A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code," by amending section 307 (MCL 257.307), as amended by 2018 PA 177.

House Bill No. 6422, entitled

A bill to amend 2016 PA 282, entitled "Marihuana tracking act," by amending sections 2 and 4 (MCL 333.27902 and 333.27904).

House Bill No. 6423, entitled

A bill to amend 1961 PA 236, entitled "Revised judicature act of 1961," by amending section 2956a (MCL 600.2956a), as added by 2014 PA 360.

House Bill No. 6424, entitled

A bill to amend 1967 PA 281, entitled "Income tax act of 1967," by amending section 30 (MCL 206.30), as amended by 2018 PA 38.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Tax Policy.

House Bill No. 6425, entitled

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law," by amending sections 697 and 699 (MCL 168.697 and 168.699), section 699 as amended by 2012 PA 523, and by adding section 696a; and to repeal acts and parts of acts. The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Elections and Ethics.

Rep. Victory introduced

House Bill No. 6426, entitled

A bill to amend 1909 PA 283, entitled "An act to revise, consolidate, and add to the laws relating to the establishment, opening, discontinuing, vacating, closing, altering, improvement, maintenance, and use of the public highways and private roads; the condemnation of property and gravel therefor; the building, repairing and preservation of bridges; maintaining public access to waterways under certain conditions; setting and protecting shade trees, drainage, and cutting weeds and brush within this state; providing for the election or appointment and defining the powers, duties, and compensation of state, county, township, and district highway officials; and to prescribe penalties and provide remedies," by amending section 21 (MCL 224.21), as amended by 1996 PA 23.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.
