HOUSE BILL NO. 5115

June 23, 2021, Introduced by Reps. Yaroch, Markkanen and Allor and referred to the Committee on Workforce, Trades, and Talent.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled

"Public health code,"

by amending section 20950 (MCL 333.20950), as amended by 2021 PA 25.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 20950. (1) An individual shall not practice or advertise
 to practice as a medical first responder, emergency medical
 technician, emergency medical technician specialist, paramedic, or
 emergency medical services instructor-coordinator unless the

1 individual is licensed by the department under this section.

2 (2) The department shall issue a license under this section3 only to an individual who meets all of the following requirements:

4 (a) Is If applying for a medical first responder license, is
5 16 years of age or older. If applying for an emergency medical
6 technician, emergency medical technician specialist, paramedic, or
7 emergency medical services instructor-coordinator license, is 18
8 years of age or older.

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(b) Meets either of the following requirements:

10 (i) Has successfully completed the appropriate education11 program approved under section 20912.

12 (ii) While serving as a member of the armed forces, served as a 13 military health care specialist and was separated from service with 14 an honorable character of service or under an honorable conditions 15 (general) character of service in the 2-year period preceding the 16 date the license application is filed. The applicant shall provide 17 a form DD214, form DD215, or any other form that is satisfactory to the department to meet the criteria established in this 18 19 subparagraph. This subparagraph only applies to an applicant for a 20 license as an emergency medical technician.

(c) Subject to subsection (3), has attained a passing score onthe appropriate department prescribed examination, as follows:

(i) A medical first responder must pass the written examination
proctored by the department or the department's designee and a
practical examination approved by the department. The instructors
of the medical first responder course shall administer the
practical examination. The department or the department's designee
may also proctor the practical examination. The individual shall
pay the fee for the written examination required under this

subparagraph directly to the National Registry of Emergency Medical 1 2 Technicians or other organization approved by the department.

(*ii*) An emergency medical technician, emergency medical 3 4 technician specialist, or paramedic must pass the written 5 examination proctored by the department or the department's designee and a practical examination proctored by the department or 6 7 the department's designee. The individual shall pay the fee for the 8 written examination required under this subparagraph directly to 9 the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians or other 10 organization approved by the department.

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(d) Meets other requirements of this part.

12 (3) The department shall require for purposes of compliance 13 with subsection (2)(c) successful passage by each first-time 14 applicant of an examination.

15 (4) The department shall issue a license as an emergency 16 medical services instructor-coordinator only to an individual who 17 meets the requirements of subsection (2) for an emergency medical 18 services instructor-coordinator and at the time of application is 19 currently licensed as a medical first responder, emergency medical 20 technician, emergency medical technician specialist, or paramedic 21 and has at least 3 years' field experience with a licensed life 22 support agency as a medical first responder, emergency medical 23 technician, emergency medical technician specialist, or paramedic. 24 The department shall provide for the development and administration 25 of an examination for emergency medical services instructor-26 coordinators. The license must specify the level of instruction-27 coordination the individual is licensed to provide. An emergency 28 medical services instructor-coordinator shall not instruct or coordinate emergency medical training courses at a level that 29

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exceeds his or her designated level of licensure and for which he
 or she does not have at least 3 years' field experience at that
 level of licensure.

4 (5) Except as otherwise provided in section 20952, a license
5 under this section is effective for 3 years from the date of
6 issuance unless revoked or suspended by the department.

7 (6) Except as otherwise provided in this section, an applicant
8 for licensure under this section shall pay the following triennial
9 licensure fees:

10 (a) Medical first responder - no fee.

11 (b) Emergency medical technician - \$40.00.

12 (c) Emergency medical technician specialist - \$60.00.

13 (d) Paramedic - \$80.00.

14 (e) Emergency medical services instructor-coordinator -

15 \$100.00.

16 (7) If a life support agency certifies to the department that an applicant for licensure under this section will act as a 17 18 volunteer and if the life support agency does not charge for its 19 services, the department shall not require the applicant to pay the 20 fee required under subsection (6). If the applicant ceases to meet the definition of a volunteer under this part at any time during 21 22 the effective period of his or her license and is employed as a 23 licensee under this part, the applicant shall at that time pay the 24 fee required under subsection (6).

(8) The department shall waive the fee required under subsection (6) for the initial license if the applicant for initial licensure was separated from service with an honorable character of service or under honorable conditions (general) character of service in the armed forces. The applicant shall provide a form

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DD214, form DD215, or any other form that is satisfactory to the
 department to be eligible for the waiver of the fee under this
 subsection.

4 (9) As used in this section, "armed forces" means that term as5 defined in section 16103.
