HOUSE BILL NO. 4024

January 28, 2025, Introduced by Reps. Fox, Carra, Pavlov, Rigas, DeSana, Linting, Alexander, Wortz, Markkanen, Cavitt, Johnsen, Woolford, DeBoyer, BeGole, Outman, DeBoer, Jenkins-Arno, Martin, Steele, Meerman, Smit and Maddock and referred to Committee on Education and Workforce.

A bill to require that certain educational institutions in this state, when providing students with multiple occupancy restrooms, changing areas, and similar facilities, do so in a manner that ensures each student's privacy from individuals of the opposite biological sex; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain state and local governmental officers and entities.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 1. This act may be cited as the "student restroom privacy act".

- 1 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Biological sex" means the physical condition of being
- 3 male or female, as stated on an individual's original birth
- 4 certificate.
- 5 (b) "Educational institution" means that term as defined in
- 6 section 401 of the Elliot-Larsen civil rights act, 1976 PA 453, MCL
- **7** 37.2401.
- 8 (c) "Multiple occupancy restroom or changing area" means an
- 9 area in an educational institution designed or designated to be
- 10 used by more than 1 student at a time, where students may be in
- 11 various stages of undress in the presence of other students or
- 12 individuals. Multiple occupancy restroom or changing area includes,
- 13 but is not limited to, a restroom, locker room, changing room, or
- 14 shower room.
- Sec. 3. (1) An educational institution shall require every
- 16 multiple occupancy restroom or changing area to be used by
- 17 individuals based on the individuals' biological sex.
- 18 (2) This section does not apply to an individual who enters a
- 19 multiple occupancy restroom or changing area designated for use by
- 20 the opposite biological sex if the individual enters for any of the
- 21 following circumstances:
- 22 (a) Custodial purposes.
- 23 (b) Maintenance or inspection purposes.
- (c) To render medical assistance.
- 25 (d) To accompany a student needing assistance if the assisting
- 26 individual is an employee of the educational institution or the
- 27 student's parent or legal guardian or authorized caregiver.
- 28 (e) To receive assistance in using the area.
- 29 (f) When the multiple occupancy restroom or changing area has

- 1 been temporarily designated for use by those of the individual's
- 2 biological sex.
