Reps. Koleszar, Breen, Fitzgerald, Glanville, Longjohn, MacDonell, Miller, Paiz, Rheingans, Rigas, Weiss, Witwer, Wooden and Young offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to declare September 2025 as Deaf Awareness Month
- 2 in the state of Michigan.
- 3 Whereas, The deaf, deafblind, and hard of hearing population
- 4 in Michigan encompasses a diverse group of individuals with a wide
- ${\bf 5}$ $\,$ range of communication preferences and abilities—from those who are
- 6 profoundly deaf and use American Sign Language (ASL) as their
- 7 primary language, to those with varying degrees of hearing loss who
- 8 use amplification devices, lip reading, cued speech, or other
- 9 communication modes; and
- 10 Whereas, According to the Michigan Department of Labor and
- 11 Economic Opportunity's Division on Deaf, DeafBlind and Hard of
- 12 Hearing, approximately 7.4 percent of Michigan's population

- 1 identifies as deaf, deafblind, or hard of hearing, representing a
- 2 significant and valued portion of our state's residents (LEO-
- 3 DODDBHH, 2024 Annual Report); and
- 4 Whereas, The state of Michigan benefits immensely from the
- 5 contributions of deaf, deafblind, and hard of hearing individuals
- 6 in fields such as education, public service, healthcare, business,
- 7 the arts, and civic engagement; and
- 8 Whereas, The rich cultural and linguistic heritage of the deaf
- 9 community, including the use of ASL and shared social norms,
- 10 traditions, and history, enriches Michigan's broader cultural
- 11 landscape; and
- 12 Whereas, Individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing face
- 13 unique barriers and disparities in access to communication,
- 14 employment, education, and public services, and it is incumbent
- 15 upon society to foster inclusivity, ensure accessibility, and
- 16 uphold the civil rights of all Michiganders, regardless of hearing
- 17 status; and
- 18 Whereas, The month of September commemorates the first World
- 19 Congress of the World Federation of the Deaf, held in September
- 20 1951, a pivotal moment in the global movement for deaf rights and
- 21 awareness; and
- 22 Whereas, Deaf Awareness Month provides an opportunity to raise
- 23 public awareness of the challenges faced by the deaf community,
- 24 dispel misconceptions about deafness, and promote equal access to
- 25 information, services, and opportunities for individuals who are
- 26 deaf, deafblind, or hard of hearing; now, therefore, be it
- 27 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 28 this legislative body declare September 2025 as Deaf Awareness
- 29 Month in the state of Michigan.
