

HOUSE BILL NO. 6091

May 10, 2022, Introduced by Reps. Hope, Sabo, Brenda Carter, Garza, Sowerby, Breen, Haadsma, Scott, Anthony, Stone, Tyrone Carter, Camilleri and Aiyash and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make, supplement, and adjust appropriations for various state departments and agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022; to provide for certain conditions on appropriations; and to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations.

PART 2

PROVISIONS CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS

GENERAL SECTIONS

14 Sec. 201. Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state
15 constitution of 1963, total state spending from state sources under
16 part 1 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022 is
17 \$96,000,000.00 and total state spending from state sources to be
18 paid to local units of government is \$0.00.

19 Sec. 202. The appropriations made and expenditures authorized
20 under this part and part 1 and the departments, commissions,
21 boards, offices, and programs for which appropriations are made
22 under this part and part 1 are subject to the management and budget
23 act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594.

24 Sec. 203. Funds appropriated in part 1 are subject to
25 applicable federal audit and reporting requirements. Prompt action
26 must be taken if instances of noncompliance are identified,
27 including noncompliance identified in an audit finding. If any
28 instance of noncompliance is identified, including noncompliance
29 identified in an audit finding, the state budget director shall

1 take necessary and immediate action to rectify it. The state budget
2 director shall notify the senate and house appropriations
3 committees and the senate and house fiscal agencies when an
4 instance of noncompliance is identified.

5 Sec. 204. Funds appropriated in part 1 from the federal
6 American rescue plan act of 2021, Public Law 117-2, must be
7 allocated and expended in a manner consistent with federal rules
8 and regulations.

9 Sec. 205. The state budget director shall report on the status
10 of funds appropriated in part 1, and all funds appropriated related
11 to the coronavirus relief effort, to the senate and house
12 appropriations committees and the senate and house fiscal agencies
13 on a monthly basis until all funds are exhausted.

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15 **DEPARTMENT OF TECHNOLOGY, MANAGEMENT, AND BUDGET**

16 Sec. 301. (1) In honor of public service recognition week, it
17 is the intent of the legislature that the funds appropriated in
18 part 1 for state employee recognition bonuses be used by the
19 department of technology, management, and budget to provide each
20 qualified state employee with a \$2,000.00 bonus to recognize the
21 tireless work of qualified state employees during the COVID-19
22 pandemic.

23 (2) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for state employee
24 recognition bonuses, the department of technology, management, and
25 budget shall do both of the following, as applicable:

26 (a) Request approval from the civil service commission under
27 section 5 of article XI of the state constitution of 1963 to issue
28 the state employee recognition bonuses described in subsection (1)
29 to qualified state employees.

1 (b) Subject to subsection (3), if the civil service commission
2 approves the request under subdivision (a), issue a \$2,000.00 bonus
3 to each qualified state employee.

4 (3) If the funds appropriated in part 1 for state employee
5 recognition bonuses are insufficient to pay each qualified state
6 employee a \$2,000.00 bonus, payments must be prorated on an equal
7 basis among all qualified state employees.

8 (4) Money appropriated in part 1 from the general fund shall
9 not be expended for purposes of this section unless the federal
10 revenues appropriated in part 1 are unavailable or the available
11 federal revenues are insufficient to pay each qualified state
12 employee a \$2,000.00 bonus.

13 (5) The unexpended funds appropriated in part 1 for state
14 employee recognition bonuses are designated as a work project
15 appropriation. Unencumbered or unallotted funds shall not lapse at
16 the end of the fiscal year and shall be available for expenditures
17 under this section until the project has been completed. The
18 following is in compliance with section 451a of the management and
19 budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a:

20 (a) The purpose of the project is to provide each qualified
21 state employee with a \$2,000.00 bonus to recognize the tireless
22 work of qualified state employees during the COVID-19 pandemic.

23 (b) The project will be accomplished by utilizing state
24 employees or contracts.

25 (c) The estimated cost of the project is \$96,000,000.00.

26 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2023.

27 (6) As used in this section, "qualified state employee" means
28 an individual who is currently employed in the classified state
29 civil service and has been employed in the classified state civil

1 service since March 10, 2020.
