HOUSE BILL NO. 4954

September 16, 2025, Introduced by Reps. Woolford, Aragona, Borton, DeBoyer and Robinson and referred to Committee on Families and Veterans.

A bill to amend 1996 PA 195, entitled "Police officer's and fire fighter's survivor tuition grant act," by amending the title and sections 1, 2, 3, and 4 (MCL 390.1241, 390.1242, 390.1243, and 390.1244), the title and sections 1 and 4 as amended by 2012 PA 470 and sections 2 and 3 as amended by 2021 PA 127.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 TITLE

2 An act to provide for a tuition grant program at state public

- 1 institutions of higher education for children and surviving spouses
- 2 of Michigan police officers, and fire fighters, and medical
- 3 examiners killed in the line of duty; to provide for the
- 4 administration of that tuition grant program; to prescribe certain
- 5 powers and duties of state officers, agencies, and departments; and
- 6 to provide for an appropriation.
- 7 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 8 "police officer's, and fire fighter's, and medical examiner's
- 9 survivor tuition grant act".
- 10 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- (a) "Academic year" means the period from September 1 of acalendar year to August 31 of the next calendar year.
- (b) "Child" means an individual who is a natural or adopted
 child of a deceased Michigan police officer, or deceased Michigan
- 15 fire fighter, or deceased Michigan medical examiner and who was
- 16 under the age of 21 at the time of the Michigan police officer's,
- 17 or Michigan fire fighter's, or Michigan medical examiner's death.
- 18 (c) "Department" means the department of treasury.lifelong19 education, advancement, and potential.
- 20 (d) "Eligible student" means a child or surviving spouse of a
- 21 Michigan police officer, or Michigan fire fighter, or Michigan
- 22 medical examiner who was or is killed in the line of duty.
- (e) "Eligible tuition" means the tuition charged by a stateinstitution of higher education for an undergraduate class.
- (f) "Gift aid" means formal scholarships or grants fromsources that do not require repayment.
- 27 (g) "Killed" means that the Michigan police officer's, or
- 28 Michigan fire fighter's, or Michigan medical examiner's death is
- 29 the direct and proximate result of a traumatic injury incurred in

- 2 (h) "Line of duty" means an action that a Michigan police officer, or Michigan fire fighter, or Michigan medical examiner is 3 obligated or authorized to perform by rule, regulation, condition 4 of employment or service, or law, including, but not limited to, a 5 6 social, ceremonial, or athletic function that the Michigan police officer, or Michigan fire fighter, or Michigan medical examiner is 7 8 assigned to or compensated for by the public agency he or she the 9 Michigan police officer, Michigan fire fighter, or Michigan medical 10 examiner serves.
 - (i) "Michigan police officer" means a sheriff or sheriff's deputy of a sheriff's department in this state; village or township marshal of a village or township in this state; officer of the police department of any city, village, or township in this state; officer of the Michigan state police; or any other police officer or law enforcement officer trained and licensed or certified under the Michigan commission on law enforcement standards act, 1965 PA 203, MCL 28.601 to 28.615.
 - (j) "Michigan fire fighter" means a member including volunteer members and members paid on call of a fire department, or other organization that provides fire suppression and other fire-related services, of a city, township, village, or county who is responsible for or is in a capacity that includes responsibility for the extinguishment of fires. Michigan fire fighter does not include a person whose job description, duties, or responsibilities do not include direct involvement in fire suppression.
- 27 (k) "Michigan medical examiner" means an individual appointed 28 and serving as a medical examiner, deputy medical examiner, or 29 medical examiner investigator under 1953 PA 181, MCL 52.201 to

- 1 52.216.
- (1) (k) "Occupational disease" means a disease that routinely
 constitutes a special hazard in, or is commonly regarded as
- 4 concomitant of, the Michigan police officer's, or Michigan fire
- 5 fighter's, or Michigan medical examiner's occupation.
- 6 (m) (l)—"State institution of higher education" means a public
- 7 community or junior college established under section 7 of article
- 8 VIII of the state constitution of 1963 or part 25 of the revised
- 9 school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1601 to 380.1607, or a state
- 10 university described in section 4, 5, or 6 of article VIII of the
- 11 state constitution of 1963.
- (n) (m) "Survivor's tuition grant" means a tuition grant
- 13 awarded to an eligible student under this act.
- 14 (o) (n) "Traumatic injury" means a wound or the condition of
- 15 the body caused by external force, including, but not limited to,
- 16 an injury inflicted by bullet, explosive, sharp instrument, blunt
- 17 object or other physical blow, fire, smoke, chemical, electricity,
- 18 climatic condition, infectious disease, radiation, or bacteria, but
- 19 excluding an injury resulting from stress, strain, or occupational
- 20 disease.
- 21 (p) (o)—"Undergraduate class" means a class or course that
- 22 provides a student with academic credit applicable toward a
- 23 bachelor or associate degree from a state institution of higher
- 24 education.
- Sec. 3. (1) The police officer's, and fire fighter's, and
- 26 medical examiner's survivor tuition program is created, to be
- 27 administered by the department.
- 28 (2) Beginning in the 2012-2013 academic year, the department
- 29 shall provide a survivor's tuition grant in an amount determined by

- 1 the department under subsection (3) to each eligible student if all
 2 of the following requirements are met:
- 3 (a) The student applies, qualifies, and is admitted as a full4 time, part-time, or summer school student in a program of study
 5 leading to a degree or certificate at a state institution of higher education.
- 7 (b) The student is a legal resident of the this state for at
 8 least the 12 consecutive months immediately preceding his or her
 9 the student's application. For an individual who is a dependent of
 10 his or her the individual's parent, residency status shall be is
 11 determined by the parent's residency. For an individual who is not
 12 a dependent, residency status is determined in the same manner as
 13 under 20 USC 1070 to 1070h.
 - (c) The student applies to the department for a survivor's tuition grant under this act and provides evidence satisfactory to the department that he or she the student is an eligible student, that the course or courses for which he or she the student is seeking a survivor's tuition grant meet the requirements of subsection (3), and that he or she the student meets the other requirements of this section.
 - (d) If the student is a child of a Michigan police officer, or Michigan fire fighter, or Michigan medical examiner who was killed in the line of duty, he or she the student applies for a survivor's tuition grant under subdivision (c) for the first time before the age of 26.
- (e) The financial aid officer at the state institution of higher education certifies to the department that the student's eligible tuition expenses exceed the total of all other gift aid available to the student; certifies the amount of that excess; and

- 1 certifies that the tuition rate or rates used to determine the
 2 amount of that excess are not greater than the rate or rates
 3 charged to residents of this state.
- 4 (f) The student maintains satisfactory academic progress, as
 5 defined by the state institution of higher education, for each term
 6 or semester in which he or she the student is enrolled. The
 7 satisfactory progress definition used by an institution for federal
 8 student assistance programs under 20 USC 1070 to 1070h is
 9 acceptable for the purposes of this act.
 - (g) The student has not received a bachelor's degree and has received tuition assistance under this act for fewer than 124 semester credits or 180 term credits at an institution of higher education.
- (h) The student has not received a survivor's tuition grant in more than a total of 9 semesters or the equivalent number of terms or quarters.
 - (3) The amount of a survivor's tuition grant in an academic year is the amount of the **eligible** student's eligible tuition in that academic year less all other gift aid available to the eligible student. The department may reduce the amount of a survivor's tuition grant if it determines that the tuition rate or rates used by the state institution of higher education under subsection (2)(e) to determine the amount of the survivor's tuition grant are greater than the tuition rate or rates charged by the institution in that academic year to residents of this state.
 - Sec. 4. (1) Beginning in the 2012-2013 academic year, if it the department receives an application under section 3(2)(c) and subject to subsection (4), the department shall determine whether the applicant and the courses for which a survivor's tuition grant

- 1 is sought meet the requirements of section 3 and, if so, shall
 2 approve the application and notify the state institution of higher
 3 education that it the department has approved the application.
- 4 (2) All of the following apply if the department approves a survivor's tuition grant under subsection (1):
- 6 (a) The department shall disburse the survivor's tuition grant
 7 money to the state institution of higher education that the student
 8 attends, according to a payment procedure established by the
 9 department.
 - (b) The institution shall only apply money received under subdivision (a) on a student's behalf to the student's outstanding indebtedness for eligible tuition.
 - (3) The department annually shall report to the legislature the number of individuals who received survivor's tuition grants in the preceding academic year and the total amount of those grants; which state institutions of higher education those students attended; and the total amount disbursed to each institution.
 - (4) If it the department receives an application under section 3(2)(c), the department shall submit the evidence provided by the applicant that he or she the applicant is an eligible student to the department of state police for a determination of whether the Michigan police officer's, or Michigan fire fighter's, or Michigan medical examiner's death was the direct and proximate result of a traumatic injury incurred in the line of duty. The department shall not award a survivor's tuition grant unless the department of state police determines that the death was the direct and proximate result of a traumatic injury incurred in the line of duty.
