SUMMARY:

House Bill 4826 would amend the Revised School Code to encourage school districts and public school academies (PSAs, or charter schools) to include a program of instruction in free enterprise and entrepreneurship in their social studies curriculum for grades 9 through 12 beginning in the 2021-2022 school year. A district or PSA would not be precluded from including that instruction in other subject areas or grade levels.

A program of instruction described above would have to be project-based and could include instruction in at least all of the following:

- Business vocabulary, including entrepreneurship, free enterprise, business finance, goods and services, and innovation.
- Entrepreneurs from this state and around the world.
- Action activities, including setting short- and long-term goals.
- Business basics, including taxes for businesses and corporations, essential skills for business owners, and product- and service-based business ideas.
- Creating a student project-based business plan.

The bill would take effect 90 days after its enactment.
