## ENROLLED SENATE BILL No. 259

AN ACT to amend 1961 PA 236, entitled "An act to revise and consolidate the statutes relating to the organization and jurisdiction of the courts of this state; the powers and duties of the courts, and of the judges and other officers of the courts; the forms and attributes of civil claims and actions; the time within which civil actions and proceedings may be brought in the courts; pleading, evidence, practice, and procedure in civil and criminal actions and proceedings in the courts; to provide for the powers and duties of certain state governmental officers and entities; to provide remedies and penalties for the violation of certain provisions of this act; to repeal all acts and parts of acts inconsistent with or contravening any of the provisions of this act; and to repeal acts and parts of acts," by amending section 1461 (MCL 600.1461); and to repeal acts and parts ofacts.

## The People of the State of Michigan enact:

Sec. 1461. As used in this act, "newspaper", with respect to the publication of a notice, means that term as defined in section 1 of 1963 PA 247, MCL 691.1051, with the required area being the county in which the court is located, unless a different required area is designated in this act.

Enacting section 1. Section 1950 of revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.1950, is repealed.

Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect unless Senate Bill No. 258 of the 101st Legislature is enacted into law.

This act is ordered to take immediate effect.
