Motions and Resolutions

Reps. Jones, Geiss, Howrylak, Phelps and Zemke offered the following resolution:

House Resolution No. 210.

A resolution to condemn the slave trade taking place in Libya.

Whereas, International organizations and media outlets have recently documented the existence of slavery auctions in Libya. Reports indicate that victims are being held in abhorrent conditions, ransomed, sold into forced labor and prostitution, and killed at the hands of human traffickers; and

Whereas, Slavery is a galling violation of human rights. The Secretary General of the United Nations declared in response to the reports that “slavery has no place in our world” and that the events in Libya “may amount to crimes against humanity.” The videos and stories emerging from Libya showing the inhuman abuse of migrants remind us of the darkest periods of human history; and

Whereas, The international community has demanded an investigation and response by Libyan authorities. Protests have taken place around the world and several countries have withdrawn their ambassadors from Libya; and

Whereas, The political and economic situation in Libya remains fraught in the aftermath of the NATO-supported overthrow of Muammar Gaddafi that took place in 2011. The Libyan government is struggling to manage migration and the disorder within the country has provided opportunity for human traffickers to barbarically exploit displaced people; and

Whereas, The United States and the international community must do everything in their power to support the rescue of the victims of these atrocities and ensure that the perpetrators are held accountable; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the House of Representatives, That we condemn the slave trade taking place in Libya; and be it further

Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the United States Secretary of State, the Secretary General of the United Nations, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and the members of the Michigan congressional delegation.

The resolution was referred to Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs.

Whereas, On December 7, Americans everywhere gather to commemorate the 76th anniversary of the morning in 1941 when American Armed Forces were attacked at Pearl Harbor by the Imperial Japanese air and naval forces. That attack killed more than 2,400 Americans and wounded 1,178 others; and

Whereas, This grievous attack plunged our nation into World War II, and although America was unprepared for war, our steadfast resolve and courage quickly prepared us to do what must be done in defense of our country. The sacrifices of our brave military helped ensure peace around the globe and thrust America into a crucial role of being world leader for democracy; and

Whereas, We remember those fallen Americans, our dead and wounded, and those young Americans who survived yet continued to serve this great country in and out of uniform; and

Whereas, We remember that America's freedom and way of life is sacred and was purchased at a very high price and can be threatened at any time, and that strength and courage and devotion to America's founding principles are worth defending at all costs; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of this legislative body declare December 7, 2017, as Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day in the state of Michigan. We will continue to keep the resolve of those military personnel we have loved and lost by remembering the sacrifices made at Pearl Harbor.

A bill to amend 1961 PA 88, entitled "Reciprocal retirement act," (MCL 38.1101 to 38.1106) by adding section 2a.

The bill was read a second time.

Rep. Glenn moved that the bill be placed on the order of Third Reading of Bills.

The motion prevailed.

House Bill No. 5303, entitled

A bill to amend 1846 RS 16, entitled "Of the powers and duties of townships, the election and duties of township officers, and the division of townships," by amending section 110b (MCL 41.110b), as amended by 1999 PA 209.

The bill was read a second time.

Rep. Crawford moved that the bill be placed on the order of Third Reading of Bills.

The motion prevailed.

House Bill No. 5304, entitled

A bill to amend 1966 PA 293, entitled "An act to provide for the establishment of charter counties; to provide for the election of charter commissioners; to prescribe their powers and duties; to prohibit certain acts of a county board of commissioners after the approval of the election of a charter commission; to prescribe the mandatory and permissive provisions of a charter; to provide for the exercise by a charter county of certain powers whether or not authorized by its charter; and to prescribe penalties and provide remedies," by amending sections 14, 14a, and 15 (MCL 45.514, 45.514a, and 45.515), section 14 as amended by 2005 PA 208, section 14a as added by 2012 PA 466, and section 15 as amended by 1980 PA 7, and by adding section 15c.

House Bill No. 5305, entitled

A bill to amend 1851 PA 156, entitled "An act to define the powers and duties of the county boards of commissioners of the several counties, and to confer upon them certain local, administrative and legislative powers; and to prescribe penalties for the violation of the provisions of this act," by amending sections 12a, 12d, and 12e (MCL 46.12a, 46.12d, and 46.12e), section 12a as amended by 2003 PA 219.
