SENATE BILL NO. 687

January 11, 2024, Introduced by Senators MCCANN, GEISS, SHINK, CHANG and CAVANAGH and referred to the Committee on Energy and Environment.

A bill to create the Michigan high-speed internet office; to prescribe the powers and duties of the Michigan high-speed internet office; to allow the provision of grants and other financial and technical assistance related to broadband and digital infrastructure; and to provide the powers and duties of certain state officers and entities.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act may be cited as the "Michigan high-speed internet office act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:

- 1 (a) "Broadband internet access service" means a mass-market
- 2 retail service by wire or radio that provides the capability to
- 3 transmit data to, and receive data from, all or substantially all
- 4 internet endpoints, including, but not limited to, any capability

- 7 include dial-up internet access service.

- 13 (d) "Modern broadband and digital infrastructure" means the
- 14 technology and associated equipment used to provide broadband
- 15 internet access service with speeds of at least 100 megabits per
- 16 second downstream and 20 megabits per second upstream, scalable to
- 17 100 megabits per second speeds and latency sufficient to support
- 18 real-time, interactive applications and that meet the educational,
- 19 economic, and consumer needs of residents of this state.

- 21 created in section 3.
- 22 Sec. 3. (1) The Michigan high-speed internet office is created
- 23 within the department.
- 24 (2) The director of the department shall appoint a director of
- 25 the office. The individual appointed as the director of the office
- 26 must be qualified by training and experience to perform the duties
- 27 and exercise the powers of the office and the director of the

- **4** Sec. 7. The office may, upon appropriation, award grants or
- 5 provide other financial and technical assistance to carry out the
- 6 purposes of this act.
- 7 Sec. 9. The office shall do all of the following:
- 8 (a) Implement modern broadband and digital infrastructure
- 9 duties assigned to the office and coordinate with other state
- 10 departments responsible for modern broadband and digital
- 11 infrastructure matters.
- 12 (b) Facilitate collaboration among public and private entities
- 13 to encourage partnerships, regional coordination, and streamlined
- 14 policies to increase modern broadband and digital infrastructure.
- 15 (c) Identify best practices and external resources to support
- 16 modern broadband and digital infrastructure in this state.
- 17 (d) Provide capacity building and digital literacy resources
- 18 to the public and entities seeking to expand broadband internet
- 19 access service and adoption.
- (e) Promote and implement policies that utilize modern
- 21 broadband and digital infrastructure to do any of the following:
- 22 (i) Revitalize neighborhoods and communities.
- 23 (ii) Support economic development opportunities.
- 24 (iii) Increase hiring and retention of skilled workers that

 wholesale and retail broadband infrastructure availability and
 adoption throughout this state.
- 5 (g) Issue reports on the status of broadband internet access 6 service market competition in different regions throughout this 7 state that distinguish between the type and quality of broadband 8 internet access service provided and evaluate and provide 9 recommendations on the wholesale and retail cost of broadband 10 internet access service.
- (h) Serve as a point of contact between the public and
 broadband internet access service providers to improve access,
 adoption, and transparency of broadband internet access service.
