## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO.30

Reps. Miller, Leutheuser and Coleman offered the following concurrent resolution:

1       A concurrent resolution relative to secondary road patrol  
2 funds for counties providing road patrol services to cities and  
3 villages.

4       Whereas, Section 77 of 1846 RS 14, MCL 51.77, provides funding  
5 for county secondary road patrol services pursuant to an agreement  
6 with the Office of Criminal Justice, which, pursuant to Executive  
7 Order No. 1989 - 4, is now the Office of Highway Safety Planning  
8 within the Department of State Police. An agreement also provides a  
9 maintenance of law enforcement effort standard for counties  
10 providing these secondary road patrol services, unless it is  
11 recognized that the reduction was due to cuts in general services  
12 due to economic conditions; and

13       Whereas, Section 76 of 1846 RS 14, MCL 51.76, permits road



1 patrol services to be provided by county sheriff departments to  
2 cities and villages. This section also provides that a road patrol  
3 agreement is void if the city or village reduces the number of  
4 sworn law enforcement officers below the highest number employed at  
5 any time within the immediately preceding 36 months, unless the  
6 Michigan Legislature, by concurrent resolution, recognizes that the  
7 reduction was due to cuts in general services due to economic  
8 conditions; and

9       Whereas, Section 77 of 1846 RS 14, MCL 51.77, provides a  
10 formula for funding county secondary road patrol services. This  
11 formula permits road patrol services provided by county sheriff  
12 departments to cities and villages to be eligible for secondary  
13 road patrol funding as long as the city or village complies with  
14 the MCL 51.76 law enforcement maintenance of effort requirement,  
15 unless any reduction is recognized to be due to cuts in general  
16 services due to economic conditions; and

17       Whereas, In all of Michigan's counties, cities, and villages,  
18 general services have been reduced as a result of serious economic  
19 difficulties. These reductions in services have occurred in direct  
20 reaction to economic conditions; now, therefore, be it

21       Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate  
22 concurring), That, for Fiscal Year 2021, counties, cities, and  
23 villages in Michigan have been required to reduce general services  
24 because of economic conditions and are not reducing law enforcement  
25 services as stipulated in Section 76 or 77 of 1846 RS 14; and be it  
26 further

27       Resolved, That counties, cities, and villages have met the  
28 necessary terms of their agreements for road patrol services and  
29 secondary road patrol funding as they relate to maintenance of
