## **HOUSE BILL NO. 5481**

February 22, 2024, Introduced by Rep. Schriver and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 1933 PA 167, entitled "General sales tax act,"

by amending section 4w (MCL 205.54w), as amended by 2016 PA 372.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 4w. (1) For taxes levied after June 30, 1999, a sale of
- 2 tangible personal property to a person directly engaged in the
- 3 business of constructing, altering, repairing, or improving real
- 4 estate for others to the extent that the property is affixed to and
- 5 made a structural part of a nonprofit hospital or a nonprofit
- 6 housing entity qualified as exempt under section 15a of the state

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- 1 housing development authority act of 1966, 1966 PA 346, MCL
- 2 125.1415a, is exempt from the tax under this act. For purposes of a
- 3 county long-term medical care facility, "affixed to and made a
- 4 structural part of" means any physical connection to an existing
- 5 county long-term medical care facility.
- 6 (2) An exemption shall must not be granted under this section
- 7 for any portion of property otherwise qualifying for exemption
- 8 under this section if income or a benefit inures directly or
- 9 indirectly to an individual, private stockholder, or other private
- 10 person from the independent or nonessential operation of that
- 11 portion of property.
- 12 (3) As used in this section:
- 13 (a) "Nonprofit hospital" means 1 of the following:
- (i) That portion of a building to which 1 of the following
- **15** applies:
- 16 (A) Is owned or operated by an entity exempt under section
- 17 501(c)(3) of the internal revenue code of 1986, 26 USC 501, that is
- 18 licensed as a hospital under part 215 of the public health code,
- 19 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.21501 to 333.21571.
- 20 (B) Is owned or operated by a governmental unit in which
- 21 medical attention is provided.
- 22 (C) Is owned or operated by an entity or entities exempt under
- 23 section 501(c)(2) or (3) of the internal revenue code of 1986, 26
- 24 USC 501, in which medical attention is provided.
- (ii) That portion of real property necessary and related to a
- 26 building described in subparagraph (i) in which medical attention is
- 27 provided.
- 28 (iii) A county long-term medical care facility, including any
- 29 addition to an existing county long-term medical care facility, if

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- 1 the addition is owned and operated by the county long-term medical
- 2 care facility and offers health services provided by the county
- 3 long-term medical care facility. For purposes of this subparagraph,
- 4 "addition" includes a freestanding building as long as that
- 5 freestanding building is operated under the same license held by
- 6 the county long-term medical care facility and continues to offer
- 7 the same health services as the county long-term medical care
- 8 facility in that freestanding building. An exemption under this
- 9 section shall must be granted until January 1, 2008, regardless of
- 10 whether the addition is licensed as a nursing home or skilled
- 11 nursing facility under part 217 of the public health code, 1978 PA
- 12 368, MCL 333.21701 to 333.21799e, or whether the addition meets the
- 13 requirements set forth in subsection (1).
- 14 (b) "Nonprofit hospital" does not include the following:
- 15 (i) Except as otherwise provided under subsection (3) (a) (iii), a
- 16 freestanding building or other real property of a nursing home or
- 17 skilled nursing facility licensed under part 217 of the public
- 18 health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.21701 to 333.21799e.
- 19 (ii) A hospice licensed under part 214 of the public health
- 20 code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.21401 to <del>333.21420.</del>333.21419.
- 21 (iii) A home for the aged licensed under part 213 of the public
- 22 health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.21301 to 333.21335.
- (c) "Medical attention" means that level of medical care in
- 24 which a physician provides acute care or active treatment of
- 25 medical, surgical, obstetrical, psychiatric, chronic, or
- 26 rehabilitative conditions, that require the observation, diagnosis,
- 27 and daily treatment by a physician.
- 28 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 29 unless Senate Bill No. or House Bill No. 5477 (request no.

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1 01038'23) of the 102nd Legislature is enacted into law.
