## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 8

Reps. Rheingans, Stone, MacDonell, Morgan, Conlin, Coffia, McFall, Byrnes, Skaggs, Price, Hope, Wilson, Paiz, Dievendorf, Brabec, McKinney and Martus offered the following concurrent resolution:

- A concurrent resolution to urge the Michigan Supreme Court to amend the Code of Judicial Conduct to require Michigan judges to make broader financial disclosures.
- 4 Whereas, In 2022, Michigan voters ratified Proposal 1, which
- 5 amended Article IV, § 10 of the Constitution of the State of
- 6 Michigan of 1963 to require all members of the Legislature, the
- 7 Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the Secretary of State, and the
- 8 Attorney General to make annual financial disclosures. These
- 9 officials are now required to make a detailed series of financial
- 10 disclosures which are to be filed with the Department of State and
- 11 made available to the public online; and

Whereas, Proposal 1 does not apply to members of the 1 judiciary. However, it remains the case that judicial officers make 2 3 decisions that affect the state. Moreover, transparency is in the best interest of the public. Voters and litigants should be aware 4 5 of any potential financial conflicts of interest that judges have 6 when ruling on cases; and 7 Whereas, While the Code of Judicial Conduct currently requires 8 that Michigan judges make certain financial disclosures, it does 9 not require disclosures that are as thorough or as easily 10 scrutinized as those required by Proposal 1. For example, the Code 11 of Judicial Conduct does not require that judges disclose their existing assets, the sources of their unearned income, or their 12 13 liabilities. It also does not require that the disclosures that 14 judges make be made available to the public online; now, therefore, 15 be it 16 Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate 17 concurring), That we urge the Michigan Supreme Court to amend the 18 Code of Judicial Conduct to require that supreme court justices, judges of the court of appeals, and judges of any other court they 19 20 deem necessary, make annual financial disclosures to at least the same degree of thoroughness, and with the same level of public 21 22 accessibility, as the disclosures ratified by Proposal 1 into 23 Article IV, § 10 of the Constitution of the State of Michigan of 24 1963; and be it further 25 Resolved, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the 26 Michigan Supreme Court.
