THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3151. (1) If the mental or physical condition of a person
- 2 is material to a claim that has been or may be made for past or
- 3 future personal protection insurance benefits, at the request of an
- 4 insurer and on a showing of good cause to a court, the person shall
- 5 submit to mental or physical examination by physicians. A personal
- 6 protection insurer may include reasonable provisions that are in

- accord with this section in a personal protection insurance policyfor mental and physical examination of persons claiming personal

- 4 (2) A physician who conducts a mental or physical examination
 5 under this section must be licensed as a physician in this state or
 6 another state and meet the following criteria, as applicable:
 - (a) If care is being provided to the person to be examined by a specialist, the examining physician must specialize in the same specialty as the physician providing the care, and if the physician providing the care is board certified in the specialty, the examining physician must be board certified in that specialty.
- 12 (b) During the year immediately preceding the examination, the 13 examining physician must have devoted a majority of his or her 14 professional time to either or both of the following:
- 15 (i) The active clinical practice of medicine and, if16 subdivision (a) applies, the active clinical practice relevant to17 the specialty.
- (ii) The instruction of students in an accredited medical
 school or in an accredited residency or clinical research program
 for physicians and, if subdivision (a) applies, the instruction of
 students is in the specialty.
 - (3) The insurer that requests or physician who conducts an examination under this section shall provide a statement of how the physician meets the requirements of subsection (2) to the person examined.
- 26 (4) A physician who conducts an examination under this section 27 shall provide to the person examined or the person's attorney a 28 list of all other cases in which, during the previous 4 years, the 29 physician has testified as an expert at trial or by deposition and
