## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 10

Reps. Filler and LaGrand offered the following concurrent  
resolution:

1 A concurrent resolution to approve the State Officers  
2 Compensation Commission determinations.

3 Whereas, Pursuant to the provisions of Article IV, Section 12  
4 of the *Constitution of the State of Michigan of 1963*, the State  
5 Officers Compensation Commission is responsible for making  
6 determinations regarding the salaries and expense allowances of the  
7 members of the Legislature, the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor,  
8 the Attorney General, the Secretary of State, and the Justices of  
9 the Supreme Court; and

10 Whereas, The State Officers Compensation Commission met on  
11 April 16, 2019, and May 30, 2019, to determine the salaries and  
12 expense allowances for the members of the Legislature, the



1 Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the Attorney General, the  
2 Secretary of State, and the Justices of the Supreme Court; and

3       Whereas, The State Officers Compensation Commission has  
4 concluded its proceedings and on May 30, 2019, made its  
5 determinations that the Justices of the Supreme Court should  
6 receive a 5 percent salary increase in both 2021 and 2022. The  
7 commission recommended that salaries and expense allowances for the  
8 members of the Legislature, the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor,  
9 the Attorney General, and the Secretary of State should not be  
10 changed; and

11       Whereas, On May 30, 2019, the Legislature received the  
12 determinations of the State Officers Compensation Commission; and

13       Whereas, The determinations of the State Officers Compensation  
14 Commission shall be the salaries and expense allowances only if the  
15 Legislature approves them by concurrent resolution adopted by a  
16 majority of the members elected to and serving in each house. If  
17 the salary and expense determinations are approved, the salary and  
18 expense determinations shall become effective for the legislative  
19 session immediately following the next general election, which will  
20 commence January 1, 2021; now, therefore, be it

21       Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate  
22 concurring), That, pursuant to Article IV, Section 12 of the  
23 *Constitution of the State of Michigan of 1963* and MCL 15.217, we  
24 hereby approve the determinations of the State Officers  
25 Compensation Commission that the Justices of the Supreme Court  
26 receive a 5 percent salary increase in both 2021 and 2022, and the  
27 salaries and expense allowances for the members of the Legislature,  
28 the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the Attorney General, and  
29 the Secretary of State not be changed; and be it further

3   Technology, Management and Budget.
