## **HOUSE BILL NO. 5036**

September 24, 2025, Introduced by Reps. Steckloff, St. Germaine, Schmaltz, Tisdel, Johnsen, Wozniak, DeBoyer, BeGole, Borton and Roth and referred to Committee on Families and Veterans.

A bill to amend 1931 PA 328, entitled "The Michigan penal code,"

(MCL 750.1 to 750.568) by adding section 219g.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 219g. (1) A person who knowingly, intentionally, or
- 2 willfully engages in a practice or act the person knows or
- 3 reasonably should know provides false or misleading information
- 4 related to an assisted reproduction procedure, including by making
- 5 a false or misleading representation relating to any of the

- 1 following, is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not
- 2 more than 5 years or a fine of not more than \$50,000.00, or both:
- 3 (a) The human embryo or gamete used or provided for assisted
- 4 reproduction.
- 5 (b) The identity of a donor of the human embryo or gamete used
- 6 or provided for assisted reproduction, including, but not limited
- 7 to, the donor's name, birthdate, or address at the time of
- 8 donation.
- 9 (c) A donor's medical history, including present illness of
- 10 the donor at time of donation, any past illnesses of the donor, any
- 11 history of diagnosed mental illness, the social history of the
- 12 donor, any known genetic defects of the donor, the family medical
- 13 history of the donor, or the donor's level of education.
- 14 (2) A health professional who knowingly or recklessly uses or
- 15 provides a human embryo or gamete, including the health
- 16 professional's own human embryo or gamete, for assisted
- 17 reproduction other than the specific human embryo or gamete to
- 18 which the patient expressly consented in writing is guilty of a
- 19 felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 15 years or a
- 20 fine of not more than \$100,000.00, or both.
- 21 (3) The use of an anonymous donor, if requested by a patient,
- 22 is not a defense to a violation of this section committed by a
- 23 health professional.
- 24 (4) As used in this section:
- 25 (a) "Anonymous donor" means a donor whose identity is not
- 26 provided to the patient.
- 27 (b) "Assisted reproduction" means a method of causing
- 28 pregnancy other than sexual intercourse.
- 29 (c) "Donor" means an individual who provides gametes or human

- 1 embryos intended for use in assisted reproduction, regardless of
- 2 whether or not the individual receives financial compensation for
- 3 the donation.
- 4 (d) "Family medical history of the donor" means the complete
- 5 medical history of the first-degree, second-degree, and third-
- 6 degree relatives of the donor.
- 7 (e) "Gamete" means sperm, egg, or any part of a sperm or egg.
- 8 (f) "Health professional" means an individual licensed,
- 9 registered, certified, or otherwise authorized to engage in a
- 10 health profession under article 15 of the public health code, 1978
- 11 PA 368, MCL 333.16101 to 333.18838.
- 12 (g) "Human embryo" means a human organism at any stage of
- 13 development from fertilized ovum to embryo.
- 14 (h) "Identity" means legal name.
- 15 (i) "Know" or "knowingly" means that a health professional or
- 16 other person undertook an action with knowledge and not because of
- 17 mistake, accident, or other innocent reason.
- 18 (j) "Patient" means an individual under the care of a health
- 19 professional.
- 20 (k) "Social history of the donor" means the personal and
- 21 sexual history of the donor pertaining to risk factors for relevant
- 22 communicable disease transmissible via gamete donation.
- 23 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 24 after the date it is enacted into law.
