The bill was read a first and second time by title and referred to the Committee on Energy and Environment.

Senate Bill No. 15, entitled

A bill to amend 1973 PA 196, entitled "An act to prescribe standards of conduct for public officers and employees; to create a state board of ethics and prescribe its powers and duties; and to prescribe remedies and penalties," by amending section 2 (MCL 15.342), as amended by 1984 PA 53.

The bill was read a first and second time by title and referred to the Committee on Labor.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code," by amending section 2896 (MCL 333.2896). The bill was read a first and second time by title and referred to the Committee on Civil Rights, Judiciary, and Public Safety.

Senate Bill No. 17, entitled

A bill to amend 2011 PA 256, entitled "Michigan fireworks safety act," by amending sections 7 and 12 (MCL 28.457 and 28.462), section 7 as amended by 2018 PA 635 and section 12 as amended by 2019 PA 138.

The bill was read a first and second time by title and referred to the Committee on Local Government.

Senate Bill No. 18, entitled

Ford day in the state of Michigan; and to designate July 30 of each year as Henry Ford day in the state of Michigan," (MCL 435.301 to 435.303) by amending the title and by adding section 4.

The bill was read a first and second time by title and referred to the Committee on Civil Rights, Judiciary, and Public Safety.

A bill to amend 1973 PA 186, entitled "Tax tribunal act," by amending sections 31 and 35a (MCL 205.731 and 205.735a), as amended by 2008 PA 125.
