## SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5369

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending section 5474 (MCL 333.5474), as added by 1998 PA 219.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 5474. (1) The department shall establish a lead poisoning 2 prevention program that has the following components:
- 3 (a) A coordinated and comprehensive plan to prevent childhood
  4 lead poisoning and to minimize exposure of the general public to
  5 lead-based paint hazards.
- (b) A comprehensive educational and community outreach program
   regarding lead poisoning prevention that shall, must, at a minimum,
   include the development of appropriate educational materials
- 9 targeted to health care providers, child care providers, public

- 1 schools, owners and tenants of residential dwellings, and parents
- 2 of young children. These educational materials shall must be made
- 3 available, upon on request, to local and state community groups,
- 4 legal services organizations, and tenants' groups.
- 5 (c) A technical assistance system for health care providers to
- 6 assist those providers in managing cases of childhood lead
- 7 poisoning. As part of this system, the department shall require
- 8 that results of all blood lead level tests conducted in Michigan
- 9 this state be reported to the department as provided for in by rule
- 10 and that when the department receives notice of an elevated blood
- 11 lead <del>levels above 10 micrograms per deciliter, level</del>, it shall
- 12 initiate contact with the local public health department or the
- 13 physician, or both, of the child whose blood lead level exceeds 10
- 14 micrograms per deciliter. with the elevated blood lead level. A
- 15 local health department or physician who is notified of a child
- 16 less than 3 years of age with an elevated blood lead level shall
- 17 refer that child to the Early On program administered by the
- 18 department of lifelong education, advancement, and potential.
- 19 (2) The—By July 1 of each year, the department shall report to
- 20 the legislature by January 1, 1999, and annually thereafter, the
- 21 number of children through less than 6 years of age 6 who were
- 22 screened for lead poisoning during the preceding fiscal year and
- 23 who were confirmed to have had **elevated** blood lead levels. above 10
- 24 micrograms per deciliter. The report shall must compare these rates
- 25 with those of previous fiscal years and the department shall
- 26 recommend methods for improving compliance with guidelines issued
- 27 by the federal centers for disease control and prevention, Centers
- 28 for Disease Control and Prevention, including any necessary
- 29 legislation or appropriations.

1	(3) Not more than 1 year after the effective date of this
2	part, and annually thereafter, By July 1 of each year, the
3	department shall prepare a written report regarding the
4	expenditures under the lead poisoning prevention program, including
5	the amounts and sources of money from the previous preceding fiscal
6	year and a complete accounting of its use. The report shall must be
7	given to the appropriate committees of the legislature and be made
8	available to the general public $\frac{upon}{on}$ request.
9	Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
10	unless House Bill No. 5368 of the 102nd Legislature is enacted into
11	law.
