnel, and related management functions of a

1 commission shall be performed under the direction and supervision  
2 of the state treasurer.

3 (2) IF A COMMUNITY DISTRICT ORGANIZED UNDER PART 5B OF THE  
4 REVISED SCHOOL CODE, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.381 TO 380.396, BECOMES A  
5 QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT UNDER THIS ACT AND THAT QUALIFIED SCHOOL  
6 DISTRICT IS LOCATED WITHIN THE GEOGRAPHIC BOUNDARIES OF A QUALIFIED  
7 CITY FOR WHICH A FINANCIAL REVIEW COMMISSION IS OPERATING UNDER  
8 THIS ACT, BEGINNING ON THE TRANSFER DATE, AS THAT TERM IS DEFINED  
9 UNDER SECTION 12B OF THE REVISED SCHOOL CODE, 1976 PA 451, MCL  
10 380.12B, THE FINANCIAL REVIEW COMMISSION FOR THAT QUALIFIED CITY  
11 ALSO SHALL BE THE FINANCIAL REVIEW COMMISSION FOR THAT QUALIFIED  
12 SCHOOL DISTRICT, AND NO SEPARATE OR ADDITIONAL FINANCIAL REVIEW  
13 COMMISSION FOR THAT QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT IS CREATED UNDER THIS  
14 ACT.

15 Sec. 5. (1) ~~Each~~ EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION  
16 (2), EACH commission shall consist of the following 9 members:

17 (a) The state treasurer, who shall serve for the duration of  
18 his or her term of office.

19 (b) The director of the department of technology, management,  
20 and budget or successor agency, or his or her designee, who shall  
21 serve for the duration of his or her term of office.

22 (c) Three members appointed by the governor who have  
23 knowledge, skill, or experience in the field of business or finance  
24 and who shall possess knowledge, training, skill, or experience in  
25 budgeting, revenue forecasting, debt management or borrowing,  
26 actuarial science, law, or business operations, at least 1 of whom  
27 is a resident of that qualified city OR QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

1 OTHER THAN A QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT DESCRIBED IN SECTION 4(2),  
2 and at least 1 of whom is a resident of this state who is not a  
3 resident of a qualified city OR QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT OTHER  
4 THAN A QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT DESCRIBED IN SECTION 4(2).

5 (d) The mayor or chief executive officer of that qualified  
6 city OR QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT OTHER THAN A QUALIFIED SCHOOL  
7 DISTRICT DESCRIBED IN SECTION 4(2), or his or her designee, who  
8 shall serve for the duration of the mayor's or chief executive  
9 officer's term of office.

10 (e) One member appointed by the governor from a list of 3 or  
11 more individuals nominated by the senate majority leader who have  
12 knowledge, skill, or experience in the field of business or  
13 finance, and who shall possess knowledge, training, skill, or  
14 experience in budgeting, revenue forecasting, debt management or  
15 borrowing, actuarial science, law, or business operations, and 1 of  
16 whom is a resident of that qualified city OR QUALIFIED SCHOOL  
17 DISTRICT OTHER THAN A QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT DESCRIBED IN  
18 SECTION 4(2).

19 (f) One member appointed by the governor from a list of 3 or  
20 more individuals nominated by the speaker of the house of  
21 representatives who have knowledge, skill, or experience in the  
22 field of business or finance, and who shall possess knowledge,  
23 training, skill, or experience in budgeting, revenue forecasting,  
24 debt management or borrowing, actuarial science, law, or business  
25 operations, and 1 of whom is a resident of that qualified city OR  
26 QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT OTHER THAN A QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT  
27 DESCRIBED IN SECTION 4(2).

1 (g) The president or chairperson of the qualified city's  
2 governing body or ~~his or her designee~~, **QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT'S**  
3 **SCHOOL BOARD OTHER THAN A QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT DESCRIBED IN**  
4 **SECTION 4(2), OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE**, who shall serve for the  
5 duration of the president's or chairperson's term of office.

6 (2) **IF A FINANCIAL REVIEW COMMISSION IS THE FINANCIAL REVIEW**  
7 **COMMISSION FOR BOTH A QUALIFIED CITY AND A QUALIFIED SCHOOL**  
8 **DISTRICT UNDER SECTION 4(2), IN ADDITION TO THE MAYOR OR CHIEF**  
9 **EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF THE QUALIFIED CITY OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE**  
10 **UNDER SUBSECTION (1)(D) AND THE PRESIDENT OR CHAIRPERSON OF THE**  
11 **QUALIFIED CITY'S GOVERNING BODY OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE UNDER**  
12 **SUBSECTION (1)(G), THE FINANCIAL REVIEW COMMISSION ALSO SHALL**  
13 **INCLUDE AS MEMBERS THE SUPERINTENDENT OF THE QUALIFIED SCHOOL**  
14 **DISTRICT AND THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE SCHOOL BOARD OF THE QUALIFIED**  
15 **SCHOOL DISTRICT. THE SUPERINTENDENT OF THE QUALIFIED SCHOOL**  
16 **DISTRICT AND THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE SCHOOL BOARD OF THE QUALIFIED**  
17 **SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL NOT HAVE A VOTE ON MATTERS RELATING TO THE**  
18 **QUALIFIED CITY. THE MAYOR OR CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF THE**  
19 **QUALIFIED CITY, OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE UNDER SUBSECTION (1)(D) AND**  
20 **THE PRESIDENT OR CHAIRPERSON OF THE QUALIFIED CITY'S GOVERNING BODY**  
21 **OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE UNDER SUBSECTION (1)(G), SHALL NOT HAVE A**  
22 **VOTE ON MATTERS RELATING TO THE QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT.**

23 (3) ~~(2)~~—The appointed members shall serve for a term of 4  
24 years, except that of the 5 members first appointed, the appointees  
25 of the governor shall serve a term of 1, 2, and 4 years  
26 respectively, the appointee of the governor who was nominated by  
27 the speaker of the house of representatives shall serve a term of 2



1 years, and the appointee of the governor who was nominated by the  
2 senate majority leader shall serve a term of 3 years. Appointed  
3 members serve at the pleasure of, and may be removed by, their  
4 respective appointing official.

5 (4) ~~(3)~~—Members of a commission shall serve without  
6 compensation but may receive reasonable reimbursement for necessary  
7 travel and expenses incurred in the discharge of their official  
8 duties.

9 (5) ~~(4)~~—The state treasurer or his or her designee shall serve  
10 as chairperson of a commission.

11 (6) ~~(5)~~—A majority of the members of the commission shall  
12 constitute a quorum of the commission for the transaction of  
13 business. The commission shall meet no less than monthly and at  
14 times and places designated by the chairperson. Actions of the  
15 commission shall be approved by a majority of the members.

16 (7) ~~(6)~~—The commission shall conduct its business at public  
17 meetings in compliance with the open meetings act, 1976 PA 267, MCL  
18 15.261 to 15.275. However, members of the commission may attend and  
19 participate in a meeting of the commission by the use of  
20 telecommunication or other electronic equipment if their attendance  
21 and participation by the use of telecommunication or other  
22 electronic equipment is authorized by the bylaws of the commission  
23 and that meeting is otherwise conducted in compliance with the open  
24 meetings act, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 to 15.275.

25 (8) ~~(7)~~—A writing prepared, owned, used, in the possession of,  
26 or retained by the commission in the performance of an official  
27 function is subject to the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442,

1 MCL 15.231 to 15.246.

2 (9) ~~(8)~~—The commission shall adopt bylaws for governance of  
3 the commission, which shall, at a minimum, address the procedures  
4 for conducting meetings, including voting procedures, and the  
5 requirements of its members to attend meetings. Procedural rules  
6 required by this section are not subject to the administrative  
7 procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328.

8 (10) ~~(9)~~—The commission may contract for professional  
9 services, as it requires, and shall determine the qualifications it  
10 considers necessary.

11 (11) ~~(10)~~—The members of the commission and contractors or  
12 agents of the commission are subject to 1968 PA 317, MCL 15.321 to  
13 15.330, and 1968 PA 318, MCL 15.301 to 15.310.

14 (12) ~~(11)~~—A member of the commission, and any person the  
15 commission contracts with, shall discharge the duties of his or her  
16 position in a nonpartisan manner, with good faith, and with that  
17 degree of diligence, care, and skill that an ordinarily prudent  
18 person would exercise under similar circumstances in a like  
19 position. The commission shall adopt an ethics policy governing the  
20 conduct of commission members and officers and employees of the  
21 commission.

22 (13) ~~(12)~~—Commission members shall take and subscribe to the  
23 constitutional oath of office under section 1 of article XI of the  
24 state constitution of 1963. The oath shall be filed with the  
25 secretary of state.

26 Sec. 6. (1) The commission shall provide oversight for a  
27 qualified city beginning on the effective date of the plan for

1 adjustment or of this act, whichever is later. **THE COMMISSION SHALL**  
2 **PROVIDE OVERSIGHT FOR A QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT BEGINNING ON THE**  
3 **DATE THE SCHOOL DISTRICT BECOMES A QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT.**

4 (2) The commission shall ensure that the qualified city **OR**  
5 **QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT** is complying with the terms and  
6 conditions of this act and of the plan for adjustment, if  
7 applicable. Except as otherwise provided in section 8, the  
8 commission shall by October 1 each year certify that the qualified  
9 city **OR QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT** is in substantial compliance with  
10 the provisions of this act.

11 (3) The commission shall ensure that, where applicable, a  
12 qualified city **OR QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT** complies with the  
13 provisions of all of the following, **AS APPLICABLE**, and may request  
14 verification of compliance:

15 (a) Section 8 of the publicly funded health insurance  
16 contribution act, 2011 PA 152, MCL 15.568.

17 (b) Sections 4i, 4p, 4s, and 4t of the home rule city act,  
18 1909 PA 279, MCL 117.4i, 117.4p, 117.4s, and 117.4t.

19 (c) The revised municipal finance act, 2001 PA 34, MCL  
20 141.2101 to 141.2821.

21 (d) The uniform budgeting and accounting act, 1968 PA 2, MCL  
22 141.421 to 141.440a.

23 **(E) FOR A QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:**

24 **(i) THE REVISED SCHOOL CODE, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1 TO**  
25 **380.1852.**

26 **(ii) ARTICLE I OF THE STATE SCHOOL AID ACT OF 1979, 1979 PA**  
27 **94, MCL 388.1601 TO 388.1772.**

1           (iii) **THE PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT ACT OF 1979, 1980**  
2 **PA 300, MCL 38.1301 TO 38.1437.**

3           (4) During the period of oversight **FOR A QUALIFIED CITY**, the  
4 commission shall review and approve that qualified city's 4-year  
5 financial plan required by section 4t of the home rule city act,  
6 1909 PA 279, MCL 117.4t. A 4-year financial plan described in this  
7 subsection shall be submitted at least 100 days prior to the  
8 commencement of a qualified city's fiscal year. The commission  
9 shall approve or disapprove the 4-year financial plan within 30  
10 days of receipt. If disapproved, the commission shall provide  
11 rationale in writing for disapproval and a qualified city shall  
12 submit a revised plan within 15 days that comports with the  
13 commission's rationale for rejection. The commission shall approve  
14 or disapprove that revised plan within 15 days. The commission may  
15 also require adjustments to the financial plan to modify  
16 expenditures to satisfy debt service, adjust projected revenues to  
17 comply with financial controls or accounting practices, and reduce  
18 expenditures to conform to consensus revenue estimates if required  
19 in section 7 to comply with the provisions of section 4t of the  
20 home rule city act, 1909 PA 279, MCL 117.4t. If the qualified city  
21 fails to submit an acceptable financial plan, the commission may  
22 adopt and impose upon the qualified city a financial plan  
23 satisfying the requirements of this act and section 4t of the home  
24 rule city act, 1909 PA 279, MCL 117.4t, until that time as the  
25 qualified city submits an acceptable financial plan.

26           (5) Subject to a plan for adjustment and any collective  
27 bargaining agreements still in effect, the commission shall

1 establish and maintain programs and requirements for the  
2 responsible fiscal management of that qualified city **OR QUALIFIED**  
3 **SCHOOL DISTRICT**. The commission's programs and requirements shall  
4 include all of the following:

5 (a) Increased managerial accountability.

6 (b) The streamlining of the provision of city **OR QUALIFIED**  
7 **SCHOOL DISTRICT** services.

8 (c) Improved collection of outstanding tax revenues.

9 (d) Review of the compensation and benefits of city **OR**  
10 **QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT** employees and recommendation of  
11 adjustments where necessary.

12 (6) Notwithstanding any charter provision or local ordinance  
13 to the contrary, all applicable contracts are subject to review and  
14 approval by the commission. The commission may consider a number of  
15 factors when reviewing an applicable contract, including whether  
16 the applicable contract was subject to a competitive bid process.  
17 Only applicable contracts that are first approved by the governing  
18 body and mayor **OR CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER** of a qualified city **OR**  
19 **QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT** as required by law, charter, ordinance,  
20 or policy are subject to review by the commission. If an applicable  
21 contract is not rejected by the commission within 30 days of its  
22 submission, that applicable contract shall be considered approved  
23 by the commission.

24 (7) A qualified city ~~,~~**OR QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT**, when  
25 required by the commission, shall present written reports regarding  
26 its financial stability and shall permit the commission to audit or  
27 inspect financial statements, actuarial reports, revenue estimates,

1 and any and all other documents, data, reports, or findings that  
2 the commission considers necessary to carry out its purpose under  
3 this act. The commission may require that qualified city's **OR**  
4 **QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT'S** chief financial officer to certify in  
5 writing the accuracy of any documents the commission requests.

6 (8) The commission shall, on June 1 and December 1 of each  
7 year in which the commission has oversight over a qualified city **OR**  
8 **A QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT**, file a written report with the  
9 governor. A copy of the report shall be submitted to the senate  
10 majority leader and the speaker of the house of representatives and  
11 posted on the department of treasury website. A copy of the report  
12 shall be sent to the mayor **OR CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER** and governing  
13 body of the qualified city **OR QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT**.

14 (9) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the  
15 commission shall approve all collective bargaining agreements,  
16 including any addendums to those agreements, to which that  
17 qualified city **OR QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT** is a party after  
18 approval by the governing body and mayor **OR CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER**  
19 of the qualified city **OR QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT** as required by  
20 charter or law. The commission shall approve or reject collective  
21 bargaining agreements submitted to it within 45 days of submission.  
22 Collective bargaining agreements submitted to the commission shall  
23 not be executed unless and until the commission approves those  
24 agreements. Collective bargaining agreements approved by an  
25 emergency manager appointed under section 12 of the local financial  
26 stability and choice act, 2012 PA 436, MCL 141.1552, shall not be  
27 subject to commission approval under this subsection.

1           (10) ~~The~~ **FOR A QUALIFIED CITY, THE** commission may file  
2 supplementary information relating to the financial condition of  
3 the qualified city with an arbitration panel in arbitration  
4 proceedings in which the qualified city is a party pursuant to 1969  
5 PA 312, MCL 423.231 to 423.247.

6           (11) The mayor **OR CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER**, governing body, and  
7 chief financial officer of a qualified city **OR QUALIFIED SCHOOL**  
8 **DISTRICT** shall, at least 45 days prior to the beginning of each  
9 fiscal quarter, certify in writing to the commission the amount of  
10 debt service due on bonds, leases, or other ~~municipal~~ debt. A  
11 qualified city **OR QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT** shall specifically  
12 report debt service requirements, calculated through final  
13 maturity, and certify its ability to meet those requirements  
14 through the end of the current fiscal year.

15           Sec. 7. A commission may do 1 or more of the following for its

21 **SCHOOL DISTRICT**, revise a revenue estimate prepared in connection

13 (g) Approve the appointment of a qualified city's chief  
14 financial officer. If that appointment is not approved by the  
15 commission within 45 days of written submission of the appointment  
16 by the qualified city, the appointment is denied. The commission  
17 may require that any effort to terminate the chief financial  
18 officer be subject to commission review and approval.

19 **(H) APPROVE THE APPOINTMENT OF THE QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT'S**  
20 **CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER. IF THAT APPOINTMENT IS NOT APPROVED BY THE**

5 for the qualified city **OR QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, AS APPLICABLE.**

6 (K) ~~(j)~~—Require the pursuit of financial or managerial  
7 training to ensure the proper discharge of duties for the qualified  
8 city **OR QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT.**

9 (L) ~~(k)~~—Make and execute contracts necessary to carry out the  
10 purposes of this act.

11 (M) ~~(l)~~—Sue or be sued. The commission may retain legal

8 securities **OR OTHER DEBT** when due and payable or its ability to

26 sections 6 and 7 under section 8 each year for the immediately

1 IF APPLICABLE, has expired, the commission shall, by resolution,  
2 dissolve itself. All property, funds, and assets of the commission,

13 HAVE BEEN MET FOR A QUALIFIED CITY OR THE REQUIREMENTS OF  
14 SUBSECTION (2) HAVE BEEN MET FOR A QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, THAT  
15 QUALIFIED CITY OR THAT QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL BE RELEASED
