GENERAL SECTIONS

11 Sec. 201. Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state
12 constitution of 1963, total state spending from state resources

16 Sec. 202. The appropriations made and expenditures authorized
17 under this act and the departments, commissions, boards, offices,
18 and programs for which appropriations are made under this act are

7 (v) Increase the reimbursement rate for child care center
8 providers with a 4-star rating by \$0.70 per hour for each child.

9 (vi) Increase the reimbursement rate for child care center
10 providers with a 5-star rating by \$0.80 per hour for each child.

11 (b) To increase the reimbursement rates for group home
12 providers under the following guidelines:

13 (i) Increase the reimbursement rate for group home providers
14 with an empty star rating by \$0.15 per hour for each child.

15 (ii) Increase the reimbursement rate for group home providers
16 with a 1-star rating by \$0.35 per hour for each child.

17 (iii) Increase the reimbursement rate for group home providers
18 with a 2-star rating by \$0.45 per hour for each child.

19 (iv) Increase the reimbursement rate for group home providers
20 with a 3-star rating by \$0.50 per hour for each child.

21 (v) Increase the reimbursement rate for group home providers
22 with a 4-star rating by \$0.70 per hour for each child.

23 (vi) Increase the reimbursement rate for group home providers
24 with a 5-star rating by \$0.80 per hour for each child.

25 (c) To increase the reimbursement rates for registered family
26 home providers under the following guidelines:

27 (i) Increase the reimbursement rate for registered family home
28 providers with an empty star rating by \$0.15 per hour for each

1 child.

2 (ii) Increase the reimbursement rate for registered family home
3 providers with a 1-star rating by \$0.35 per hour for each child.

4 (iii) Increase the reimbursement rate for registered family home
5 providers with a 2-star rating by \$0.45 per hour for each child.

6 (iv) Increase the reimbursement rate for registered family home
7 providers with a 3-star rating by \$0.50 per hour for each child.

8 (v) Increase the reimbursement rate for registered family home
9 providers with a 4-star rating by \$0.70 per hour for each child.

10 (vi) Increase the reimbursement rate for registered family home
11 providers with a 5-star rating by \$0.80 per hour for each child.

12 (d) To increase the reimbursement rates for unlicensed
13 providers under the following guidelines:

14 (i) Increase the reimbursement rate for unlicensed providers
15 with a tier 1 rating by \$0.25 per hour for each child.

16 (ii) Increase the reimbursement rate for unlicensed providers
17 with a tier 2 rating by \$0.75 per hour for each child.

18 (2) The department shall ensure that the final provider
19 reimbursement rates determined under this section are published on
20 the department and great start to quality webpages by the date that
21 the new rates take effect.

22 (3) Under the child development and care public assistance
23 program, a child care center provider, a group home provider, or a
24 registered family home provider with an empty star rating shall not
25 be reimbursed at the same rate as or a greater rate than a child
26 care center provider, group home provider, or registered family
27 home provider with a star rating of 1 or higher.
