

HOUSE BILL NO. 5887

March 08, 2022, Introduced by Reps. Bollin, Maddock, Steenland, Alexander, Lightner and LaFave and referred to the Committee on Elections and Ethics.

A bill to amend 1972 PA 222, entitled

"An act to provide for an official personal identification card; to provide for its form, issuance and use; to regulate the use and disclosure of information obtained from the card; to prescribe the powers and duties of the secretary of state; to prescribe fees; to prescribe certain penalties for violations; and to provide an appropriation for certain purposes,"

by amending sections 1 and 2 (MCL 28.291 and 28.292), section 1 as amended by 2021 PA 105 and section 2 as amended by 2021 PA 73.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 1. (1) An individual who is a resident of this state may
2 apply to the secretary of state for an official state personal
3 identification card. Upon application, the applicant shall supply a
4 photographic identity document, a birth certificate or other
5 nonphotographic identity document, and other sufficient documents
6 as the secretary of state may require to verify the identity and
7 citizenship of the applicant. If an applicant for an official state
8 personal identification card is not a citizen of the United States,
9 the applicant shall supply a photographic identity document and
10 other sufficient documents to verify the identity of the applicant
11 and the applicant's legal presence in the United States under
12 subsection (5). The documents required under this subsection must
13 include the applicant's full legal name, date of birth, address,
14 and residency and demonstrate that the applicant is a citizen of
15 the United States or is legally present in the United States. If
16 the applicant's full legal name differs from the name of the
17 applicant that appears on a document presented under this
18 subsection, the applicant shall present documents to verify his or
19 her current full legal name. An application for an official state
20 personal identification card must be made in a manner prescribed by
21 the secretary of state and must contain the applicant's full legal
22 name, date of birth, residence address, height, sex, eye color,
23 signature, intent to be an organ donor, other information required
24 or permitted on the official state personal identification card
25 and, only to the extent to comply with federal law, the applicant's
26 Social Security number. **Beginning on the effective date of the**
27 **amendatory act that added this sentence, the secretary of state**
28 **shall capture or reproduce the applicant's digital photographic**
29 **image for a renewal or duplicate official state personal**

1 identification card. The digital photographic image captured or
2 reproduced for a renewal or duplicate official state personal
3 identification card must be used to replace the digital
4 photographic image captured or reproduced when the application for
5 an official state personal identification card is made and be
6 uploaded to the qualified voter file as required under section 509q
7 of the Michigan election law, 1954 PA 116, MCL 168.509q. The
8 applicant may provide a mailing address if the applicant receives
9 mail at an address different from his or her residence address.
10 Beginning June 27, 2021, if the applicant is a program participant
11 in the address confidentiality program under the address
12 confidentiality program act, 2020 PA 301, MCL 780.851 to 780.873,
13 he or she shall present to the secretary of state his or her
14 participation card issued under the address confidentiality program
15 act, 2020 PA 301, MCL 780.851 to 780.873. For automatic voter
16 registration purposes under section 493a of the Michigan election
17 law, 1954 PA 116, MCL 168.493a, an applicant for an official state
18 personal identification card must indicate on the application or
19 change of address application whether he or she is a citizen of the
20 United States. An application must allow the applicant to indicate
21 that the applicant declines to use the application as a voter
22 registration application.

23 (2) The secretary of state shall accept as 1 of the
24 identification documents required under subsection (1) an
25 identification card issued by the department of corrections to
26 prisoners who are placed on parole or released from a correctional
27 facility, containing the prisoner's legal name, photograph, and
28 other information identifying the prisoner as provided in section
29 37(4) of the corrections code of 1953, 1953 PA 232, MCL 791.237.

1 (3) The secretary of state shall have electronic access to
2 prisoner information maintained by the department of corrections
3 for the purpose of verifying the identity of a prisoner who applies
4 for an official state identification card under subsection (1).

5 (4) The secretary of state shall not issue an official state
6 personal identification card to an individual who holds an
7 operator's or chauffeur's license issued under the Michigan vehicle
8 code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923, unless the license has
9 been suspended, revoked, or restricted.

10 (5) If the applicant is not a citizen of the United States,
11 the applicant shall provide, and the department shall verify,
12 documents demonstrating his or her legal presence in the United
13 States. Nothing in this act obligates this state to comply with
14 title II of the real ID act of 2005, Public Law 109-13. The
15 secretary of state may adopt rules under the administrative
16 procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328, as are
17 necessary for the administration of this subsection. A
18 determination by the secretary of state that an applicant is not
19 legally present in the United States may be appealed under section
20 631 of the revised judiciary act of 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL
21 600.631. The secretary of state shall not issue an official state
22 personal identification card to an applicant described in this
23 subsection for a term that exceeds the duration of the applicant's
24 legal presence in the United States.

25 (6) The secretary of state shall not disclose a Social
26 Security number obtained under subsection (1) to another person
27 except for use for 1 or more of the following purposes:

28 (a) Compliance with 49 USC 31301 to 31317 and regulations and
29 rules related to this act.

1 (b) To carry out the purposes of section 466(a) of the social
2 security act, 42 USC 666, in connection with matters relating to
3 paternity, child support, or overdue child support.

4 (c) To the department of health and human services, for
5 comparison with vital records maintained by the department of
6 health and human services under part 28 of the public health code,
7 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.2801 to 333.2899.

8 (d) As otherwise required by law.

9 (7) The secretary of state shall not display an individual's
10 Social Security number **or any part of an individual's Social**
11 **Security number** on the individual's official state personal
12 identification card.

13 (8) A requirement under this section to include a Social
14 Security number on an application does not apply to an applicant
15 who demonstrates that he or she is exempt under law from obtaining
16 a Social Security number.

17 (9) The secretary of state, with the approval of the state
18 administrative board created under 1921 PA 2, MCL 17.1 to 17.3, may
19 enter into agreements with the United States government to verify
20 whether an applicant for an official state personal identification
21 card under this section who is not a citizen of the United States
22 is authorized under federal law to be present in the United States.

23 (10) The secretary of state shall not issue an official state
24 personal identification card to an individual holding an official
25 state personal identification card issued by another state without
26 confirmation that the individual is terminating or has terminated
27 the official state personal identification card issued by the other
28 state.

29 (11) The secretary of state shall do all of the following:

1 (a) Ensure the physical security of locations where official
2 state personal identification cards are produced and the security
3 of document materials and papers from which official state personal
4 identification cards are produced.

5 (b) Subject each person authorized to manufacture or produce
6 official state personal identification cards and each person who
7 has the ability to affect the identity information that appears on
8 official state personal identification cards to appropriate
9 security clearance requirements. The security requirements of this
10 subdivision and subdivision (a) may require that official state
11 personal identification cards be manufactured or produced in this
12 state.

13 (c) Provide fraudulent document recognition programs to
14 secretary of state employees engaged in the issuance of official
15 state personal identification cards.

16 (12) If an individual meets the requirements under subsection
17 (13), beginning July 1, 2021, the secretary of state shall allow
18 the individual to elect a communication impediment designation on
19 the application maintained in the central file under section 7 or
20 in another appropriate system that limits access to a person
21 allowed access to public record information by the criminal justice
22 information policy council under the C.J.I.S. policy council act,
23 1974 PA 163, MCL 28.211 to 28.215, and that allows a person with
24 access to view a communication impediment designation with an
25 official state personal identification card.

26 (13) An individual seeking an election for a communication
27 impediment designation under subsection (12) shall provide the
28 secretary of state a certification that meets all of the following:

29 (a) Is signed by a physician, physician assistant, certified

1 nurse practitioner, audiologist, speech-language pathologist,
2 psychologist, or physical therapist licensed to practice in this
3 state.

4 (b) Identifies the individual for whom the communication
5 impediment designation is being elected.

6 (c) Attests to the nature of the health condition that may
7 impede communication.

8 (14) The secretary of state shall not display an individual's
9 communication impediment designation on the individual's official
10 state personal identification card.

11 (15) A person who intentionally makes a false statement of
12 material fact or commits or attempts to commit a deception or fraud
13 on a statement described under subsection (13) is guilty of a
14 misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 30 days or
15 a fine of not more than \$500.00, or both.

16 (16) Subject to subsection (17), the secretary of state may
17 cancel or revoke a communication impediment designation elected and
18 maintained under this section if either of the following
19 circumstances applies:

20 (a) The secretary of state determines that a communication
21 impediment designation was fraudulently or erroneously elected.

22 (b) The secretary of state determines the communication
23 impediment designation was abused during a traffic stop.

24 (17) The secretary of state shall provide an individual notice
25 and an opportunity to be heard before canceling or revoking a
26 communication impediment designation under subsection (16).

27 (18) As used in this section, "communication impediment" means
28 an individual has a health condition that may impede communication
29 with a police officer, including, but not limited to, any of the

1 following:

2 (a) Deafness or hearing loss.

3 (b) An autism spectrum disorder.

4 Sec. 2. (1) An official state personal identification card
5 must contain the following:

6 (a) An identification number permanently assigned to the
7 individual to whom the card is issued.

8 (b) Except as provided in section 2a, the full legal name,
9 date of birth, sex, residence address, height, weight, eye color,
10 digital photographic image, signature of or verification and
11 certification by the applicant, as determined by the secretary of
12 state, and expiration date of the official state personal
13 identification card. If an official state personal identification
14 card is issued to an individual described in section 1(5) who has
15 temporary lawful status, the official state personal identification
16 card must be issued in compliance with 6 CFR 37.21 or in compliance
17 with the process established to comply with 6 CFR 37.71 by the
18 secretary of state. As used in this subdivision, "temporary lawful
19 status" means that term as defined in 6 CFR 37.3.

20 (c) An indication that the identification card contains 1 or
21 more of the following:

22 (i) The blood type of the individual.

23 (ii) Immunization data of the individual.

24 (iii) Medication data of the individual.

25 (iv) A statement that the individual is deaf.

26 (d) In the case of a holder of an official state personal
27 identification card who has indicated his or her wish to
28 participate in the anatomical gift donor registry under part 101 of
29 the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, a

1 heart insignia on the front of the official state personal
2 identification card.

3 (e) If requested by an individual who is a veteran, ~~as that~~
4 ~~term is defined in section 1 of 1965 PA 190, MCL 35.61,~~ a
5 designation that the individual is a veteran. The designation must
6 be in a style and format considered appropriate by the secretary of
7 state. The secretary of state shall require proof of discharge or
8 separation of service from the armed forces of this state, another
9 state, or the United States, and the nature of that discharge, for
10 the purposes of verifying an individual's status as a veteran under
11 this subdivision. The secretary of state shall consult with the
12 department of military and veterans affairs in determining the
13 proof that must be required to identify an individual's status as a
14 veteran for the purposes of this subsection. The secretary of state
15 may provide the department of military and veterans affairs and
16 agencies of the counties of this state that provide veteran
17 services with information provided by an applicant under this
18 subsection for the purpose of veterans' benefits eligibility
19 referral.

20 (f) Physical security features designed to prevent tampering,
21 counterfeiting, or duplication of the official state personal
22 identification card for fraudulent purposes.

23 (2) In conjunction with the application for an official state
24 personal identification card, the secretary of state shall do all
25 of the following:

26 (a) Provide the applicant with all of the following:

27 (i) Information explaining the applicant's right to make an
28 anatomical gift in the event of death under part 101 of the public
29 health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, and in

1 accordance with this section.

2 (ii) Information describing the donor registry program
3 maintained by Michigan's federally designated organ procurement
4 organization or its successor organization under section 10120 of
5 the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120. The information
6 required under this subparagraph must include the address and
7 telephone number of Michigan's federally designated organ
8 procurement organization or its successor organization as described
9 in section 10120 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL
10 333.10120.

11 (iii) Information giving the applicant the opportunity to have
12 his or her name placed on the registry described in subparagraph
13 (ii).

14 (b) Provide the applicant with the opportunity to specify on
15 his or her official state personal identification card that he or
16 she is willing to make an anatomical gift in the event of death
17 under part 101 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL
18 333.10101 to 333.10123, and in accordance with this section.

19 (c) Inform the applicant that, if he or she indicates to the
20 secretary of state under this section a willingness to have his or
21 her name placed on the donor registry described in subdivision
22 (a)(ii), the secretary of state will mark the applicant's record for
23 the donor registry.

24 (3) The secretary of state may fulfill the requirements of
25 subsection (2) by 1 or more of the following methods:

26 (a) Providing printed material enclosed with a mailed notice
27 for the issuance or renewal of an official state personal
28 identification card.

29 (b) Providing printed material to an applicant who personally

1 appears at a secretary of state branch office.

2 (c) Through electronic information transmittals for
3 applications processed by electronic means.

4 (4) The secretary of state shall prescribe the form of the
5 official state personal identification card. The secretary of state
6 shall designate a space on the official state personal
7 identification card where the applicant may place a sticker or
8 decal of a uniform size as the secretary may specify to indicate
9 that the cardholder carries a separate emergency medical
10 information card. The sticker or decal may be provided by any
11 person, hospital, school, medical group, or association interested
12 in assisting in implementing the emergency medical information
13 card, but must meet the specifications of the secretary of state.
14 The sticker or decal also may be used to indicate that the
15 cardholder has designated 1 or more patient advocates in accordance
16 with section 5506 of the estates and protected individuals code,
17 1998 PA 386, MCL 700.5506. The emergency medical information card,
18 carried separately by the cardholder, may contain the information
19 described in subsection (2)(c), information concerning the
20 cardholder's patient advocate designation, other emergency medical
21 information, or an indication as to where the cardholder has stored
22 or registered emergency medical information. An original official
23 state personal identification card or the renewal of an existing
24 official state personal identification card issued to an individual
25 less than 21 years of age must be portrait or vertical in form, and
26 an official state personal identification card issued to an
27 individual 21 years of age or over must be landscape or horizontal
28 in form. Except as otherwise required in this act, other
29 information required on the official state personal identification

1 card under this act may appear on the official state personal
2 identification card in a form prescribed by the secretary of state.

3 (5) The official state personal identification card must not
4 contain a fingerprint or finger image of the applicant.

5 (6) Except as provided in this subsection, the secretary of
6 state shall retain and use an individual's digital photographic
7 image and signature described in subsection (1)(b) only for
8 programs administered by the secretary of state as specifically
9 authorized by law. An individual's digital photographic image or
10 signature must only be used as follows:

11 (a) By a federal, state, or local governmental agency for a
12 law enforcement purpose authorized by law.

13 (b) By the secretary of state for a use specifically
14 authorized by law.

15 (c) By the secretary of state for forwarding to the department
16 of state police the images of individuals required to be registered
17 under the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.721
18 to 28.730, upon the department of state police providing the
19 secretary of state an updated list of those individuals.

20 (d) By the secretary of state for forwarding to the department
21 of state police a digitized photograph taken of the applicant for
22 an official state personal identification card for use as provided
23 in section 5c of 1927 PA 372, MCL 28.425c.

24 (e) By the secretary of state for forwarding to the department
25 of licensing and regulatory affairs the images of applicants for an
26 official state registry identification card issued under section 6
27 of the Michigan Medical Marihuana Act, 2008 IL 1, MCL 333.26426, if
28 the department of licensing and regulatory affairs promulgates
29 rules requiring a photograph as a design element for an official

1 state registry identification card.

2 (f) As necessary to comply with a law of this state or the
3 United States.

4 (7) If an individual presents evidence of statutory blindness
5 as provided in 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to 393.368, and is issued
6 or is the holder of an official state personal identification card,
7 the secretary of state shall mark the individual's official state
8 personal identification card in a manner that clearly indicates
9 that the cardholder is legally blind.

10 (8) The secretary of state shall maintain a record of an
11 individual who indicates a willingness to have his or her name
12 placed on the donor registry described in subsection (2) (a) (ii).
13 Information about an individual's indication of a willingness to
14 have his or her name placed on the donor registry that is obtained
15 by the secretary of state and forwarded under this section is
16 exempt from disclosure under section 13(1)(d) of the freedom of
17 information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.243. As required in section
18 10120 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120, the
19 secretary of state shall establish and maintain the donor registry
20 in a manner that complies with that section and that provides
21 electronic access, including, but not limited to, the transfer of
22 data to this state's federally designated organ procurement
23 organization or its successor organization, tissue banks, and eye
24 banks.

25 (9) An official state personal identification card may contain
26 an identifier for voter registration purposes.

27 (10) An official state personal identification card must
28 contain information appearing in electronic or machine-readable
29 codes needed to conduct a transaction with the secretary of state.

1 The information must be limited to the information described in
2 subsection (1) (a) and (b) except for the individual's digital
3 photographic image and signature or verification and certification,
4 state of issuance, and other information necessary for use with
5 electronic devices, machine readers, or automatic teller machines
6 and must not contain the individual's driving record or other
7 personal identifier. The official state personal identification
8 card must identify the encoded information.

9 (11) An official state personal identification card must be
10 issued only upon authorization of the secretary of state, and must
11 be manufactured in a manner to prohibit as nearly as possible the
12 ability to reproduce, alter, counterfeit, forge, or duplicate the
13 official state personal identification card without ready
14 detection.

15 (12) Except as otherwise provided in this act, an applicant
16 shall pay a fee of \$10.00 to the secretary of state for each
17 original or renewal official state personal identification card
18 issued. The secretary of state shall not assess a late renewal fee
19 for an official state personal identification card that expires on
20 or after March 1, 2020 and is renewed before March 31, 2021. The
21 secretary of state shall not assess a late renewal fee for an
22 official state personal identification card that expires after
23 March 31, 2021 but before August 1, 2021 and is renewed within 120
24 days after the date of the expiration. The secretary of state
25 shall, upon an applicant's request, reimburse a late renewal fee
26 assessed and collected for an official state personal
27 identification card that expires after March 31, 2021 but before
28 August 1, 2021 and is renewed within 120 days after the date of the
29 expiration of the official state personal identification card. The

1 department of treasury shall deposit the fees received and
2 collected under this section in the state treasury to the credit of
3 the general fund. The legislature shall appropriate the fees
4 credited to the general fund under this act to the secretary of
5 state for the administration of this act. Appropriations from the
6 Michigan transportation fund created under section 10 of 1951 PA
7 51, MCL 247.660, must not be used to compensate the secretary of
8 state for costs incurred and services performed under this section.

9 (13) An original or renewal official state personal
10 identification card expires on the birthday of the individual to
11 whom it is issued in the fourth year following the date of issuance
12 or on the date the individual is no longer considered to be legally
13 present in the United States under section 1, whichever is earlier.
14 The secretary of state shall not issue an official state personal
15 identification card under this act for a period greater than 4
16 years. Except as provided in this subsection, the secretary of
17 state may issue a renewal official state personal identification
18 card for 1 additional 4-year period ~~or beginning on July 1, 2021,~~
19 ~~for 2 additional 4-year periods,~~ by mail or by other methods
20 prescribed by the secretary of state. The secretary of state shall
21 require renewal in person by an individual required under section
22 5a of the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.725a,
23 to maintain a valid operator's or chauffeur's license or official
24 state personal identification card.

25 (14) The secretary of state shall waive the fee under this
26 section if the applicant is any of the following:

27 (a) An individual 65 years of age or older.

28 (b) An individual who has had his or her operator's or
29 chauffeur's license suspended, revoked, or denied under the

1 Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923, because
2 of a mental or physical infirmity or disability.

3 (c) An individual who presents evidence of statutory blindness
4 as provided in 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to 393.368.

5 (d) An individual who presents evidence of 1 or more of the
6 following:

7 (i) A notice of case action from the department of health and
8 human services indicating that the individual is a participant in 1
9 or both of the following programs and is making his or her
10 application for an official state personal identification card
11 during a period in which he or she is receiving benefits:

12 (A) The family independence program.

13 (B) The state disability assistance program.

14 (ii) A United States Social Security Administration benefit
15 award letter indicating the applicant is currently receiving
16 payments under the federal supplemental security income program as
17 that term is defined in section 57 of the social welfare act, 1939
18 PA 280, MCL 400.57, or the Social Security disability income
19 program.

20 (iii) A United States Social Security Administration benefit
21 verification letter indicating the applicant is currently receiving
22 payments under the federal supplemental security income program as
23 that term is defined in section 57 of the social welfare act, 1939
24 PA 280, MCL 400.57, or the Social Security disability income
25 program.

26 (e) An individual who decides to add or remove a heart
27 insignia described in subsection (1)(d).

28 (f) An individual who is a veteran. ~~as that term is defined in~~
29 ~~section 1 of 1965 PA 190, MCL 35.61.~~ The secretary of state shall

1 require an individual who seeks a waiver of the fee under this
2 subdivision to provide the secretary of state the same
3 documentation required for a veteran designation under subsection
4 (1)(e) before granting the fee waiver.

5 (g) An individual who presents both of the following:

6 (i) A homeless verification letter that states that the
7 individual meets the definition of category 1 homeless as that term
8 is defined by the United States Department of Housing and Urban
9 Development. A letter provided as evidence under this subparagraph
10 must be submitted on the official letterhead of a public service
11 agency. The secretary of state may verify the information contained
12 in the letter with the agency of issuance before issuing an
13 official state personal identification card.

14 (ii) A photo identification card generated from the United
15 States Department of Housing and Urban Development Homeless
16 Management Information System.

17 (15) An individual who has been issued an official state
18 personal identification card shall apply for a renewal official
19 state personal identification card if the individual changes his or
20 her name.

21 (16) An individual who has been issued an official state
22 personal identification card shall apply for a corrected
23 identification card if he or she changes his or her residence
24 address. The secretary of state may correct the address on an
25 official state personal identification card by a method prescribed
26 by the secretary of state. A fee must not be charged for a change
27 of residence address.

28 (17) An individual who has been issued an official state
29 personal identification card may apply for a renewal official state

1 personal identification card for 1 or more of the following
2 reasons:

3 (a) The individual wants to change any information on the
4 official state personal identification card.

5 (b) An official state personal identification card issued
6 under this act is lost, destroyed, or mutilated, or becomes
7 illegible.

8 (18) An individual may indicate on an official state personal
9 identification card in a place designated by the secretary of state
10 his or her blood type, emergency contact information, immunization
11 data, medication data, or a statement that the individual is deaf.

12 (19) The secretary of state shall develop and shall, in
13 conjunction with the department of state police, implement a
14 process using the L.E.I.N. or any other appropriate system that
15 limits access to law enforcement that allows law enforcement
16 agencies of this state to access emergency contact information and,
17 beginning July 1, 2021, to view a communication impediment
18 designation that the holder of an official state personal
19 identification card has voluntarily provided to the secretary of
20 state.

21 (20) If an applicant provides proof to the secretary of state
22 that he or she is a minor who has been emancipated under 1968 PA
23 293, MCL 722.1 to 722.6, the official state personal identification
24 card must bear the designation of the individual's emancipated
25 status in a manner prescribed by the secretary of state.

26 (21) The secretary of state shall inquire of each individual
27 who applies for or who holds an official state personal
28 identification card, in person or by mail, whether he or she agrees
29 to participate in the anatomical gift donor registry under part 101

1 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123.
2 An individual who has agreed to participate in the donor registry
3 is not considered to have revoked that agreement solely because the
4 individual's official state personal identification card has
5 expired. Enrollment in the donor registry is a legal agreement that
6 remains binding and in effect after the donor's death regardless of
7 the expressed desires of the deceased donor's next of kin who may
8 oppose the donor's anatomical gift.

9 (22) A valid official state personal identification card
10 presented by the individual to whom the card is issued is
11 considered the same as a valid state of Michigan driver license
12 when identification is requested except as otherwise specifically
13 provided by law.

14 (23) Beginning July 1, 2021, if an official state personal
15 identification card issued under this act is lost, destroyed, or
16 mutilated, or becomes illegible, the individual to whom the
17 official state personal identification card was issued may obtain a
18 duplicate upon the payment of the fee required in subsection (24)
19 and upon furnishing proof satisfactory to the secretary of state
20 that the official state personal identification card has been lost,
21 destroyed, or mutilated, or has become illegible.

22 (24) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (25), for each
23 duplicate official state personal identification card, and for each
24 correction of an official state personal identification card,
25 beginning July 1, 2021, an individual may apply for renewal of the
26 official state personal identification card and pay the renewal fee
27 prescribed in this act or the individual may, at his or her option
28 and upon payment of the fee prescribed in this section, apply for a
29 duplicate official state personal identification card that expires

1 on the same date as the official state personal identification card
2 that was lost, destroyed, or mutilated, or became illegible. The
3 fee for a duplicate official state personal identification card is
4 \$10.00. A renewal fee must not be charged for a change of address,
5 a correction required to correct a department error, or to add or
6 remove a heart insignia described in subsection (1)(d).

7 (25) Except with regard to an individual who is less than 21
8 years of age, for each duplicate official state personal
9 identification card, and for each correction of an official state
10 personal identification card, beginning July 1, 2021, an individual
11 shall apply for renewal of the official state personal
12 identification card and pay the renewal fee prescribed in this act
13 if the official state personal identification card was due to
14 expire within the next 12 months. Except as otherwise provided in
15 this act, an official state personal identification card renewed
16 under this subsection or subsection (24) must be renewed for the
17 combined period of the time remaining on the official state
18 personal identification card before its renewal and the 4-year
19 renewal period.

20 (26) Notwithstanding subsection (13), an official state
21 personal identification card that expires on or after March 1, 2020
22 is considered valid until March 31, 2021. Notwithstanding
23 subsection (13), an official state personal identification card
24 that expires after March 31, 2021 but before August 1, 2021 is
25 considered valid until 120 days after the date of the expiration.
26 If the secretary of state receives an application to renew an
27 official state personal identification card that expires on or
28 after March 1, 2020 before March 31, 2021, the secretary of state
29 shall process the application as a renewal of an existing official

1 state personal identification card. If the secretary of state
2 receives an application to renew an official state personal
3 identification card that expires after March 31, 2021 but before
4 August 1, 2021, the secretary of state shall process the
5 application as a renewal of an existing official state personal
6 identification card until 120 days after the date of the
7 expiration.

8 (27) As used in this section:

9 (a) "Communication impediment" means an individual has a
10 health condition that may impede communication with a police
11 officer, including, but not limited to, **any of** the following:

12 (i) Deafness or hearing loss.

13 (ii) An autism spectrum disorder.

14 (b) "Emergency contact information" means the name, telephone
15 number, or address of an individual that is used for the sole
16 purpose of contacting that individual when the holder of an
17 official state personal identification card has been involved in an
18 emergency.

19 (c) "**Veteran**" means that term as defined in section 1 of 1965
20 PA 190, MCL 35.61.
