## **SENATE BILL NO. 1198**

December 05, 2024, Introduced by Senators SINGH, MCBROOM and MOSS and referred to the Committee on Oversight.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 472, entitled

"An act to regulate political activity; to regulate lobbyists, lobbyist agents, and lobbying activities; to require registration of lobbyists and lobbyist agents; to require the filing of reports; to prescribe the powers and duties of the department of state; to prescribe penalties; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts,"

by amending sections 3 and 4 (MCL 4.413 and 4.414), section 4 as amended by 2008 PA 289.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3. (1) "Department" means the department of state.
- 2 (2) "Expenditure" means an advance, compensation for labor,
- 3 honorarium, conveyance, deposit, distribution, transfer of funds,

- 1 loan, payment, pledge, or subscription of money or anything of
- 2 value including a contract, agreement, promise, or other
- 3 obligation, whether or not legally enforceable, to make an
- 4 expenditure. Expenditure does not include the payment of a
- 5 membership fee otherwise reported pursuant to section 8(1)(d) or
- 6 the cost of travel to visit and return from visiting a public
- 7 official for the purpose of communicating with the public official.
- 8 (3) "Fair market value" means the value of an item or service
- 9 that is available to any member of the public at the time the item
- 10 or service is acquired. The value must be determined on the basis
- 11 of market prices for the item or service on the day the acquisition
- 12 occurred. Price fluctuations of the item or service that occurred
- 13 before or after the acquisition do not impact the fair market value
- 14 determination. A lobbyist bears the burden of providing evidence of
- 15 the fair market value of an item or service.
- 16 (4) (3) "Financial transaction" means a loan, purchase, sale,
- 17 or other type of transfer or exchange of money, goods, other
- 18 property, or services for value.
- 19 Sec. 4. (1) "Gift" means a payment, advance, forbearance, or
- 20 the rendering or deposit of money, services, or anything of value,
- 21 the value of which exceeds \$25.00, as adjusted under section 19a,
- 22 in any 1-month period, unless consideration of equal or greater
- 23 value is received therefor. Gift includes a payment, advance,
- 24 forbearance, or the rendering or deposit of money, services, or
- 25 anything of value to aid the defense of an official in the
- 26 legislative branch or an official in the executive branch against a
- 27 legal action not directly related to the governmental duties of the
- 28 official. Gift does not include the following:
- 29 (a) A campaign contribution otherwise reported as required by

- 7 in the normal course of business, a premium finance company, a
- 8 mortgage company, a small loan company, a state or federal credit

- 10 the federal government, or a licensee as defined by the motor
- 11 vehicle sales finance act, 1950 (Ex Sess) PA 27, MCL 492.101 to
- **12** 492.141.
- 13 (c) A gift received from a member of the person's immediate
- 14 family, a relative of a spouse, a relative within the seventh
- 15 degree of consanguinity as computed by the civil law method, or
- 16 from the spouse of the relative.
- 17 (d) A breakfast, luncheon, dinner, or other refreshment
- 18 consisting of food and beverage provided for immediate consumption.
- 19 (e) A contribution to a legal defense fund that is registered
- 20 with the secretary of state under the legal defense fund act and
- 21 whose purpose is to defend an elected official against any
- 22 criminal, civil, or administrative action, that arises directly out
- 23 of the conduct of the elected official's governmental duties.
- 24 (f) A ticket or an offer of free or reduced-price attendance
- 25 to a charity event that has the primary purpose of raising money
- 26 for a nonprofit organization that is tax-exempt under section
- 27 501(c)(3) of the internal revenue code, 26 USC 501.
- 28 (g) Admission to a conference or educational event that is
- 29 connected to public business or the performance of the governmental

- 2 (2) "Immediate family" means a child residing in an
- 3 individual's household, a spouse of an individual, or an individual
- 4 claimed by that individual or that individual's spouse as a
- 5 dependent for federal income tax purposes.
- 6 (3) "Loan" means a transfer of money, property, or anything of
- 7 ascertainable value in exchange for an obligation, conditional or
- 8 not, to repay in whole or in part.
