HOUSE BILL NO. 5543

February 25, 2020, Introduced by Reps. Paquette, Bollin, Berman, LaGrand, Love and Kuppa and referred to the Committee on Elections and Ethics.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law,"

by amending section 759 (MCL 168.759), as amended by 2018 PA 603.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 759. (1) Subject Except as otherwise provided in this subsection and subsection (2) and subject to section 761(3), at any time during the 75 days before an election, a special election, a primary, or a special primary, but not later than 8 p.m. on the day

of an election, a special election, a primary, or a special 1 primary, an elector may apply for an absent voter ballot. The 2 elector shall apply in person or by mail with the clerk of the 3 township or city in which the elector is registered. The clerk of a 4 5 city or township shall not send by first-class mail an absent voter 6 ballot to an elector after 5 p.m. on the Friday immediately before 7 the election, special election, primary, or special primary. In addition, the clerk of a city or township shall not issue an absent 8 voter ballot to a registered elector in that city or township after 9 10 4 p.m. on the day before the election, special election, primary, 11 or special primary. An application received before a primary or special primary may be for either that primary or special primary 12 only, or for that primary or special primary and the election or 13 special election that follows. In addition, an application may be 14 15 used for all elections held during a calendar year, other than for 16 a presidential primary election. If the secretary of state provides 17 an absent voter ballot application that contains more election 18 options than an absent voter ballot application provided by a city 19 or township, and the absent voter ballot application otherwise 20 complies with the requirements of this section, the clerk of the 21 city or township shall honor the election options requested by an 22 elector who uses the absent voter ballot application provided by 23 the secretary of state. An individual may submit a voter registration application and an absent voter ballot application at 24 25 the same time if applying in person with the clerk or deputy clerk of the city or township in which the individual resides. 26 27 Immediately after his or her voter registration application and absent voter ballot application are approved by the clerk or deputy 28 29 clerk, the individual may, subject to the identification



requirement in section 761(6), complete an absent voter ballot at the clerk's office.

- (2) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (1) and subject Subject to section 761(3), at any time during the 75 days before an a presidential primary election, but not later than 8 p.m. on the day of an-a presidential primary election, an elector may apply for an absent voter ballot. The elector shall apply in person or by mail with the clerk of the township , or city , or village in which the voter is registered. The clerk of a city or township shall not send by first-class mail an absent voter ballot to an elector after 5 p.m. on the Friday immediately before the presidential primary election. In addition, the clerk of a city or township shall not issue an absent voter ballot to a registered elector in that city or township after 4 p.m. on the day before the presidential primary election. An application requested before a presidential primary election may only be used for that presidential primary election and may not be used for any other election held during the calendar year. An individual may submit a voter registration application and an absent voter ballot application at the same time if applying in person with the clerk or deputy clerk of the city or township in which the individual resides. Immediately after his or her voter registration application and absent voter ballot application are approved by the clerk, the individual may, subject to the identification requirement in section 761(6), complete an absent voter ballot at the clerk's office.
 - (3) An application for an absent voter ballot under this section may be made in any of the following ways:
 - (a) By a written request signed by the voter.

that purpose by the clerk of the city or township.

- (c) On an absent voter ballot application form provided for that purpose by the secretary of state.
 - (d) (c) On a federal postcard application.
- (4) An applicant for an absent voter ballot shall sign the application. A clerk or assistant clerk shall not deliver an absent voter ballot to an applicant who does not sign the application. A person shall not be in possession of a signed absent voter ballot application except for the applicant; a member of the applicant's immediate family; a person residing in the applicant's household; a person whose job normally includes the handling of mail, but only during the course of his or her employment; a registered elector requested by the applicant to return the application; or a clerk, assistant of the clerk, or other authorized election official. A registered elector who is requested by the applicant to return his or her absent voter ballot application shall sign the certificate on the absent voter ballot application.
- (5) The clerk of a city or township shall have absent voter ballot application forms available in the clerk's office at all times and shall furnish an absent voter ballot application form to anyone upon a verbal or written request. The absent voter ballot application for an election, special election, primary election, or special primary election, other than a presidential primary election, must be in substantially the following form:

- (6) The absent voter ballot application for a presidential primary election must be in substantially the form provided in subsection (5) except that the application must comply with section 759c and must only be used for that presidential primary election and not for any other election, special election, primary election, or special primary election.
- (7) (6) The following instructions for an applicant for an absent voter ballot must be included with each application furnished an applicant:

INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLICANTS FOR ABSENT VOTER BALLOTS

- Step 1. After completely filling out the application, sign and date the application in the place designated. Your signature must appear on the application or you will not receive an absent voter ballot.
- Step 2. Deliver the application by 1 of the following methods:
 - (a) Place the application in an envelope addressed to the appropriate clerk and place the necessary postage upon the return envelope and deposit it in the United States mail or with another public postal service, express mail service, parcel post service, or common carrier.
 - (b) Deliver the application personally to the clerk's office,



to the clerk, or to an authorized assistant of the clerk.

- (c) In either (a) or (b), a member of the immediate family of the voter including a father-in-law, mother-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, grandparent, or grandchild or a person residing in the voter's household may mail or deliver the application to the clerk for the applicant.
- (d) If an applicant cannot return the application in any of the above methods, the applicant may select any registered elector to return the application. The person returning the application must sign and return the certificate at the bottom of the application.
- (7) A person who prints and distributes absent voter ballot applications shall print on the application the warning, certificate of authorized registered elector returning absent voter ballot application, and instructions required by this section.
- (8) A person who makes a false statement in an absent voter ballot application is guilty of a misdemeanor. A person who forges a signature on an absent voter ballot application is guilty of a felony. A person who is not authorized in this act and who both distributes absent voter ballot applications to absent voters and returns those absent voter ballot applications to a clerk or assistant of the clerk is guilty of a misdemeanor.
- (9) A person who prints and distributes absent voter ballot applications shall print on the application the warning, certificate of authorized registered elector returning absent voter ballot application, and instructions required by this section.
