HOUSE BILL NO. 4905

September 11, 2025, Introduced by Reps. Schmaltz, Schuette and Alexander and referred to Committee on Families and Veterans.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending section 16909 (MCL 333.16909), as amended by 1997 PA 188.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 16909. (1) The board shall grant—To be granted a license
- ${f 2}$ as a marriage and family therapist, ${f to}$ -an individual ${f who\ meets\ must}$
- 3 meet all of the following requirements:
- 4 (a) Provides The individual provides satisfactory evidence to
- 5 the board of meeting either of the following educational

1 qualifications:

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- (i) Has a master's or higher graduate degree from an accredited
 training program in marriage and family therapy approved by the
 board.
- (ii) Has a master's or higher graduate degree from an
 accredited college or university approved by the board and has
 completed all of the following graduate-level courses at an
 accredited college or university approved by the board:
- 9 (A) Three courses in family studies that total at least 610 semester or 9 quarter hours.
- 11 (B) Three courses in family therapy methodology that total at
 12 least 6 semester or 9 quarter hours.
 - (C) Three courses in human development, personality theory, or psychopathology that total at least 6 semester or 9 quarter hours.
- 15 (D) At least 2 semester or 3 quarter hours in ethics, law, and 16 standards of professional practice.
 - (E) At least 2 semester or 3 quarter hours in research.
- 18 (b) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2), the
 19 individual provides satisfactory evidence to the board of having
 20 completed supervised clinical marriage and family therapy
 21 experience in conjunction with the applicant's educational program.
 22 The clinical marriage and family therapy experience described in
 23 this subdivision shall must meet all of the following requirements:
 - (i) Be obtained either in a clinical practicum during graduate education or in a postgraduate marriage and family institute training program acceptable to the board.
- 27 (ii) Be obtained over not less than 8 consecutive months.
- (iii) Be verified by a supervisor who has a master's or highergraduate degree from an accredited college or university approved

- 2 (A) Is a marriage and family therapist.
- 3 (B) Is a certified licensed master's social worker or a social
- 4 worker registered under article 16 of the occupational code, 1980
- 5 PA 299, MCL 339.1601 to 339.1610.as that term is defined in section
- 6 18501.
- 7 (C) Is a licensed professional counselor as that term is
- 8 defined in section 18101.
- 9 (D) Is a physician as **that term is** defined in section 17001 or
- 10 17501 and practicing in a mental health setting.
- 11 (E) Is a fully licensed psychologist as defined in section
- 12 $\frac{18201}{18201}$ under part 182.
- 13 (F) Is an approved supervisor or supervisor-in-training
- 14 through a program conducted by the American association Association
- 15 for marriage Marriage and family therapy Family Therapy and
- 16 approved by the board.
- 17 (iv) Include not less than 300 direct client contact hours in
- 18 supervised clinical marriage and family therapy experience, at
- 19 least 1/2 of which were completed in a setting in which families,
- 20 couples, or subsystems of families were physically present in the
- 21 therapy room.same location or a setting in which families, couples,
- 22 or subsystems of families met by way of 2-way real-time secure
- 23 technology that allowed direct, contemporaneous interaction by
- 24 sight or sound.
- (v) Be supervised in a ratio of at least 1 hour of supervision
- 26 for each 5 hours of direct client contact, for a total of not less
- 27 than 60 hours of supervision concurrent with the 300 hours of
- 28 supervised direct client contact.
- 29 (c) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2), the

- 1 individual provides satisfactory evidence to the board of having
- 2 completed a minimum of 1,000 direct client contact hours in
- 3 supervised marriage and family therapy experience, at least 1/2 of
- 4 which was were completed with in a setting in which families,
- 5 couples, or subsystems of families physically were present in the
- 6 therapy room, that meets same location or a setting in which
- 7 families, couples, or subsystems of families met by way of 2-way
- 8 real-time secure technology that allowed direct, contemporaneous
- 9 interaction by sight or sound. The marriage and family therapy
- 10 experience described in this subdivision must meet all of the
- 11 following conditions:
- 12 (i) Is Be verified by the supervising licensed marriage and
- 13 family therapist.
- 14 (ii) Is Be obtained following the completion of the degree
- 15 required by subdivision (a) (i), is be obtained following the
- 16 completion of the degree required by subdivision (a) (ii) and
- 17 concurrent with or following the course work specified in
- 18 subdivision (a) (ii) (A), (B), (C), (D), and (E), or is be obtained as
- 19 part of a doctoral program in marriage and family therapy from an
- 20 accredited college or university approved by the board, which
- 21 experience may include experience obtained under subdivision (b) (i).
- 22 (iii) Is Be supervised in a ratio of at least 1 hour of
- 23 supervision for each 5 hours of experience, for a total of not less
- 24 than 200 hours of supervision concurrent with the 1,000 hours of
- 25 supervised experience. Not less than 100 hours of supervision under
- 26 this subparagraph shall must be individual supervision with no more
- 27 than 1 other supervisee present. The remaining supervision under
- 28 this subparagraph may be group supervision involving no more than 6
- 29 supervisees with 1 supervisor. The supervision shall may be given

- 1 in face-to-face contact with the individual obtaining marriage and
- 2 family therapy experience or by using 2-way real-time secure
- 3 technology that allows direct, contemporaneous interaction by sight
- 4 or sound.
- 5 (2) The board shall waive the requirements of subsection
- 6 (1)(b) and (c) for if an applicant who provides satisfactory
- 7 evidence to the board of having obtained a doctoral degree from an
- 8 accredited doctoral training program in marriage and family therapy
- 9 approved by the board.

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
