> SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4332

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending section 81116 (MCL 324.81116), as amended by 2017 PA 199.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 81116. (1) The owner of an ORV requiring licensure under 1 2 this part shall file an application for a license with the department or a dealer on forms provided by the department. If an 3 ORV is sold by a dealer, the application for a license shall be 4 submitted to the department by the dealer in the name of the owner. 5 6 The application shall include a certification. The owner of the vehicle shall sign the application or, if the application is filed 7 electronically, provide information requested by the department to 8

verify the owner's identity. The application shall be accompanied 1 by a fee as provided in subsection (2). A person shall not file an 2 application for a license that contains false information. Upon 3 receipt of the application in approved form and upon payment of the 4 5 appropriate fee, the department or dealer shall issue to the 6 applicant a license. A license shall be issued and is valid for the 7 12-month period beginning April 1 and ending the following March 8 31. each year.

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(2) The fee for a license is as follows:

10 (a) Except as provided in subdivision (c), if the license does11 not authorize operation of the ORV on state ORV trails, \$26.25.

12 (b) Except as provided in subdivision (c), if the license13 authorizes operation of the ORV on state ORV trails, \$36.25.

14 (c) For a license valid for a 12-month period beginning April15 1, 2024 or a subsequent April 1, no fee.

16 (3) Dealers A dealer may purchase from the department ORV licenses for resale to owners of vehicles requiring licensure under 17 18 this part. The department shall refund to dealers a dealer the purchase price of any ORV licenses returned within 90 days after 19 20 the end of the 12-month period for which they were valid. A dealer shall maintain and provide to the department records of ORV license 21 sales on forms provided by the department. In addition to the sale 22 23 of ORV licenses, a dealer engaged in the sale, lease, or rental of ORVs as a regular business may sell any other license or permit 24 25 authorized by the department to be sold by other dealers under the statutes of this state. 26

27 (4) Before a vehicle requiring an ORV license is operated, the
28 owner shall ensure that a license is permanently attached to the
29 vehicle in the manner prescribed by and, subject to this

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subsection, in the location designated by the department. The
license for a 2-wheel vehicle shall be attached as provided in
either of the following:

4 (a) Centered on the exposed surface of the rear fender.
5 (b) Located at a visible place facing forward on a front
6 suspension fork.

7 (5) If, at the time of sale when a vehicle otherwise requiring 8 a license under this part is sold, the purchaser certifies on a 9 form provided by the department that the purchased vehicle 10 otherwise requiring a license under this part vehicle will be used 11 and stored outside of this state and will not be returned by the purchaser to this state for use, then a license is not required for 12 13 the vehicle. 14 (6) If a license acquired by the owner of an ORV is lost or

14 (6) If a ficense acquired by the owner of an okv is fost of 15 destroyed, the department shall provide that person with a 16 replacement license free of charge. The department may require a 17 person requesting a replacement license to supply sufficient 18 evidence of the loss or destruction of the original license.
