HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION WW

December 13, 2016, Introduced by Reps. Lauren Plawecki, Pagan, Liberati and Wittenberg.

A joint resolution to petition the Congress of the United States to call a convention to propose an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to restrict independent political spending.

- 1 Whereas, the 1st President of the United States, George
- 2 Washington, stated, "The basis of our political systems is the
- 3 right of the people to make and to alter their Constitutions of
- 4 Government."; and,
- 5 Whereas, it was the stated intention of the framers of the
- 6 Constitution of the United States of America that the Congress of
- 7 the United States of America should be "dependent on the people
- 8 alone." (James Madison, Federalist 52); and,
- 9 Whereas, that dependency has evolved from a dependency on the

- 1 people alone to a dependency on those who spend excessively in
- 2 elections, through campaigns or third-party groups; and,
- 3 Whereas, the United States Supreme Court ruling in Citizens
- 4 United v Federal Election Commission, 558 US 310 (2010), removed
- 5 restrictions on amounts of independent political spending; and,
- 6 Whereas, the removal of those restrictions has resulted in the
- 7 unjust influence of powerful economic forces, which have supplanted
- 8 the will of the people by undermining our ability to choose our
- 9 political leadership, write our own laws, and determine the fate of
- 10 our state; and,
- 11 Whereas, Article V of the United States Constitution requires
- 12 the United States Congress to call a convention for proposing
- 13 amendments upon application of two-thirds of the legislatures of
- 14 the several states for the purpose of proposing amendments to the
- 15 United States Constitution; and,
- 16 Whereas, the state of Michigan sees the need for a convention
- 17 to propose amendments in order to address concerns such as those
- 18 raised by the decision of the United States Supreme Court in
- 19 Citizens United v Federal Election Commission, 558 US 310 (2010),
- 20 and related cases and events including those occurring long before
- 21 or afterward or for a substantially similar purpose, and desires
- 22 that said convention should be so limited; and,
- 23 Whereas, the state of Michigan desires that the delegates to
- 24 said convention shall be composed equally of individuals currently
- 25 elected to state and local office, or be selected by election in
- 26 each congressional district for the purpose of serving as
- 27 delegates, though all individuals elected or appointed to federal

- 1 office, now or in the past, be prohibited from serving as delegates
- 2 to the convention, and intends to retain the ability to restrict or
- 3 expand the power of its delegates within the limits expressed
- 4 above; and,
- 5 Whereas, the state of Michigan intends that this be a
- 6 continuing application considered together with applications
- 7 calling for a convention passed in the 2013-2014 Vermont
- 8 legislature as R454, the 2013-2014 California legislature as
- 9 Resolution Chapter 77, the 98th Illinois General Assembly as Senate
- 10 Joint Resolution No. 42, the 2014-2015 New Jersey legislature as
- 11 SCR 132, and all other passed, pending, and future applications,
- 12 the aforementioned concerns of Michigan notwithstanding until such
- 13 time as two-thirds of the several states have applied for a
- 14 convention and said convention is convened by Congress.
- 15 Be it resolved, That the legislature of the state of Michigan,
- 16 pursuant to Article V of the United States Constitution, hereby
- 17 petitions the United States Congress to call a convention for the
- 18 purpose of proposing amendments to the Constitution of the United
- 19 States of America as soon as two-thirds of the several states have
- 20 applied for a convention; and
- 21 Be it further resolved, That copies of this resolution be
- 22 transmitted to the President and Vice President of the United
- 23 States, to the Speaker of the United States House of
- 24 Representatives, to the Minority Leader of the United States House
- 25 of Representatives, to the President Pro Tempore of the United
- 26 States Senate, to each senator and representative from Michigan in
- 27 the Congress of the United States, to the governor of each state,

- 1 and to the presiding officers of each legislative body of each of
- 2 the several states, requesting the cooperation of the several
- 3 states in issuing an application compelling congress to call a
- 4 convention for proposing amendments pursuant to Article V of the
- 5 United States Constitution.
