The board shall not promulgate rules under this section that diminish competition or exceed the minimum level of regulation necessary to protect the public.

Sec. 18310. Notwithstanding part 161, the board shall not require an applicant to pass an examination on the laws of this state related to the practice of occupational therapy or practice as an occupational therapy assistant for licensure.
