## **SENATE BILL NO. 1038**

May 17, 2022, Introduced by Senator SANTANA and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 1909 PA 279, entitled "The home rule city act,"

by amending section 4i (MCL 117.4i), as amended by 2018 PA 498; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 4i. Each city may provide in its charter for 1 or more of the following:
- 3 (a) Laying and collecting rents, tolls, and excises.
- 4 (b) Regulating and restricting the locations of oil and

- 1 gasoline stations.
- 2 (c) The establishment of districts or zones within which the
- 3 use of land and structures, the height, area, size, and location of
- 4 buildings, the required open spaces for light and ventilation of
- 5 buildings, and the density of population may be regulated by
- 6 ordinance. The zoning ordinance provisions applicable to 1 or more
- 7 districts may differ from those applicable to other districts. If a
- 8 city is incorporated, or if territory is annexed to a city
- 9 incorporated under this act, the zoning ordinance provisions
- 10 applicable to the territory within the newly incorporated city or
- 11 the annexed territory must remain in effect for 2 years after the
- 12 incorporation or annexation unless the legislative body of the city
- 13 lawfully adopts other zoning ordinance provisions.
- 14 (d) Except as otherwise provided in this subdivision, the
- 15 regulation of trades, occupations, and amusements within city
- 16 boundaries, if the regulations are not inconsistent with state or
- 17 federal law, and the prohibition of trades, occupations, and
- 18 amusements that are detrimental to the health, morals, or welfare
- 19 of the inhabitants of that city. This subdivision is subject to the
- 20 local government occupational licensing act, 2018 PA 493, MCL
- 21 123.1421 to 123.1431.
- 22 (e) The regulation or prohibition of public nudity within city
- 23 boundaries. As used in this subdivision, "public nudity" means
- 24 knowingly or intentionally displaying in a public place, or for
- 25 payment or promise of payment by any person including, but not
- 26 limited to, payment or promise of payment of an admission fee, any
- 27 individual's genitals or anus with less than a fully opaque
- 28 covering or a female individual's breast with less than a fully
- 29 opaque covering of the nipple and areola. Public nudity does not

include any of the following:

- 2 (i) A woman's breastfeeding of a baby whether or not the nipple3 or areola is exposed during or incidental to the feeding.
- 4 (ii) Material as that term is defined in section 2 of 1984 PA 343, MCL 752.362.
- 6 (iii) Sexually explicit visual material as that term is defined 7 in section 3 of 1978 PA 33, MCL 722.673.
- 8 (f) Licensing, regulating, restricting, and limiting the9 number and locations of billboards within the city.
  - (g) The initiative and referendum on all matters within the scope of the powers of that city and the recall of city officials.
- (h) A system of civil service for city employees, including
  employees of that city's board of health, and employees of any jail
  operated or maintained by the city. Charter provisions providing
  for a system of civil service for employees of a local health board
  are valid and effective.
- (i) Subject to sections 4p and section 4u, a system of
  compensation for city employees and for the dependents of city
  employees in the case of disability, injury, or death of city
  employees.
- (j) The enforcement of police, sanitary, and other ordinancesthat are not in conflict with the general laws.
- 23 (k) The punishment of persons who violate city ordinances
  24 other than ordinances described in section 41. The penalty for a
  25 violation of such a city ordinance must not exceed a fine of
  26 \$500.00 or imprisonment for 90 days, or both. However, unless
  27 otherwise provided by law, the ordinance may provide that a
  28 violation of the ordinance is punishable by imprisonment for not
  29 more than 93 days or a fine of not more than \$500.00, or both, if

- 1 the violation substantially corresponds to a violation of state law
- 2 that is a misdemeanor for which the maximum period of imprisonment
- 3 is 93 days. In addition, a city may adopt section 625(1)(c) of the
- 4 Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.625, by reference in an
- 5 adopting ordinance and shall provide that a violation of that
- 6 ordinance is punishable by 1 or more of the following:
- 7 (i) Community service for not more than 360 hours.
- 8 (ii) Imprisonment for not more than 180 days.
- 9 (iii) A fine of not less than \$200.00 or more than \$700.00.
- 10 Enacting section 1. Sections 4p, 4s, and 4t of the home rule
- 11 city act, 1909 PA 279, MCL 117.4p, 117.4s, and 117.4t, are
- 12 repealed.
