## **SENATE BILL NO. 1218**

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

(MCL 333.1101 to 333.25211) by adding sections 20205 and 20205a.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 20205. (1) By December 31, 2023, a health facility or
- 2 agency that provides emergency care shall develop and update
- 3 annually a policy that guides decision-making in the health

- 4 (2) The policy required under subsection (1) must enable
- 5 clinical decision-making based on the best available objective
- 6 medical evidence, including an individualized assessment of how
- 7 each patient or resident will respond to treatment, and must do all
- 8 of the following:
- 9 (a) Prohibit medical decision-making based on social stigma or
- 10 perceptions regarding quality of life and relative worth based on
- 11 stereotypes of age, color, criminal history, disability, disability
- 12 status, ethnicity, familial status, gender identity, height,
- 13 homelessness, immigration status, incarceration status, marital
- 14 status, mental illness, national origin, poverty, race, religion,
- 15 sex, sexual orientation, socioeconomic status, substance use
- 16 disorder, use of government resources, veteran status, or weight.

- 3 shall make the policy required under this section available upon

- 8 (b) Whom to contact within the health facility or agency
- 9 regarding questions about or concerns with the policy.
