## **HOUSE BILL NO. 6043**

August 06, 2020, Introduced by Rep. Elder and referred to the Committee on Military, Veterans and Homeland Security.

A bill to amend 1899 PA 214, entitled

"An act to provide relief outside of the soldiers' home for honorably discharged indigent soldiers, sailors, marines, nurses and members of women's auxiliaries and the indigent wives, widows and minor children of such indigent or deceased soldiers, sailors, marines, nurses and members of women's auxiliaries, and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts,"

by amending the title and sections 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 (MCL 35.21, 35.22, 35.23, 35.24, and 35.25), section 1 as amended by 2016 PA 218 and section 2 as amended by 2016 PA 208, and by adding sections 9 and 10; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.





## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

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An act to provide relief outside of the soldiers' home for to
honorably discharged indigent soldiers, sailors, marines, nurses

veterans and members of women's auxiliaries and the indigent wives,

spouses, widows or widowers, and minor children, and parents of

such those indigent or deceased soldiers, sailors, marines, nurses

veterans and members of women's auxiliaries, auxiliaries; to

provide for the powers and duties of certain governmental officers

and entities; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts.

- Sec. 1. (1) The county board of commissioners of each county shall annually levy a tax, not exceeding 1/10 of a mill on each dollar, to be levied and collected as provided by law, upon the taxable property of each township and city, for their respective counties, for the purpose of creating a soldiers' relief fund for the aid and relief of honorably discharged indigent members of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, veterans and members of women's auxiliaries, and the indigent spouses, widows or widowers, minor children, and parents of each those indigent or deceased member veterans or members of women's auxiliaries, who served during a period of war as described in 38 CFR 3.2, except that for purposes of this section, "period of war" for the Vietnam era means the following:
- (a) February 28, 1961 through May 7, 1975 for a veteran who served during that period.
- (b) On or after January 31, 1955 in an area of hazardous duty
  for which the veteran received an Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal
  or Vietnam Service Medal.
  - (2) Funds—In addition to the use described in subsection (1),



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- 1 funds raised in accordance with this section may be expended for
- 2 the aid and relief of indigent wives spouses and children of active
- 3 duty soldiers, sailors, marines, airmen, coast guardsmen, nurses,
- 4 and members of the women's auxiliaries members of the Armed Forces

- 16 (5) If any money in the fund is not necessary for the purpose
- 17 for which it was raised, the money shall remain in the treasury of
- 18 the county as a soldiers' relief fund, and shall be considered in
- 19 raising future sums for this that purpose.
- Sec. 2. (1) The **chief** judge of **the** probate <del>in</del> court for each

- (2) On the first Monday in October in of each year, the soldiers' relief commission shall proceed to determine the amount necessary for providing aid and relief to be granted such persons to individuals entitled to that aid and relief under this act, which as identified under subsection (1). The amount determined shall be then and there recorded in the books to be kept records maintained by the secretary of said soldiers' relief the commission. The commission may determine not only the sum to be paid, but the manner of paying the same, and or providing the aid and relief determined under this subsection.
  - (3) The commission may discontinue the payment or provision of such aid and relief under this act in their its discretion. Appeal An individual may be taken therefrom appeal by certiorari a decision by the commission to discontinue aid or relief to that individual to the circuit court of such county, by certiorari the county where he or she resides by filing an application therefor with the clerk within not more than 15 days following after the making of such decision. commission notifies the individual of its decision. - 22 Sec. 9. An individual is considered to be indigent under this
- 23 act if he or she is experiencing a substantial financial hardship.
- 24 Substantial financial hardship is rebuttably presumed if the
- 25 individual receives personal public assistance, including under a
- 26 food assistance program, temporary assistance for needy families,
- 27 Medicaid, or disability insurance, resides in public housing, earns
- 28 an income less than 140% of the federal poverty guideline, or is
- 29 unemployed. An individual is also rebuttably presumed to have a



- 1 substantial financial hardship if he or she is currently serving a
- 2 sentence in a correctional institution or is receiving residential
- 3 treatment in a mental health or substance abuse facility.
- 4 Sec. 10. As used in this act:
- 5 (a) "Aid and relief" includes, but is not limited to, cash
- 6 assistance and services provided to, or supported on behalf of, an
- 7 individual entitled to aid and relief under this act, such as
- 8 providing for transportation to a veterans' or nonveteran hospital,
- 9 a health facility or clinic, or job training.
- 10 (b) "Armed forces" means the United States Army, Navy, Marine
- 11 Corps, Air Force, and Coast Guard, including the reserve
- 12 components.
- (c) "Indigent" means meeting 1 or more of the conditions
- 14 described in section 9.
  - (d) "Reserve components" means all of the following:
- 16 (i) The Army National Guard of the United States.
- 17 (ii) The army, naval, marine corps, air force, and coast guard
- 18 reserves.

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- 19 (iii) The Air National Guard of the United States.
- 20 (e) "Soldiers' relief commission" or "commission" means a
- 21 county soldiers' relief commission appointed under section 2.
- 22 (f) "Soldiers' relief fund" or "fund" means the soldiers'
- 23 relief fund described in section 1.
- 24 (g) "Veteran" means an individual who is a veteran as that
- 25 term is defined in section 1 of 1965 PA 190, MCL 35.61, and was
- 26 honorably discharged. Veteran includes individuals honorably
- 27 discharged who served in any of the nurse corps of the armed forces
- 28 regardless of the military status of that corps prior to becoming a
- 29 fully recognized branch of the regular armed forces.



- 1 (h) "Women's auxiliary" means any women's military unit that
  2 served with the armed forces prior to becoming a fully recognized
  3 branch of the regular armed forces including, but not limited to,
  4 the Women's Auxiliary Army Corps.
