## **HOUSE BILL NO. 4340**

March 12, 2019, Introduced by Reps. Reilly, Slagh, Howell and LaFave and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Outdoor Recreation.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending section 40112 (MCL 324.40112), as amended by 2015 PA 12.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 40112. (1) An individual shall not obstruct or interferein the lawful taking of animals or fish by another individual.
  - (2) An individual violates this section when if the individual intentionally or knowingly does any of the following:
    - (a) Drives or disturbs animals or fish for the purpose of



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1 disrupting a lawful taking.

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- (b) Blocks, impedes, or harasses another individual who is
   engaged in the process of lawfully taking an animal or fish.
- 4 (c) Uses a natural or artificial visual, aural, olfactory,
  5 gustatory, or physical stimulus or an unmanned vehicle or unmanned
  6 device that uses aerodynamic forces to achieve flight or that
  7 operates on the surface of the water or underwater, to affect
  8 animal or fish behavior in order to hinder or prevent the lawful
  9 taking of an animal or a fish.
  - (d) Erects barriers to deny ingress or egress to areas where the lawful taking of animals or fish may occur. This subdivision does not apply to an individual who erects barriers to prevent trespassing on his or her property.
- (e) Interjects himself or herself into the line of fire of anindividual lawfully taking wildlife.
- (f) Affects the condition or placement of personal or public property intended for use in the lawful taking of an animal or a fish in order to impair the usefulness of the property or prevent the use of the property.
- 20 (g) Enters or remains upon private lands without the21 permission of the owner or the owner's agent, for the purpose of22 violating this section.
  - (h) Photographs, videotapes, audiotapes, or otherwise records an individual who is lawfully taking an animal or fish with the intent to harass that individual.
- (i) (h) Engages in any other act or behavior for the purposeof violating this section.
- (3) Upon petition of an aggrieved person or an individual whoreasonably may be aggrieved by a violation of this section, a court



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- of competent jurisdiction, upon a showing that an individual was engaged in and threatens to continue to engage in illegal conduct under this section, may enjoin that conduct.
- 4 (4) An individual who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 93 days or 5 a fine of not less than \$500.00 or more than \$1,000.00, or both, 6 7 and the costs of prosecution. An individual who violates this 8 section a second or subsequent time is quilty of a misdemeanor 9 punishable by imprisonment for not more than 1 year or a fine of 10 not less than \$1,000.00 or more than \$2,500.00, or both, and the 11 costs of prosecution. In addition to the penalties provided for in 12 this subsection, any permit or license issued by the department 13 authorizing the individual to take animals or fish shall must be 14 revoked. A prosecution under this section does not preclude 15 prosecution or other action under any other criminal or civil 16 statute.
- 17 (5) This section does not apply to a peace officer while the
  18 peace officer performs his or her lawful duties.
