14 (4) THIS ARTICLE SHALL BE KNOWN AND MAY BE CITED AS THE
15 "MARSHALL PLAN FOR TALENT".

16 SEC. 297A. (1) FROM THE APPROPRIATION IN SECTION 297, THERE IS
17 ALLOCATED FOR 2017-2018 AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$36,485,000.00 FOR
18 THE EXPANSION OF K-12 EDUCATION PROGRAMS THAT FOCUS ON CREATING
19 COMPETENCIES AND EARNING CREDENTIALS IN HIGH-DEMAND FIELDS.

20 (2) SUBJECT TO SECTION 297K, FROM THE ALLOCATION IN SUBSECTION
21 (1), THERE IS ALLOCATED AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$29,935,000.00 FOR
22 COMPETITIVE GRANTS TO DISTRICTS AND INTERMEDIATE DISTRICTS THAT ARE
23 MEMBERS OF AND APPLY ON BEHALF OF A TALENT CONSORTIUM, IN A FORM
24 AND MANNER PRESCRIBED BY THE DEPARTMENT UNDER SECTION 297I FOR THE
25 PURPOSE OF EXPANDING OR CREATING PUPIL EXPERIENCES THAT RESULT IN
26 COMPETENCIES OR CREDENTIALS, OR BOTH, IN HIGH-DEMAND FIELDS. AN
27 APPLICATION FOR A GRANT UNDER THIS SUBSECTION MUST INCLUDE A

1 COMMITMENT TO ADOPT THE PRINCIPLES OF A COMPETENCY-BASED
2 INSTRUCTIONAL MODEL.

3 (3) FUNDS RECEIVED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE USED BY MEMBERS
4 OF THE TALENT CONSORTIUM FOR ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:

5 (A) STIPENDS FOR INDUSTRY MENTORS TO ASSIST IN TEACHING
6 CLASSES IN HIGH-DEMAND FIELDS.

7 (B) TESTING OR PROJECT FEES ON BEHALF OF PUPILS FOR THE
8 PURPOSE OF EARNING CREDENTIALS IN HIGH-DEMAND FIELDS.

9 (C) PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOR TEACHERS WHO IMPROVE THEIR
10 CAPACITY TO TEACH HIGH-DEMAND SKILLS. GRANTS AWARDED FOR THIS
11 PURPOSE SHALL NOT EXCEED \$5,000.00 PER TEACHER.

12 (D) THE HIRING OF FULL-TIME STAFF TO CREATE OR EXPAND A
13 PROGRAM IN A HIGH-DEMAND FIELD. IN ORDER TO USE FUNDS FOR THIS
14 PURPOSE, THE APPLICANT MUST COMMIT TO CONTINUING TO PROVIDE THE
15 PROGRAM FOR AT LEAST AN ADDITIONAL 3 YEARS FOLLOWING THE FINAL

24 CURRICULUM CREATED USING FUNDS ALLOCATED UNDER THIS SECTION MUST
25 MEET ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:

26 (i) IS MADE OPEN-SOURCE TO OTHER DISTRICTS ACROSS THIS STATE,
27 TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE.

1 (ii) IS DEVELOPED WITH THE DIRECT AND MEANINGFUL INPUT OF AT
2 LEAST 1 EMPLOYER WHO IS PARTY TO A TALENT CONSORTIUM.

3 (iii) UTILIZES THE PRINCIPLES OF COMPETENCY-BASED LEARNING.

4 (iv) LEADS TO A CREDENTIAL.

5 (F) TO ASSIST CERTIFICATED TEACHERS TO EARN NEW ENDORSEMENTS
6 IN AREAS OF HIGH-DEMAND CRITICAL SHORTAGE THROUGH A COMPETENCY-
7 BASED RESIDENCY MODEL. GRANTS AWARDED FOR THE PURPOSES UNDER THIS
8 SUBDIVISION MUST NOT EXCEED \$8,000.00 PER TEACHER AND MUST BE USED

9 TO PAY THE COSTS OF A TEACHER'S PARTICIPATION IN A TEACHER

10 PREPARATION PROGRAM THAT COLLABORATES WITH THE DEPARTMENT TO

11 DEVELOP ENDORSEMENT PROGRAMS THAT COST NO MORE THAN \$8,000.00 FOR A

12 TEACHER OR A DISTRICT AND THAT ASSESS A TEACHER'S MASTERY OF

13 STANDARDS IN A COMPETENCY-BASED MODEL.

14 (4) AT LEAST \$2,000,000.00 OF THE FUNDS APPROPRIATED UNDER

15 SUBSECTION (1) MUST BE USED FOR COMPETITIVE GRANTS TO DISTRICTS

16 THAT ARE MEMBERS OF A TALENT CONSORTIUM AND THAT SEEK TO CONVERT AN

17 ENTIRE SCHOOL OR DISTRICT TO A COMPETENCY-BASED LEARNING MODEL.

18 APPLICATIONS UNDER THIS SECTION MUST INCLUDE ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:

19 (A) AN EDUCATIONAL MODEL THAT ALLOWS THE USE OF MULTIPLE AND
20 INNOVATIVE METHODS TO DETERMINE PUPILS' ACHIEVEMENT OF GRADE-LEVEL
21 COMPETENCIES AND CREDIT UNDER THE MICHIGAN MERIT CURRICULUM.

22 (B) CURRICULUM THAT ALLOWS FOR A MAJORITY OF INSTRUCTIONAL
23 TIME TO BE SPENT ON PUPIL-DRIVEN PROJECTS THAT TARGET ACADEMIC
24 SKILLS AND ASSIST PUPILS IN ACHIEVING 21ST CENTURY SKILLS SUCH AS
25 LEADERSHIP, TEAMWORK, PROBLEM SOLVING, AND COMMUNICATION.

26 (C) AN INNOVATIVE PARTNERSHIP WITH EMPLOYERS OR INSTITUTES OF
27 HIGHER EDUCATION, OR BOTH, TO PROVIDE CONTEXTUALIZED LEARNING

1 OPPORTUNITIES THAT EMPHASIZE ATTAINMENT OF COMPETENCIES THAT
2 INCLUDE APPLICATION AND CREATION OF KNOWLEDGE, ALONG WITH THE
3 DEVELOPMENT OF WORK-READY SKILLS.

4 (D) A PLAN FOR THE TRANSITION AWAY FROM A GRADE-LEVEL SYSTEM
5 OF PUPIL PROMOTION TO A COMPETENCY-BASED SYSTEM OF PUPIL PROMOTION.
6 THIS PLAN MUST INCLUDE MESSAGING TO PARENTS DESCRIBING THE BENEFITS
7 OF, AND STEPS TAKEN TO IMPLEMENT, A COMPETENCY-BASED INSTRUCTIONAL
8 MODEL.

9 (E) A PLAN FOR A SCOPE AND TIMELINE OF PROFESSIONAL
10 DEVELOPMENT FOR SCHOOL INSTRUCTIONAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF.

11 (F) A COMMITMENT TO MAINTAIN PARTICIPATION IN STATEWIDE
12 ASSESSMENT AND ACCOUNTABILITY SYSTEMS FOR PUPILS BEING SERVED BY
13 PROGRAMS FUNDED UNDER THIS SECTION.

14 (G) A DESCRIPTION OF HOW THE APPLICANT WILL BE AN AMBASSADOR
15 FOR COMPETENCY-BASED LEARNING, INCLUDING A COMMITMENT TO MENTOR
16 OTHER DISTRICTS THAT WISH TO CONVERT TO A COMPETENCY-BASED
17 INSTRUCTIONAL MODEL.

18 (5) FROM THE ALLOCATION IN SUBSECTION (1), THERE IS ALLOCATED
19 FOR 2017-2018 AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1,100,000.00 TO THE
20 DEPARTMENT OF TECHNOLOGY, MANAGEMENT, AND BUDGET TO SUPPORT
21 CRITICAL CYBERSECURITY TRAINING AND INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAMS, AS
22 APPROVED BY THIS STATE'S INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY GOVERNANCE COUNCIL.
23 FUNDING ALLOCATED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION MUST BE USED TO EXPAND THE
24 MICHIGAN HIGH SCHOOL CYBER CHALLENGE PROGRAM, AS APPROVED BY THE
25 DEPARTMENT OF TECHNOLOGY, MANAGEMENT, AND BUDGET. THE EXPANSION
26 MUST INCLUDE, BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO, BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING:

27 (A) AN OPEN PROFESSIONAL CREDENTIALING OR MICRO-CREDENTIALING

1 PROCESS, OR BOTH, FOR ANY PUPIL IN GRADES 9 TO 12 WHO DEMONSTRATES
2 MASTERY OF INDUSTRY-RECOGNIZED CYBERSECURITY SKILLS.

3 (B) COLLABORATION WITH OTHER CYBERSECURITY PROGRAMS TO ENSURE
4 ALIGNMENT OF COACH, MENTOR, AND EDUCATOR SKILLS.

5 (6) FROM THE ALLOCATION IN SUBSECTION (1), THERE IS ALLOCATED
6 FOR 2017-2018 AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$450,000.00 TO THE DEPARTMENT
7 FOR STATEWIDE SUPPORTS FOR COMPETENCY-BASED LEARNING, INCLUDING,
8 BUT NOT LIMITED TO, THE NECESSARY CAPACITY-BUILDING INFRASTRUCTURE,
9 TOOLS, TRANSCRIPTS, AND REPORTING MECHANISMS TO SUPPORT THE
10 IMPLEMENTATION OF COMPETENCY-BASED EDUCATION MODELS IN DISTRICTS
11 AND CONSORTIA OF DISTRICTS RECEIVING FUNDING UNDER SUBSECTION (4)
12 WITH THE GOAL OF OFFERING THESE TOOLS STATEWIDE.

13 (7) FROM THE FUNDS ALLOCATED IN SUBSECTION (1), THERE IS
14 ALLOCATED AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1,000,000.00 TO THE DEPARTMENT
15 FOR PROVIDING TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO DISTRICTS TO HELP DISTRICTS
16 INTEGRATE THE MICHIGAN MERIT CURRICULUM INTO COMPETENCY-BASED
17 PROGRAMS, INCLUDING CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS.

18 (8) FROM THE FUNDS ALLOCATED IN SUBSECTION (1), THERE IS
19 ALLOCATED FOR 2017-2018 AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$4,000,000.00 FOR
20 AN INNOVATIVE EDUCATOR PROGRAM. FUNDS SHALL BE USED TO SUPPORT
21 EDUCATORS WHO POSSESS SPECIALIZED SKILLS AND USE THOSE SKILLS TO
22 DEPLOY INNOVATIVE INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAMS FOR THE PURPOSES OF
23 REPLICATION, EXPANSION, AND DISSEMINATION ACROSS THIS STATE. ALL OF
24 THE FOLLOWING APPLY TO THE INNOVATIVE EDUCATOR PROGRAM:

25 (A) BEGINNING IN THE 2017-2018 SCHOOL YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT
26 SHALL DEVELOP A PROCESS FOR SELECTING INNOVATIVE EDUCATORS UNDER
27 THIS SECTION.

1 (B) THE GOVERNING BODY OF EACH DISTRICT MAY NOMINATE 1
2 EDUCATOR TO THE INTERMEDIATE DISTRICT IN WHICH THE DISTRICT IS
3 LOCATED FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE INNOVATIVE EDUCATOR CORPS, ACCORDING
4 TO THE TIMELINES ESTABLISHED BY THE DEPARTMENT. AN INDIVIDUAL MUST
5 MEET ALL OF THE FOLLOWING TO BE NOMINATED UNDER THIS SUBDIVISION:

6 (i) HAVE DEMONSTRATED DOCUMENTED PUPIL ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT IN
7 THE INNOVATIVE PROGRAM OR THE CREATION OF PUPIL TALENT PORTFOLIOS
8 IN HIGH-DEMAND FIELDS.

9 (ii) BE RECOMMENDED BY, AT LEAST, PEERS, PUPILS,
10 ADMINISTRATORS, PARENTS, AND LOCAL COMMUNITY PARTNERS.

11 (iii) HAVE DEMONSTRATED SUCCESSFUL IMPLEMENTATION OF
12 INNOVATIVE INSTRUCTIONAL METHODOLOGY IN PREPARING PUPILS FOR 21ST
13 CENTURY CAREERS.

14 (iv) EXEMPLIFY THE PASSION, ENERGY, AND PROFESSIONALISM OF THE
15 TEACHING PROFESSION.

16 (C) NOT LATER THAN DECEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, DEPENDING ON
17 AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REVIEW THE NOMINATIONS
18 SUBMITTED UNDER SUBDIVISION (B) AND SELECT UP TO 100 EDUCATORS FROM
19 THE SUBMITTED NOMINATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE INNOVATIVE
20 EDUCATOR CORPS FOR A TERM OF 3 YEARS. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SELECT
21 EDUCATORS BASED ON AT LEAST BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA:

22 (i) PREFERENCE FOR EDUCATORS WITH DEMONSTRATED COMMUNITY,
23 HIGHER EDUCATION, OR BUSINESS PARTNERSHIPS.

24 (ii) PREFERENCE FOR EDUCATORS WHO UTILIZE A COMPETENCY-BASED
25 INSTRUCTIONAL MODEL, UTILIZE A PROJECT-BASED INSTRUCTIONAL MODEL,
26 HAVE HAD SUCCESS IN THE TURNAROUND OF A LOW-PERFORMING SCHOOL, OR
27 HAVE HAD SUCCESS IN A BALANCED OR YEAR-ROUND CALENDAR.

1 (D) IF SUFFICIENT FUNDING IS AVAILABLE, EACH OF THE EDUCATORS
2 SELECTED BY THE DEPARTMENT TO SERVE IN THE INNOVATIVE EDUCATOR
3 CORPS UNDER SUBDIVISION (C) SHALL RECEIVE A STIPEND IN THE AMOUNT
4 OF \$5,000.00 PER YEAR FOR UP TO 3 YEARS. AT LEAST 1 TIME PER YEAR,
5 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REVIEW THE QUALIFICATION OF EDUCATORS TO
6 ENSURE THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS, AND OTHER REQUIREMENTS
7 ESTABLISHED BY THE DEPARTMENT, ARE STILL BEING MET. IF SUFFICIENT
8 FUNDING IS AVAILABLE, AN ADDITIONAL \$5,000.00 PER EDUCATOR WILL BE
9 AWARDED ANNUALLY TO THE INTERMEDIATE DISTRICT FOR PURPOSES OF
10 REPLICATION, EXPANSION, AND DISSEMINATION OF THE INNOVATIVE
11 STRATEGIES AND PROGRAM. THE SELECTED EDUCATOR SHALL DEVELOP A PLAN
12 WITH THE INTERMEDIATE DISTRICT THAT DETAILS HOW THE FUNDS WILL BE
13 SPENT TO SUPPORT THE DUTIES OF THE SELECTED EDUCATOR UNDER THIS
14 SUBSECTION. THESE FUNDS MAY BE USED TO COVER COSTS, INCLUDING, BUT
15 NOT LIMITED TO, THE FOLLOWING:

16 (i) PUPIL AND EDUCATOR TRAVEL.

17 (ii) SUBSTITUTE EDUCATORS.

18 (iii) PROGRAM MATERIALS.

19 (iv) TRAINING MATERIALS.

20 (v) PUPIL SUPPLIES AND MATERIALS.

21 (9) THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION SHALL PROMULGATE
22 RULES TO IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION.

23 SEC. 297B. (1) FROM THE APPROPRIATION IN SECTION 297, THERE IS
24 ALLOCATED FOR 2017-2018 AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$18,500,000.00 FOR
25 COMPETITIVE GRANTS TO DISTRICTS AND INTERMEDIATE DISTRICTS FOR THE
26 TALENT EQUIPMENT PROGRAM DESCRIBED IN THIS SECTION. GRANTS AWARDED
27 UNDER THIS SECTION ARE SUBJECT TO SECTION 297K.

1 (2) A DISTRICT OR INTERMEDIATE DISTRICT THAT IS A MEMBER OF A
2 TALENT CONSORTIUM IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR A GRANT UNDER THIS
3 SECTION, IN A FORM AND MANNER PRESCRIBED BY THE DEPARTMENT UNDER
4 SECTION 297I.

5 (3) GRANT FUNDS AWARDED UNDER THIS SECTION MUST BE USED TO
6 PURCHASE OR LEASE EQUIPMENT FOR USE IN EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS THAT
7 BUILD A MORE QUALIFIED AND SKILLED WORKFORCE IN EMERGING AND HIGH-
8 DEMAND FIELDS AND RESULT IN COMPETENCIES OR CREDENTIALS IN THOSE

26 THE FUNDS MUST BE USED TO FUND SCHOLARSHIPS AND STIPENDS FOR 3
27 COHORTS OF ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS OVER 4 YEARS. AWARDS SHALL BE IN

1 THE FOLLOWING AMOUNTS:

2 (A) \$750.00 SCHOLARSHIP AWARD FOR INDIVIDUALS ENROLLED IN AN
3 ELIGIBLE PROGRAM THAT LEADS TO A 1-YEAR CREDENTIAL, IN ADDITION TO
4 A \$250.00 STIPEND PAID TO THE INDIVIDUAL.

5 (B) \$500.00 SCHOLARSHIP AWARD EACH YEAR FOR 2 YEARS FOR
6 INDIVIDUALS ENROLLED IN AN ELIGIBLE PROGRAM THAT LEADS TO A 2-YEAR
7 CREDENTIAL, IN ADDITION TO A \$250.00 STIPEND EACH YEAR PAID TO THE
8 INDIVIDUAL.

9 (3) TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR A SCHOLARSHIP GRANT UNDER THIS SECTION,
10 AN INDIVIDUAL SHALL MEET ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:

11 (A) EXCEPT FOR AN INDIVIDUAL UNDER THE AGE OF 18, POSSESS A

18 (D) MEET THE SAME INCOME QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS AS THE
19 HEALTHY MICHIGAN PLAN UNDER SECTION 107 OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE ACT,
20 1939 PA 280, MCL 400.107, AT THE TIME OF APPLICATION.

21 (E) BE ENROLLED FULL-TIME IN A QUALIFYING PROGRAM AT AN
22 ELIGIBLE POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTION.

23 (F) APPLY FOR A GRANT IN A FORM AND MANNER PRESCRIBED BY THE
24 DEPARTMENT OF TREASURY.

25 (G) MAINTAIN A CUMULATIVE GRADE POINT AVERAGE OF AT LEAST 2.5,
26 IF THE INSTITUTION UTILIZES A STANDARD GRADING MODEL, OR, IF THE
27 INSTITUTION UTILIZES A COMPETENCY-BASED GRADING MODEL DURING HIS OR

1 HER TIME ENROLLED IN AN ELIGIBLE POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTION, MAKE

11 CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF TALENT AND ECONOMIC
12 DEVELOPMENT, SHALL AWARD AT LEAST 50% OF THE FUNDS ALLOCATED UNDER
13 SECTIONS 297A, 297B, AND 297D.

14 SEC. 297J. (1) A TIER 1 DISTRICT MAY APPLY FOR GRANT FUNDING
15 UNDER THIS ARTICLE IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$500,000.00. A TIER 2
16 DISTRICT MAY APPLY FOR GRANT FUNDING UNDER THIS ARTICLE IN AN
17 AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$300,000.00. A TIER 3 DISTRICT MAY APPLY FOR
18 GRANT FUNDING UNDER THIS ARTICLE IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED
19 \$200,000.00.

20 (2) A DISTRICT MAY APPLY FOR A GRANT UNDER THIS ARTICLE WITH 1
21 OR MORE OTHER DISTRICTS. THE SUM OF THE PUPIL MEMBERSHIPS OF THE
22 DISTRICTS APPLYING FOR A COMBINED GRANT MUST BE USED TO DETERMINE
23 THE TIER LEVEL FOR GRANT ALLOCATION, AND EACH DISTRICT IN THE

25 (3) AN INTERMEDIATE DISTRICT MAY APPLY FOR A GRANT UNDER THIS
26 ARTICLE FOR ITS OWN PROGRAM, OR ON BEHALF OF 1 OR MORE OF ITS
27 CONSTITUENT DISTRICTS. IF AN INTERMEDIATE DISTRICT APPLIES FOR A

1 GRANT UNDER THIS ARTICLE ON BEHALF OF 1 OR MORE OF ITS CONSTITUENT
2 DISTRICTS, THE SUM OF THE PUPIL MEMBERSHIPS OF THE CONSTITUENT
3 DISTRICTS IN THE GRANT APPLICATION SHALL DETERMINE THE TIER LEVEL
4 FOR GRANT ALLOCATION FOR EACH CONSTITUENT DISTRICT INCLUDED IN THE
5 APPLICATION. AN INTERMEDIATE DISTRICT THAT APPLIES FOR A GRANT FOR

7 SEC. 297K. (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ENSURE THAT GRANT FUNDS
8 AWARDED UNDER SECTIONS 297A, 297B, AND 297D ARE AWARDED AS FOLLOWS:

9 (A) 50% TO TIER 1 DISTRICTS.

10 (B) 30% TO TIER 2 DISTRICTS.

11 (C) 20% TO TIER 3 DISTRICTS.

12 (2) IF A DISTRICT FROM 1 TIER APPLIES FOR A GRANT WITH 1 OR
13 MORE OTHER DISTRICTS IN A COMBINED APPLICATION, OR IF AN
14 INTERMEDIATE DISTRICT SUBMITS A GRANT APPLICATION ON BEHALF OF MORE
15 THAN 1 OF ITS CONSTITUENT DISTRICTS, AND THE COMBINED APPLICATION
16 RESULTS IN A DISTRICT FROM 1 TIER RECEIVING A GRANT AWARD THAT IS
17 HIGHER THAN IF A COMBINED APPLICATION HAD NOT BEEN SUBMITTED, THE
18 PORTION OF THE GRANT AWARD THAT EXCEEDS WHAT THE DISTRICT WOULD
19 HAVE RECEIVED IN THE ABSENCE OF A COMBINED APPLICATION MUST BE
20 APPLIED TO THE TIER PERCENTAGES UNDER SUBSECTION (1) IN THE SAME
21 PROPORTION THAT THE PUPIL MEMBERSHIP OF THAT DISTRICT REPRESENTS OF
22 THE TOTAL PUPIL MEMBERSHIPS IN THE COMBINED GRANT APPLICATION.

23 SEC. 297L. EACH RECIPIENT OF A GRANT UNDER THIS ARTICLE SHALL
24 PROVIDE A REPORT TO THE DEPARTMENT NOT LATER THAN JUNE 30, 2020
25 THAT IDENTIFIES THE AMOUNT OF THE GRANT RECEIVED, HOW THE GRANT WAS
26 SPENT, THE NUMBER OF PUPILS REACHED WITH GRANT FUNDS, AND OTHER
27 INFORMATION AS REQUIRED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

1 Enacting section 1. In accordance with section 30 of article
2 IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending from
3 state sources on state school aid under article V of the state
4 school aid act of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1897 to 388.1897n, as
5 added by this amendatory act for fiscal year 2017-2018 is estimated
6 at \$100,000,000.00 and state appropriations for school aid to be
7 paid to local units of government for fiscal year 2017-2018 are
8 estimated at \$61,235,000.00.
