SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 172

1	A resolution to declare October 2019 as Domestic Violence
2	Awareness Month in the state of Michigan.
3	Whereas, According to the National Coalition Against Domestic
4	Violence (NCADV), Domestic Violence Awareness Month was launched
5	nationwide in October 1981 as a way to connect and unite
6	individuals and organizations working on domestic violence issues
7	and raise awareness for those issues; and
8	Whereas, NCADV defines domestic violence as the willful
9	intimidation, physical assault, battery, sexual assault, and/or
10	other abusive behavior as part of a systematic pattern of power and
11	control perpetrated by one intimate partner against another. It
12	includes physical violence, sexual violence, psychological

1 violence, and emotional abuse; and Whereas, Domestic violence impacts individuals in every 2 3 community of our state, regardless of age, economic status, sexual orientation, gender, race, religion, or nationality; and 4 5 Whereas, Perpetrators of domestic violence intentionally 6 engage in a pattern of behavior to exert coercive control in 7 intimate partner relationships, violating the fundamental human 8 rights of those they abuse; and 9 Whereas, The Michigan Coalition to End Domestic & Sexual 10 Violence (MCEDSV) documented for the 2018 NNEDV National Census of 11 Domestic Violence Services that MCEDSV member programs provided counseling, advocacy, shelter, and/or other forms of support for 12 over 2,649 survivors during the 24-hour survey period, while 13 14 additionally providing education and training for over 319 15 individual community members across our state; and 16 Whereas, While throughout the last three decades, much 17 progress has been made to support domestic violence victims and 18 survivors and to hold abusers accountable, continued awareness, 19 education, and action are crucial to intervention in and prevention 20 of domestic violence; and Whereas, We must work together to educate our entire 21 22 population about what can be done to prevent domestic violence, 23 hold perpetrators accountable, support the individual and unique needs of survivors, and ensure that survivors are not re-24 25 victimized; now, therefore, be it Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of 26 27 this legislative body declare October 2019 as Domestic Violence 28 Awareness Month in the state of Michigan. We strongly support the 29 efforts of national, state, and local partners, and every citizen
