A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending section 16201 (MCL 333.16201), as amended by 2019 PA 96, and by adding section 16202.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 16201. (1) A licensee or registrant shall renew the
- 2 license or registration on or before the expiration date as
- 3 prescribed by rule. The department shall mail a notice to the
- 4 licensee or registrant at the last known address on file with a
- 5 board, or may send the notice by electronic mail to a licensee or

- 1 registrant described in section 16192(4), advising of the time,
- 2 procedure, and fee for renewal. Failure of the licensee or
- 3 registrant to receive notice under this subsection does not relieve
- 4 the licensee or registrant of the responsibility for renewing his
- 5 or her the license or registration.
- **6** (2) A license or registration not renewed by the expiration
- 7 date may be renewed within 60 days after the expiration date on
- 8 application, payment of renewal and late renewal fees, and
- 9 fulfillment of any continued competency or continuing education
- 10 requirements set forth in this article or rules promulgated under
- 11 this article. The licensee or registrant may continue to practice
- 12 and use the title during the 60-day time period.
- 13 (3) If a license or registration is not renewed within 60 days
- 14 after the expiration date under subsection (2), the license or
- 15 registration is considered null and void. The licensee shall not
- 16 practice or use the title and a registrant shall not use the title.
- 17 Except as otherwise provided in this article or by rule, an
- 18 individual may be relicensed or reregistered within 3 years after
- 19 the expiration date on application, payment of the application
- 20 processing, renewal, and late renewal fees, and fulfillment of any
- 21 continued competency or continuing education requirements in effect
- 22 on the expiration date, or that would have been required had the
- 23 individual renewed his or her the individual's license or
- 24 registration under subsection (1). A temporary license or
- 25 registration may be issued under section 16181 pending the results
- 26 of action taken under this subsection.
- 27 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this article or by rule,
- 28 an individual may be relicensed or reregistered more than 3 years
- 29 after the expiration date on application as a new applicant,

- 1 meeting all licensure or registration requirements in effect at the
- 2 time of application, taking or retaking and passing any
- 3 examinations required for initial licensure or registration, and
- 4 payment of fees required of new applicants.
- 5 (5) The expiration of a license or registration or the
- 6 surrender of a license or registration under section 16202 does not
- 7 terminate the board's authority to impose sanctions on the licensee
- 8 or registrant whose license or registration has expired or been
- 9 surrendered.
- 10 Sec. 16202. (1) A licensee or registrant may voluntarily
- 11 surrender the licensee's or registrant's license or registration by
- 12 delivering the certificate of licensure or certificate of
- 13 registration to the director with a written notice, on a form
- 14 prescribed by the department, stating the licensee's or
- 15 registrant's intent to surrender the license or registration.
- 16 (2) A license or registration is considered surrendered
- 17 beginning on the date the department receives the form under
- 18 subsection (1).
- 19 (3) The surrender of a license or registration under this
- 20 section does not affect the licensee's or registrant's civil or
- 21 criminal liability for acts committed before the surrender of the
- 22 license or registration.
