A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law," by amending sections 726, 736, and 751 (MCL 168.726, 168.736, and 168.751), and by adding sections 653c, 653d, 653e, 726a, and 753a; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

The Senate has passed the bill.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Elections.

Senate Bill No. 701, entitled

A bill to amend 1939 PA 280, entitled "The social welfare act," by amending section 110a (MCL 400.110a), as added by 2018 PA 220.

House Bill No. 5934, entitled

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," (MCL 324.101 to 324.90106) by adding part 198.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, Environment, Tourism and Outdoor Recreation.

Rep. Farhat introduced

House Bill No. 5935, entitled

A bill to authorize the issuance of general obligation bonds of this state and to pledge the full faith and credit of this state for the payment of principal and interest on the bonds to finance environmental, natural resources, and public health protection programs that would repair, replace, and develop water and sewer infrastructure, protect and improve water and air quality, replace contaminated drinking water sources, repair and replace failing on-site wastewater treatment systems, clean up sites of contamination, clean up sediments in lakes, rivers, and streams, abate lead contamination, prevent pollution, and revitalize community waterfronts; to pay for issuing the bonds; to provide for other measures relating to the bonds; and to provide for the submission of the question of the issuance of bonds to the electors of this state.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, Environment, Tourism and Outdoor Recreation.

House Bill No. 5936, entitled

A bill to declare the powers and duties of the commission on Middle Eastern American affairs; and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state governmental officers and entities.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

Rep. Neeley introduced

House Bill No. 5937, entitled

A bill to amend 2007 PA 36, entitled "Michigan business tax act," by amending section 433 (MCL 208.1433), as amended by 2014 PA 282.

House Bill No. 5938, entitled

A bill to amend 1956 PA 218, entitled "The insurance code of 1956," (MCL 500.100 to 500.8302) by adding section 3406kk.
