by amending section 491 (MCL 750.491), as amended by 2017 PA 182.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 491. (1) All official books, papers, or records created
- 2 by or received in any office or agency of this state or its
- 3 political subdivisions are public property belonging to the people
- 4 of this state. All such books, papers, or records shall must be
- 5 disposed of only as provided in section 11 of the Michigan history
- 6 center act, 2016 PA 470, MCL 399.811, section 2a of the records

- 4 (2) A person shall not willfully carry away, mutilate, or

- 8 or parts of those books, papers, or records and refuse to deliver
- 9 up those books, papers, records, or parts of those books, papers,
- 10 or records to the proper officer having charge of the office to
- 11 which those books, papers, or records belong upon demand being made
