

# HOUSE BILL NO. 5324

January 09, 2020, Introduced by Reps. Filler, Wakeman and Elder and referred to the Committee on Families, Children, and Seniors.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled  
"Public health code,"  
by amending section 1106 (MCL 333.1106), as amended by 2014 PA 311.

**THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:**

1           Sec. 1106. (1) "Opioid antagonist" means naloxone  
2 hydrochloride or any other similarly acting and equally safe drug  
3 approved by the federal ~~food~~**Food** and ~~drug administration~~**Drug**  
4 **Administration** for the treatment of drug overdose.

5           (2) "Opioid-related overdose" means a condition, including,  
6 but not limited to, extreme physical illness, decreased level of



1 consciousness, respiratory depression, coma, or death, that results  
2 from the consumption or use of an opioid or another substance with  
3 which an opioid was combined or that a layperson would reasonably  
4 believe to be an opioid-related overdose that requires medical  
5 assistance.

6 (3) "Parentage registry" means the department's compilation of  
7 data concerning children's parentage, which data the department  
8 receives from any source, including, but not limited to, a copy of  
9 an order of filiation from the circuit court or an acknowledgment  
10 of paternity or parentage under this act, under section ~~2114~~**2117**  
11 of the estates and protected individuals code, 1998 PA 386, MCL  
12 ~~700.2114~~,**700.2117**, or under the acknowledgment of parentage act,  
13 1996 PA 305, MCL 722.1001 to 722.1013.

14 (4) "Person" means an individual, partnership, cooperative,  
15 association, private corporation, personal representative,  
16 receiver, trustee, assignee, or other legal entity. Person does not  
17 include a governmental entity unless specifically provided.

18 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect  
19 unless Senate Bill No. \_\_\_\_\_ or House Bill No. 5321 (request no.  
20 02835'19) of the 100th Legislature is enacted into law.
