Whereas, Michigan helped to win World War II with the Willow Run Bomber Plant building where almost half of all the B-24 bombers were produced in the United States; and

Whereas, Michigan's Selfridge Air National Guard Base has served a vital role in our Nation's defense for over 100 years; and

Whereas, Our rich aerospace history is also showcased with the Yankee Air Museum, Selfridge Military Air Museum, and the Air Zoo Aerospace & Science Museum; and

Whereas, Michigan is the birthplace of twelve NASA astronauts including Roger B. Chaffee of *Apollo 1* and Gregory Jarvis of *Challenger*; and

Whereas, Michigan is the birthplace of notable aviation pioneers William Boeing, Edward Heinemann, Clarence "Kelly" Johnson, Iven Kincheloe, Charles Lindbergh and several others; and

Whereas, For over a century, Michigan's academic institutions have educated generations of both aerospace and aeronautical scientists and engineers; and

Whereas, Michigan's economy is strengthened by more than 650 aerospace manufacturing companies; and

Whereas, Michigan is now ranked #2 in state aerospace manufacturing attractiveness; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative body recognize Wednesday, January 31, 2018, as Michigan Aerospace Day.

A bill to amend 1941 PA 122, entitled "An act to establish the revenue collection duties of the department of treasury; to prescribe its powers and duties as the revenue collection agency of this state; to prescribe certain powers and duties of the state treasurer; to establish the collection duties of certain other state departments for money or accounts owed to this state; to regulate the importation, stamping, and disposition of certain tobacco products; to provide for the transfer of powers and duties now vested in certain other state boards, commissions, departments, and offices; to prescribe certain duties of and require certain reports from the department of treasury; to provide procedures for the payment, administration, audit, assessment, levy of interests or penalties on, and appeals of taxes and tax liability; to prescribe its powers and duties if an agreement to act as agent for a city to administer, collect, and enforce the city income tax act on behalf of a city is entered into with any city; to provide an appropriation; to abolish the state board of tax administration; to prescribe penalties and provide remedies; and to declare the effect of this act," by amending section 22 (MCL 205.22), as amended by 2015 PA 79.
